



# Guidance for Re-Opening During COVID-19 Recovery

## Resources for July 1 Order

The coronavirus is spreading rapidly within our county and immediate action is needed to slow the spread. On July 1, Governor Gavin Newsom ordered certain sectors that promote mixing of populations beyond households to close. As of July 1, brewpubs, breweries, bars, and pubs must close both indoor and outdoor operations. In addition, dine-in restaurants, wineries and tasting rooms, movie theaters, family entertainment centers, zoos and museums, and cardrooms must close their indoor operations, but can operate outdoor operations with appropriate modifications (i.e., social distancing, face coverings, etc.).

Per the [Statewide Industry Guidance to Reduce Risk](#), all facilities that can open and operate **must**:

1. Perform a detailed risk assessment and implement a site-specific protection plan.
2. Train employees on how to limit the spread of COVID-19, how to screen themselves for symptoms and stay home if they have them.
3. Implement individual control measures and screenings.
4. Implement disinfecting protocols.
5. Implement physical distancing guidelines.

### • Guidelines for Temporary COVID-Compliant Outdoor Dining

- Restrooms must be made available for customers. Ensure that the restrooms are stocked and disinfected regularly.
- For incorporated areas, refer to your city Land Use Department.

### • Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) for the State of California

- Serving alcohol outdoors may require an additional license from ABC.
- If a licensee operates outdoors pursuant to this directive, the area in which alcoholic beverages are served or consumed must be licensed either under the permanent license issued for the premises or under a COVID-19 Temporary Catering Authorization. Alcoholic beverages may only be served in conjunction with meals, except for winery tasting rooms.
