State of the Continuum of Care (CoC)	Tom Hernandez	 A brief overview of the 2019 HUD Homeless Assistance Grants was provided. July 3, 2019 HUD released the Continuum of Care Notice of Funding Availability (NoFA). Estimated Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) \$9,767,625 Tier 1 - \$9,181,568 Tier 2 - \$586,057 Project applications submitted to the CoC for inclusion on the CoC Priority Listing must be reviewed and either accepted and ranked or rejected by the CoC. All project applications approved by the CoC must be listed on the CoC Priority Listing in rank order, except project applications for CoC planning and UFA Costs projects which are not ranked. Higher ranked projects will be assigned to Tier 1 and lower ranked projects will be assigned to Tier 2. CoCs cannot receive grants for new projects, other than through reallocation, unless the CoC competitively ranks projects based on how they improve system performance as outlined in Section VII.B.1.a of this NOFA. HUD is increasing the share of the CoC score that is based on performance criteria. HUD will prioritize funding for CoCs that have demonstrated the ability to reallocate resources to higher performing projects. Eligible renewal project applicants will continue to have the ability to consolidate two or more eligible renewal projects (but no more than four projects) into one project application during the application process. The Grant Review Committee is responsible for: Reviewing, scoring and ranking the Applications for new projects. Make recommendations to the ICH.
