POLICY STATEMENT

It is the policy of the San Bernardino County Local Workforce Investment Board (WIB) that WIB members regularly attend all WIB general meetings and standing committee meetings of which they are a member. This policy is to ensure a quorum is present to vote and act on items presented at all meetings.

BACKGROUND

In consideration of the business being performed by the WIB at general and standing committee meetings, the WIB has determined that there is a need for an attendance policy in regards to members of the Board. WIB members have a duty to attend and participate in each meeting of which they are a member.

- ATTENDANCE: Members shall regularly attend meetings of the WIB and the standing committees pursuant to Section 5.07 of the San Bernardino County WIB By-laws (By-laws). The Executive Committee shall routinely review member attendance at WIB general and standing committee meetings.
- NOTIFICATION OF ABSENCE: Members shall notify the clerk of the WIB of any expected absence for a meeting by 5:00 p.m. on the day before the meeting, indicating good and sufficient reasons for the absence. Such notification may be made directly to the Chair of the WIB or through WIB staff.
- SERVICE ON COMMITTEES: In order to understand the WIB and member roles, it is highly recommended that private sector members of the WIB serve on a standing committee. Each committee chairperson may invite new committee members to serve as necessary. All members shall have the ability to self-nominate and be appointed, pursuant to Section 9.02 of the By-laws, to serve on standing committees, with the exception of the Youth Council which is established by resolution as provided in Section 13.01 of the By-laws.
- FAILURE TO ATTEND MEETINGS: Members may be subject to removal pursuant to Sections 4.05 and 5.07 of the By-Laws.
