In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

UPDATES & INFORMATION ITEMS		
	Don Smith	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ICH updates – The 2016 CoC application has been submitted. Includes to new permanent supportive housing projects. HUD had been encouraging CoC's to transition from Transitional Housing to Permanent Supportive Housing. ICH made a tough decision to reallocate funding from our three remaining transitional housing projects to Permanent Supportive Housing in the amount of \$750,000. Recommendations for re-allocated funds include 2 new rapid re-housing projects. The 2016 Homeless Youth Survey was release and is available on the Partnership website www.sbcounty.gov/dbh/sbchp There is a Housing First Training being held Friday September 23, 2016 at the University of Loma Linda from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. with guest Speakers Philip Mangano, Sam Tsemberis, and Todd Lipka. The 10th Annual Homeless Summit will be held on November 9, 2016 10:00 am – 3:30 pm at the University of Redlands, Orton Center. Registration will begin September 26th. There was a Special Session held last month by the Board of Supervisors regarding the counties efforts to end homelessness.

	Marisela Manzo	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Coordinated Entry is awaiting Client Track to get access to HMIS so we can create our workflows and start VI-SPDATing. Once we get a hard date we will send that out to everyone and the Sheriff's HOPE team and our outreach team will begin VI-SPDATing and getting those referrals in.
	Don Smith	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> New ESG funding awards were made. Additional money came from the state in the form of Block Grants to the CoC's. Inland Housing Solutions (ITH) received funds for coordinated housing search and stabilization, Time for Change funds for Street Outreach and rental assistance and Catholic Charities and Community Action Partnership also received funds.

Land Use and Zoning Ordinances in the West Valley Region – Update	Don Smith	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Los Angeles Times came out with an article today regarding Sharon Green's efforts to fight discriminatory land use and zoning ordinances in the City of Hesperia along with the ACLU and HUD. • All of the regions were challenged to look at the land use and zoning ordinances in local cities as it pertains to homeless shelters and group housing. We want to make sure all of the cities are compliant with both state and federal guidelines. • To date, we have looked at both Upland and Rancho Cucamonga and both are in compliance.

Upland Police Department Homeless Outreach Team	Officers Jacob Kirk & Andrew McCullough	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Homeless Outreach Team is comprised of two Community Resources Officers, Officer Kirk and McCullough and their Supervisor, Sergeant Mike Simpson. • Since the team was created last November the department has documented 178 unsheltered homeless individuals and has housed 59 of them. • They created a questionnaire they use when they come in contact with a homeless individual to help them identify the best resources for that person. That information is stored in a data base so if they come across that individual again they have the information they need and can update it as needed. • Prior to the Homeless Outreach team the effort to assist the homeless was operated differently: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Operated in SILOS ○ Uncoordinated city efforts ○ Enforcement focus ○ Relied on County efforts (HOPE, HPN, DBH) ○ Lack of understanding / Laws ○ Very little/No advocacy • Currently their efforts include help from volunteers, faith based organizations, and the County of San Bernardino Department of Behavioral Health (DBH). • They meet with caseworkers and homeless advocates on the second Tuesday of every month and on the third Tuesday of every month they meet with the stakeholders. • They are collaborating with DBH to get an on-site case worker assigned to the Upland Police Department. Having a case worker in the department will help get the resources to the clients faster. • They will provide Mental Health training for advocates. • The Upland PD will be hosting a Homeless Summit on October 6, 2016.
