I. Director's Report

Jennifer Alsina, Assistant Director \$54.000.00.

- An Ad Hoc event committee was established and includes Commissioners Hall, Westlake and Chapman, Chair Mink and Supervisor Armendarez.
- Subject Matter Presentation Recommendations: The following presentation topics have been recommended: HOST program, Inland Empire Behavioral Health Collaborative (IEBHC) success and next steps, Veterans' Support Services, Garden Healing, Community Assistance, Recovery and Empowerment (CARE) Act on the Conservatorship process, Triage, Engagement and Support Teams (TEST) Program, Foster Care Services and Juvenile Justice resources provided by DBH. Two spaces have been kept open for any public recommendations.

- Q&A:
  - o When asked by Chair Mink if there is a delay in someone receiving services, Dr. Belford-Saldana answered if someone is ready for services, there is no delay. If someone is not ready, there are continuing engagements to encourage the individual and build a relationship.
  - o When asked by Commissioner Hall if there are engagements that involve further assessment as a 5150, Dr. Belford-Saldana answered if necessary and on average there are 17-25 engagements before an individual would even start talking to them.
- The audience was introduced to Chris who spoke on his experience of homelessness. He became homeless around a year ago after living in Atlanta for 10 years, living on the streets before he was introduced to the Amazing Place clubhouse. While provided shelter, he was connected with a psychiatrist and therapist. It was difficult receiving services because of his anxiety and depression from living on the streets. This experience has been humbling but has produced an amazing outcome. He is thankful to DBH for this program and to the staff of Amazing Place, namely Kristen, Lizette, Shea, Naomi, Jonathan, Corey and Mark Guillermo. Currently, he is working with the DBH Lighthouse Program and recently moved into his own apartment. He is also thankful he was allowed to have his dog, Blake, with him throughout this experience.
- Care Court: Received a total of 25 total reports with the primary source of referrals from family members and hospitals.



- Care Act: Improve the well-being of individuals with serious mental health conditions by establishing a court management system to provide early intervention, treatment and support and ensure individuals receive appropriate care while balancing their rights with community safety.
- Assisted Outpatient Training (AOT) Program: Has a total of 139 referrals with 25 in intensive engagement in three petitions files with the court. The primary referral source is the HOPE team along with other behavioral health programs.
- Proposition 36: An act that allows certain non-violent drug offenders to receive treatment instead of incarceration through a court ordered drug treatment program. There are currently 11 referrals. Partners include the court, public defenders' office, District Attorney, probation and DBH. When referrals are received, DBH will coordinate space to complete a screening to determine the level of care and if treatment is an option.

### • Legislative Updates: Megan Kidwell

- The Big Beautiful Bill Act, HR1, was passed by the senate 218-214. This will extend President Trump's tax cuts, increases military and border security spending, and eliminates taxes on tips and overtime. Spending cuts will reduce Medicaid by \$1 trillion over the next 10 years. It also reduces funding to the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP). The bill rescinds clean energy tax credits and raises the debt ceiling by \$3.4 trillion. It is expected to be signed July 4, 2025.
- California's budget was signed earlier last week and addresses a projected \$12 billion deficit. Also signed was additional budget related savings or bills that include AB102 and SB 101, which includes homeless funding of \$500 million.
- Homeownership Assistance Program (HAP): There was no funding provided for fiscal year 25/26. Proposition 36 allocated \$50 million for counties to assist in implementation along with additional wildfire prevention funding and aid.
