In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Homeless Summit Report	Deanna Luttrell	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Homeless Summit was a one day event on November 16, 2011 held at the Catholic Diocese. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Over 150 people attended from over 100 agencies. OHS received much appreciated positive feedback from attendees. OHS will look into the suggestions for this year's Summit.</li> <li>The theme was Building the Way Home and included themed table décor with truck, tool boxes, flowers, and stress ball construction hats which were all given away in the opportunity drawing. There was a 72 foot wall which highlighted providers throughout the County. The event went very well and everyone had a great time.</li> <li>The speakers included Assemblymember Toni Atkins, Supervisor Gonzales, Mayor Morris, Angela Myles, Chair of HPN, a panel including Zach Olmstead, Tania Tull, and Simone Ruff, Dr. Gary Thomas, Superintendent of Schools, Pastor Marco Garcia, and Tom Hernandez, Homeless Services Manager. All speakers received great reviews and were well-liked.</li> <li>The Summit offered four workshops which were also well received. These workshops included Reducing Parolee Recidivism, Fundraising, Using Data to Demonstrate Outcome Measurement, and Logic Models.</li> <li>OHS will begin planning the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Homeless Summit in the next couple of months.</li> <li>Tom Hernandez added that Assemblymember Toni Atkins, as chair of the Select Committee on Homelessness for the state, provided a report to the state with recommendations she received. Included in this report was information from what she was told by attendees and the panel at the Summit. The Summit was taken much further than the county; it was taken to the State.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
HMIS Update	Teri Blum-Johnston	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ms. Blum-Johnston offered an update on HMIS information adding that the Housing Inventory Chart Update is going on currently. All agencies are to be listed and are to participate regardless of funding source. The sheltered Point-In-Time Count is going on concurrently and all information must be entered by January 31, 2012.</li> </ul>
2012 Sheltered Count	Tom Hernandez	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>OHS is currently in the process of updating the Housing Inventory Chart and conducting a 2012 sheltered Point-In-Time Count (PITC) on Tuesday, January 24, 2012. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>OHS is required to collect this information annually as part of the Homeless Data Exchange (HDX). Included in the HDX are the Housing Inventory Chart, the PITC, and various other information.</li> <li>Information will be gathered using HMIS for those providers who participate. It is extremely important that information is entered completely and correctly for the night of January 24, 2012 by January 31, 2012.</li> <li>For those providers who do not participate in HMIS, OHS has sent an email out with an attached 2012 SBC Housing Inventory and Point-in-Time Sheltered Count and Survey and asked them to fill it out for the night of January 24, 2012. This form is due via email, fax, or regular mail to OHS by January 31, 2012.</li> <li>OHS encourages all providers to participate in HMIS regardless of funding source.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

CoC Renewal Information	Tom Hernandez	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• On December 20, 2011, HUD released renewal project awards. \$1.5 billion nationally went to 7,100 programs. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The San Bernardino County CoC received \$2,213,277 for all renewals which applied. OHS is still waiting to hear about new programs and expects the release around April 2012.</li> <li>○ This year, our CoC submitted for a little over \$7 million total for renewals and new projects. Exhibit 1 Application Information submitted to HUD is determined by HMIS data and by meeting performance requirements. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The San Bernardino County CoC did a fantastic job and met or surpassed all five goals for performance reviews it is required to meet. Changes to performance goal reviews include an increased income at exit versus a client maintaining their same income at exit. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Goal to increase beds by 12: Beds were increased by 81, which is 69 more than required.</li> <li>• Goal for permanent housing stability to reach 86%: CoC met 95%, which is 9% more than required.</li> <li>• Goal for increased employment/income at exit was 20%: Goal was met at 20%. The County Workforce and Development Department is willing to work with providers to assist with employment and improve scores.</li> <li>• Goal to decrease family homelessness to 191: Family homelessness was decreased to 189; a 2 family decrease more than required.</li> <li>• Goal for clients to exit provider system into permanent housing at 75%: CoC met 91%, which is a 16% increase over what was required.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>• OHS is also in the process of doing a CoC check-up which is a survey requested by HUD on a volunteer basis. The survey is a rating of the CoC, which will help to plan and prepare future applications. The benefit to the CoC will be to maximize the funding.</li> </ul>

