1010	Incident Administration <i>(newly added category)</i>	General administrative activities performed in response to a disaster or emergency (including staff scheduling, meetings, resource planning, etc). Other administrative activities associated with a specific project.
1010A	Debris Removal	Debris removal must be in the public interest and necessary to eliminate immediate threats to lives, public health, safety, and significant damage to improved public or private property. Trees and Woody Debris, Building Components, Sand, Mud, Silt, Gravel, and Removal of Temporary Levees
1010B	Emergency Response and Protective Measures	Activities undertaken before, during, and following a disaster or emergency to eliminate or reduce an immediate threat to life, public health, safety, and damages to improved public or private property. Activities may include Search & Rescue, Security, Emergency Pumping, Sandbagging, Detour and Warning Signs, Emergency & Temporary Repairs, Overhead Power Lines, Emergency Medical Facilities, and Emergency Evacuations. General direct disaster or emergency response.
1010C	Roads and Bridges	Roads: Surfaces, Bases, Shoulders, Ditches, Drainage Structures, Low Water Crossings Bridges: Decking & Pavement, Piers, Girders, Abutments, Slope Protection, Approaches, Slope Failures
1010D	Water Control Facilities	Dams and Reservoirs, Levees, Engineered Drainage Channels, Canals, Aqueducts Sediment Basins, Shore Protective Devices, Irrigation Facilities, Pumping Facilities
1010E	Buildings and Equipment	Buildings, Structural Components Interior Systems (Electrical, Mechanical, Contents)
1010F	Utilities	Water Treatment Plants Power Generation & Distribution Facilities: Natural Gas Systems, Wind Turbines, Generators, Power Lines
1010G	Parks, Recreational Areas, and Other Facilities	Playground Equipment, Swimming Pools, Bath Houses, Tennis Courts, Boat Docks, Piers, Picnic Tables, Golf Courses, Fish Hatcheries, Mass Transit Facilities
1010H	Fire Suppression (if applicable)	Work associated with fire-fighting and related activities.
1010X	Emergency Operations Center (EOC)	A central location from which the County coordinates information and resources to support incident management. The EOC provides interagency coordination and executive decision making in support of incident response and recovery operations.
	Department Operations Center (DOC)	A discipline-specific operations center directing emergency field response, which may include Law Enforcement, Fire, ICEMA, and Public Health.
1010Y	Shelter Operations Compound (SHOC)	A location that provides a safe, sanitary, and secure environment and life-sustaining services to disaster survivors displaced from their primary residences due to natural or man-made disasters or emergencies.
	Local Assistance Center (LAC)	A centralized location for services and resource referrals for unmet needs to communities following a disaster or emergency.
	Commodity Point of Distribution (CPOD)	A point of distribution where the public can go to pick up emergency supplies following a disaster or emergency.
	Joint Information Center (JIC)	A physical location for the coordination and dissemination of information to the public and media concerning incident prevention, preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation.
1010Z	Incident Cost Recovery	Any administrative costs incurred to compile incident cost data for reimbursement claim filings.
