In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

	Jimmy Waldron	• ELSP is dwindling down and that Phase 34 was not over with. Requested and urged that today's attendees to vote come to election time and especially to help vote for programs that will help fund their organizations and the High Desert. Dollars will go further if organizations partner together, work as a team, and participate in council meetings where public attendance is offered.
	Elaine Navarrete	 I have a student in need of stable housing, has good grades, and is currently a substance abuser and has mental health issues. The meeting attendees were able to work together to provide Elaine with the resources to help this student. It was also advised she contact 211 at Ext. 42 for assistance. Step Up advised that they would need to check this student's info and see if he meets criteria even with pre-existing conditions. Sharon texted her Program Manager and announced they had one bed available for this student. All community colleges have to offer a Youth Homeless Liaison on campus. At Victor Valley College they offer the homeless youth to come in to take showers in their gym, keep some items in the campus lockers, and they also provide towels to them.

 A C.O.R.E. Solutions Program Presentation 	Raquel Jennings	 A C.O.R.E. Solutions Program assists low-income families with utility assistance. A C.O.R.E. does the intake and Community Action Partnership of San Bernardino (CAP) provides the utility assistance.
	Nicole Williams- Artry	 We conduct the intake assessment to find out all of the services needed. Then CAP assists in getting the utilities turned back on. They service up to 30 clients each Monday. We have partnered with CAP for 3 years serving approximately 500 families this year. We try to find out more information; such as if they were evicted or what other services they are in need of. Once service needs are determined we refer out to other agencies to assist. Raquel is a certified life coach who will assist in a group/workshop or one-on-one setting. All information is confidential. We pride ourselves in serving clients with compassion. Most are on the brink of homelessness (many are one month or a paycheck away). A.C.O.R.E is always looking to collaborate with other service providers. We are self-funded, no grant funding. We have been providing services for 2.5 years, all self-funded and looking to expand. All services are free, we have a sliding scale so they learn to invest in themselves.

	Jimmy Waldron Stacy Minwalla	 The Homeless Provider Network (HPN) voted to separate the Desert and Mountain Regions. The Desert and the Mountains are now separate and will conduct their own regional meetings. Discussed additional meetings for HPN. Step-Up goes out in the field to assist homeless individuals. We are having issues with code enforcement coming out and moving them out without notification. They have attempted to get notification to help them move or help with needs, but they are moved and unable to be located. I would like to recommend that we have a resource list available for the attendees of this meeting.

I recommend that we have city officials attend our next meeting so they are aware of the issue brought up by Stacy Minwalla from Step-Up. Paul Cook's office will assist with letters of support or what is needed to assist this partnership. To qualify for motel vouchers and other services through Step Up the individual must meet the 3 years of chronic homelessness requirement. This can be verified through 2-1-1 or other organizations they were serviced by during that time period. I want to give an update on the homeless student I talked about during the June meeting. That student found housing and is now in a stable living environment.
