Word from the Sheriff



In 2021, we continue to adapt and adjust to achieve our goals and mission of serving the residents of our county. The past year has brought many challenges, but also opportunities to evolve, innovate, and progress as an organization.

One major area we continue to focus on is rehabilitation. In law enforcement, we encounter people who have made choices which led them to arrests or incarceration. I believe those who are willing to learn from their mistakes, deserve an equal opportunity to utilize rehabilitation tools and programming to make positive changes in their lives. In 2021, the Community Service and Reentry Division (CSR D) was created to expand our inmate rehabilitation, education, and reentry programs. Through vocational, academic, and cognitive programs, inmates gain the necessary skills to better themselves, make their families stable, and change their circumstances. Another focus is on healthy and active parenting to break the multi-generational cycle of incarceration. In 2021, the Inmate Services Programs had over 700 inmates participate in various programs. CSR D also offers additional services to those experiencing homelessness, struggling with mental health issues, frequently arrested, and other hard-to-serve demographics. Our HOPE Team recently housed its 2500th person. Their efforts continue to help many, and they continue to do great work with our partners from across the county.

Over the past several years, the county has experienced the troubling effects of the opioid epidemic. This continues to be compounded by the increased introduction of fentanyl. Drug traffickers have been producing counterfeit pharmaceutical pills, causing a massive spike in overdoses and overdose deaths. We have seen firsthand that social status and criminal history do not matter, the victims come from all walks of life. In response to this trend, beginning in 2021, the Overdose Response Team (ORT) was created. This team investigated 115 cases of drug overdoses and related deaths.

Throughout the county, we have seen illegal marijuana cultivation bring crime, blight, and danger our communities. The negligent use of pesticides and chemicals causes pollution to our land and kills animals. This careless behavior places a burden on our resources in rural areas. It also pollutes and depletes our scarce water supply. Through financial support from the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors, the Marijuana Enforcement Team expanded into five teams to attack illegal cannabis cultivation. In 2021, Operation Hammer Strike served 415 search warrants, made 475 arrests, seized 130 firearms, and eradicated 2,634 greenhouses.

As the largest county in the nation, we rely heavily on our department's volunteers. Our dedicated volunteers provide many services to the community. Whether Citizens on Patrol, Search and Rescue, Chaplains, Explorers, Air Medics, or Reserve Deputies, our volunteers are always ready and willing to provide quality law enforcement services. They conduct extra patrol in neighborhoods, assist with community events, and help to rescue lost or stranded hikers. In 2021, our 1,482 volunteers donated 189,000 hours to our communities.

In July 2021, Sheriff John McMahon retired after 36 years in law enforcement, with eight of those as the Sheriff. Sheriff McMahon began his career in law enforcement in 1985 as a patrol deputy at the Needles Station and worked at 15 stations throughout his career. John was a tremendous leader who was greatly admired by his employees and community. He was known for his fairness, strong work ethic, and always doing the right thing. I wish him the best of luck on his well-deserved retirement.

I am honored to have been appointed as the 36th Sheriff for San Bernardino County. I was raised in a law enforcement family, and service has always been a part of who I am. I have lived in this county for over 40 years, and I truly care about our community and department. As your Sheriff, I am grateful for the opportunity to interact with local leaders, advocates, and faith-based organizations. Together, we can develop innovative and equitable ways to better serve the people of this county. A thriving community is made possible through successful interactions and partnerships, and I look forward to building on these relationships to make positive change. As we continue to adjust to post-pandemic life, I remain committed to hiring the best and brightest employees to better serve the residents of our county. We are making great strides and I'm pleased to announce we now have the most diverse department we've ever had. Women make up 15% of our sworn staff, and we continue to expand our recruitment efforts to hire employees reflective of the diverse communities we serve.

Thank you to our residents for your support; the law enforcement officers across the county appreciate it more than you know. Law enforcement is not an easy profession, but we are honored to be part of and protect the communities we serve. I am proud of the men and women of the department; they are exceptional and are committed to your safety.
