In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

Welcome Presentation of Minutes	Tom Hernandez	<ul> <li>Attendees were welcomed to the meeting and asked to introduce themselves.</li> <li>Minutes were approved as presented.</li> </ul>

HMIS Update	Jim Rosemeyer	<ul> <li>Mr. Rosemeyer offered an update on HMIS data and utilization. (PowerPoint and handout available upon request).</li> <li>The report cards are in development and will be posted on the HMIS website when ready. Each agency will be able to review how they are doing on the 15 HUD requirement demographics and see their progress as far as bed utilization.</li> <li>HMIS End-User training is set for May 22<sup>nd</sup> and May 29<sup>th</sup>, both classes are full. End-User training will be held the second Tuesday of each month.</li> <li>The HMIS Reports training will start on May 21<sup>st</sup>. HMIS Reports training will be held on the fourth Tuesday of each month.</li> <li>The HMIS User Group meeting was held on Monday and went well. All recommendations received will be filtered into the training process.</li> <li>Make sure to use the following URL for HMIS: <u>http://sbcHMIS.esserver.com</u>.</li> <li>The office is starting preliminary work for the AHAR and AHAR Vets reports. The first report will be due in November.</li> </ul>
Union Pacific Railroad Foundation 2013/14 Process	Lupe Valdez	<ul> <li>Lupe Valdez, Director of Public Affairs, provided information on the Union Pacific Foundation. (PowerPoint and handout available upon request).</li> <li>Ms. Valdez wanted to make it clear that you do not need a consultant to apply for the Community Based Grant Program.</li> <li>Union Pacific is in 23 states. When applying you are only competing against other Southern California agencies.</li> <li>The Community Based Grant Program has a very simple eligibility list: you have to be located in a Union Pacific served community and you are a 501 (c) 3. A safe range for the foundation would be \$5,000 - \$15,000. Also, they do allow for things that will make an organization more efficient, (i.e. computers, training, etc.)</li> <li>There is a two-step process. The application is all done online so make sure the person that applies continues employment with your organization throughout the process as they will be receiving</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>confirmations via email.</li> <li>Stage one- Submit your preliminary application by August 14, 2013 by 4:00 p.m. CDT. The application opened on May 1<sup>st</sup> so right now is the perfect time to apply. After you complete this first phase you will be contacted to start stage two. Do not wait until deadline as it may not allow for processing time of that application.</li> <li>Stage two - Submit final application by August 15, 2013 by midnight CDT.</li> <li>Applicants will be notified of grant status in February 2014.</li> <li>The system is set up for one Tax ID, so even though you have multiple sites you can only apply once.</li> <li>To apply go to www.up.com, look under category About Us and then go to Community.</li> <li>For more information, email Lupe Valdez at Icvaldez@up.com.</li> </ul>
Point-In-Time County Preliminary Data	Don Smith Ed Hambly Cheryl Heesen Don Smith	<ul> <li>Don Smith provided a presentation on the Point-In-Time Count Preliminary Findings (PowerPoint and handout available upon request).</li> <li>The Point-In-Time Count (PITC) is designed to capture a snapshot. This is critical not only because it is mandated by HUD, but it provides numbers to address and define the issue of homelessness. The PITC provides the County and Cities with baseline data for developing local strategies. It also contributes to the Annual Homeless Assessment Report submitted to Congress.</li> <li>On the day of the count, there were over 400 volunteers.</li> <li>Some key findings:         <ul> <li>In San Bernardino County there were 2.321 adults and children who were identified as homeless. This includes 1,074 who were sheltered (this includes transitional housing and those receiving motel vouchers). There were 1,247 who were unsheltered.</li> <li>There were 920 adults and children (40%) that made up 192 homeless families with children.</li> <li>There was a 19% decrease from the 2011 count. 23 out of 24 cities had unsheltered populations of less than 100 people and 17 cities had less than 50.</li> <li>Mr. Hambly would like to know if the 40% of homeless families is an increase from the previous count. Tom Hernandez will look into this and make some comparisons.</li> <li>Ms. Hessen wanted to point out that this count is not including families that are doubled up and families living in motels.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The next step is for the community to accept baseline numbers and to establish "reduction" benchmarks and implement recommendations to achieve reductions. Recommendations include:</li></ul>

Mr. Forbes did meet with a gentleman who owns about 14 houses. Mr. Forbes is beginning to establish relationships with landlords.</li> <li>Funding Committee has nothing to report at this time.</li> <li>Tom Hernandez gave a report for the Outreach and Engagement Committee in Margaret Rochelle's absence. The committee did meet on May 8<sup>th</sup>. There was a discussion of communication through agency services and they also looked at how the subcommittee can work with existing agencies to help families and individuals achieve productive citizenship in society. They also looked at assessment tools for assisting client needs. They reviewed the importance of networking and making sure everyone is familiar with all of our agencies. They are looking at developing a website to document the success of clients.</li> <li>The Minority Led Resource Development team meets the first Friday of every month at 10:30 a.m. in conjunction with Terrance Stone, Young Visionaries.</li> <li>The next Outreach and Engagement Committee meeting will be determined. If you have any questions or would like to participate in the group you can contact Marleana Roman at mroman@dbh.sbcounty.gov and she will pass the information along to Margaret.</li> <li>In terms of the Office of Homeless Services, the Victorville Project Connect will be held Monday, June 24<sup>th</sup> from 10 am – 3 pm at the First Assembly of God. There will be free medical screenings, dental screenings, employment services, and so on. Lunch will be provided for the families. If you do wish to register as a vendor there is a vendor registration form. Please make sure to fill out both sides of the form</li> </ul>
