Policy	It is the policy of San Bernardino County Department of Behavioral Health (DBH) to utilize the Transformational Collaborative Outcomes Management (TCOM) framework and measures as a decision support and information management approach to support communication in a complex service delivery environment.
Definitions	The TCOM measures to be utilized throughout the Department's mental health services are the Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths - San Bernardino (CANS-SB) and the Adult Needs and Strengths Assessment - San Bernardino (ANSA-SB).
	CANS-SB and ANSA-SB – comprehensive clinical tools that organize information collected during a behavioral health assessment in a consistent manner to improve communication among those involved in planning and providing care for a child or adolescent (CANS-SB) or an adult (ANSA-SB) as well as provide information useful for performance outcomes.
	TCOM User – an individual trained and certified to use the CANS-SB and the ANSA-SB.
	Objective Arts – a secured, proprietary, web-based data collection and reporting system that allows DBH and DBH contractors to provide regular periodic assessments to measure treatment outcomes of consumers as they participate in various mental health programs. The system includes immediate access to multiple providers, an online measurement tool, individual and collective data sharing, and the ability for users to access/monitor client information while complying with Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996 requirements.
	Objective Arts Users – individuals possessing Objective Arts accounts with designated roles and responsibilities (see Objective Arts manual on the <u>TCOM website</u> for details).
	Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) - designated TCOM Trainers who are assigned throughout DBH who are proficient and adept in CANS-SB and/or ANSA-SB to assist people who have questions regarding the clinical use of CANS-SB/ANSA-SB or certification for CANS-SB/ANSA-SB.
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Primary Uses	 TCOM measures have three primary uses: Decision support Outcome monitoring Quality improvement
	As a decision support tool, the measures assist in the collaborative development of a Client Plan by clinical staff, consumers, families, Child and Family Teams, and treatment teams; help identify appropriate levels of care for consumers; and assist in identifying needed resources.
	As an outcome monitoring tool, the measures assist in communicating and celebrating improvements in applicable levels of the consumer's network, including individual, family, and community improvements; track aggregate improvement by consumer and families; and may provide information on program performance.
	As a quality improvement tool, the measures assist in the management and supervision of staff (e.g., ensuring strengths and needs are incorporated into the Client Plan) and programs (e.g., ensuring balance of workload); help identify areas of training needs; and help in planning program additions or modifications.
Database Use	TCOM users shall utilize Objective Arts to record and share information. Users have specific roles and duties, as designated in the unit. These responsibilities correspond to specific rights within Objective Arts and do not necessarily match employee classification titles. For example, a licensed clinical therapist may supervise an intern and therefore may need to have the role of "supervisor" to review and approve the intern's TCOM measures.

Supervision Requirements for Objective Arts	 Clinical supervisors shall incorporate the review of the TCOM measures within their supervision of clinical staff. This review has the following minimum expectations: Clinical Assessment documentation and scoring of the TCOM measure shall be consistent. Diagnosis of record shall be consistent with the Clinical Assessment and TCOM measure.

Completion Timelines	Clients enrolled in any of the designated treatment programs shall have a complete TCOM measure (See <u>TCOM website</u> for updated list of designated treatment programs). Completion of the CANS-SB or ANSA-SB is determined by the consumer's age group and the type of program the consumer is enrolled in:

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Completion Timelines, continued	 The initial TCOM assessment shall be completed within the first 30 days of intake, unless the client is determined to not meet program eligibility (requiring the episode to be closed within 30 days of intake) and there is not sufficient information available to complete the assessment. Updated assessments shall be completed every three months or every six months, depending upon the intensity of the program, or sooner, if needed to capture significant changes. At discharge, a TCOM assessment must be completed unless one has been completed within 30 days, and there are no additional changes in the scores. In no case shall a period of more than six months pass without a TCOM assessment being completed with a client.