All attendees are encouraged to get involved with the subcommittees. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The Housing Subcommittee will meet on Wednesday, January 18, 2012 at 3 pm after the HPN Meeting. All meetings are directly after HPN Meetings.</li> <li>○ The Faith-Based Meeting, which is a part of the Outreach and Engagement Committee, will meet on Thursday, January 19, 2012 at 1 pm located at the Way World Outreach on 375 W. 7<sup>th</sup> Street in San Bernardino.</li> <li>○ The Inland Empire Veteran Collaborative will have their Quarterly Meeting on February 9, 2012 at US Vets in Riverside. This will be a fantastic opportunity for veterans.</li> <li>○ The Discharge Planning Meeting will be Thursday, January 19, 2012 at 2 pm located at the Training Institute on 1950 S. These changes include the implementation of the HEARTH Act, the new definition of homelessness, the Emergency Solutions Grant, and the completion of the HPRP funding. These changes must be discussed and a strategy formed.</li> <li>○ Mr. Brazier would like to see the topic of flow or system of care on the agenda where the HPN looks beyond the housing issues into detox programs, mental health, and food for a way to make connections. OHS will be adding the Riverside provider list to the current San Bernardino County list to ensure as much information on providers that is possible is offered to both providers and homeless clients. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Providers are encouraged to work closely with 2-1-1 and update information regularly as that is where most of the San Bernardino County information comes from.</li> <li>○ OHS plans to contact the Riverside Coalition to request a representative begin attending the HPN meetings.</li> <li>○ Despite efforts to collaborate administratively, gaps still exist among funding sources. Some funding sources do have geographic restrictions between counties.</li> </ul> </li> <li>● The Second Harvest Food Bank is the largest food bank serving both San Bernardino and Riverside counties. The agency would like to collaborate with providers to provide food to the homeless clients. Pamphlets and information were provided to attendees. Please contact Karyn Martin at 951-359-4757 for more information. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Homelessness and hunger needs to be addressed. Karyn and Tracylyn will provide a presentation about their agency at next month's meeting.</li> <li>○ In addition, the Second Harvest Food Bank does have a talk radio station in which non-profit organizations can do a half hour interview discussing what their program offers, what is available, as well as ask for donations at no charge to the organization. The agency, in partnership with First 5, offers ten beds for pregnant women with substance abuse issues, however, they will not turn away any woman in the same situation should the beds be full. They will open more beds. Cedar House also has a 125 bed residential facility and unlimited resources for outpatient care. In addition, they have transitional living services.</li> <li>• Officer Martinez expressed the need for a list of providers that can be passed out to agencies and homeless clients. She would also like to see this list used to eliminate panhandling as it can be handed in the place of money to homeless individuals.</li> <li>• The San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is made up of three components: The Interagency Council on Homelessness (ICH), the Homeless Provider Network (HPN), and the Office of Homeless Services (OHS). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The ICH is the policy-making body of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership. Members from the cities, state, and provider network sit on this committee. The main goal of the ICH is to ensure the plans and action steps of the 10-Year Strategy to End Homelessness are carried out. They also vote on the CoC application and make decisions on homeless issues. Five representatives from the HPN sit on this Council to report information and findings from the HPN to the ICH to be carried further in action. The ICH can advocate on a higher level. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The US ICH has a new chair. Her focus is children and family services. There will be a new focus on youth homelessness. In addition, the new vice chair will focus on veteran homelessness. The ICH locally does what the US ICH does federally. The US ICH is encouraging the state to form a state-wide ICH which would serve as a liaison and assist coordination.</li> <li>▪ The ICH is open to the public to anyone interested in attending. The next meeting will fall on Wednesday, January 25, 2012 at 9 am located at the Training Institute on 1950 S. Sunwest Lane, Suite 200, San Bernardino, CA 92408.</li> </ul> </li> <li>○ The HPN is the advisory body to the ICH. It is absolutely vital that information be taken from the HPN to the ICH so that further action can be taken.</li> <li>○ The OHS is the administrative body to both the HPN and the ICH. OHS carries out administrative actions from both bodies. Currently, Tom Hernandez, Homeless Services Manager, is on the SANBAG Board Committee agenda for February 1, 2012 at 11 am located at the Santa Fe Train Station to present to the Board, which includes representatives from all the cities, regarding the homeless issues in each city. He will advocate to have a representative from each city serve on the ICH as their input and assistance is needed. Homelessness is a problem in each city; there are key potential indicators of homelessness listed for each city which can be found on the website at <a href="http://www.sbcounty.gov/sbchp">www.sbcounty.gov/sbchp</a>. All are welcomed and encouraged to attend the SANBAG meeting.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• The National Alliance to End Homelessness released a report on January 18, 2012. Flyers were handed out at the meeting. Please contact Juanita at 909-886-2994 for more information.</li> <li>• Mr. Suchanek is the CEO of Firm Media. He is working in collaboration with other business owners, including the CEO of the Ontario Convention Center, to create a Thanksgiving Dinner event this year at the Ontario Convention Center. The event plans to feed the homeless and at-risk clients, but also offer them services. Mr. Suchanek would like to work with vendors of the HPN to create a Project Connect. A steering committee has begun and Mr. Suchanek will be working through the OHS to obtain volunteers and vendors. Mr. Suchanek will also work with OHS to make a presentation at the next ICH meeting.</li> <li>• Mr. Suchanek also noted a fundraiser on February 9, 2012 at Cal State San Bernardino to raise funds for student tuition. Several businesses will speak on the 1-1 concept in which a purchase is made from their company, that company will make a special contribution to a cause.</li> </ul>
