Detectives from Specialized Investigations- Homicide Detail responded to West Valley Detention Center to assume the investigation.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at about 1525 hours, deputies from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, West Valley Detention Center, responded to [REDACTED] reference a possible fight. Deputies Enrique Ramirez and Deputy Samuel Mora responded to [REDACTED] and located inmate, Jorge Diaz Millan [REDACTED], inside of [REDACTED] unresponsive. As Ramirez approached [REDACTED], he observed Diaz Millan's cellmate, Ceasar Wilkinson [REDACTED], inside of [REDACTED] kneeling to the right of Diaz Millan and patting at his face. Ramirez handcuffed Wilkinson and removed him from the cell. Mora escorted Wilkinson down the stairs into the day room of [REDACTED]

At about 1530 hours, Deputy Enrique Ramirez used his Sheriff's radio to broadcast a "Code Blue." A code blue is known throughout the facility as a medical emergency where someone is unconscious or not breathing. Ramirez checked for a pulse on Diaz Millan and did not feel one. Ramirez noticed Diaz Millan lay in a pool of water on the floor and was face down in the cell. Ramirez pulled Diaz Millan out of the cell and turned him over to lay supine. Ramirez immediately began to give cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to Diaz Millan and waited for medical staff to respond.

West Valley Detention Center Medical Staff began to arrive on scene shortly after the Code Blue was called out. The first medical staff to arrive on scene was Registered Nurse [REDACTED] stated she was the assigned Unit 1 nurse and was inside of the infirmary doing charting when she heard the code blue broadcasted over the Sheriff's radio. [REDACTED] grabbed her medical supply bag and quickly made her way to Unit 1. [REDACTED] entered [REDACTED] and observed Ramirez performing CPR on Diaz Millan. [REDACTED] Ramirez, and Mora moved Diaz Millan further out of the cell to provide medical staff more room to work on Diaz Millan. [REDACTED] advised Deputies to continue CPR as she grabbed an ammonia packet and placed it into Diaz Millan's nose to alert him. Diaz Millan showed no reaction and Deputies continued CPR. [REDACTED] placed a blood pressure cuff and an oxygen meter, neither device had a reading. Other medical staff arrived and continued to perform life saving measures on Diaz Millan.

Wilkinson was escorted from [REDACTED] Deputy Eliasib Sanchez was assigned to watch Wilkinson. While Wilkinson was seated in a chair in the [REDACTED] he asked Sanchez if Diaz Millan was going to be okay. Sergeant Ixco arrived and moved Wilkinson out [REDACTED] and secured him into an attorney interview room, which was located upstairs in [REDACTED]

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1551 hours, American Medical Response (AMR) and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department (RCFD) arrived on scene in [REDACTED] and began to treat Diaz Millan, who was located on the top tier in front of [REDACTED] RCFD used a transport board and loaded Diaz Millan onto it. RCFD brought Diaz Millan downstairs and placed him on a gurney to be transported to [REDACTED] Diaz Millan was transported from WVDC to [REDACTED] in critical condition and was not expected to survive.

Detective Art Alvarado responded to [REDACTED] to check on the status of Diaz Millan. Alvarado spoke with medical staff at [REDACTED] and was told that Diaz Millan was alive but listed as extremely critical. Diaz Millan had lost his heartbeat multiple times and CPR had to be performed multiple times. Diaz Millan was placed on a ventilator. The doctor noted ligature marks around Diaz Millan's neck and stated the marks were possibly caused by strangulation. Diaz Millan was sent in for a computerized tomography (CT) scan. During the CT scan, the doctor located a severe cerebral edema. A doctor at [REDACTED] stated it appeared that Diaz Millan had no brain activity, and he was placed into a medically induced coma.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, I reviewed video footage obtained from [REDACTED]. The video footage depicted [REDACTED] and showed a day room with tables and chairs. [REDACTED] consisted of sixteen cells, with eight being on the ground level and eight being on the second level of the segment. While reviewing video, I observed movement within [REDACTED]. Due to the glare and metal on the cell doors, I was unable to see clearly into [REDACTED]. At about 1524 hours, I observed a face in the lower section of the door. The subject appeared to be slightly elevated off the ground and appeared to stare out of the cell door through the glass. At 1530 hours, Sanchez arrived at [REDACTED]. Sanchez handcuffed Wilkinson and escorted him out of the cell. Diaz Millan was seen face down on the inside of the cell, just inside of the door. Diaz Millan appeared to be unconscious and did not move.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at 2320 hours, Detective Malcolm Page and I interviewed Ceasar Wilkinson, in a private interview room, at WVDC. I read Wilkinson his Miranda Rights per my Department issued Miranda card. Wilkinson waived his rights and agreed to give a statement to us. Wilkinson was booked on September 22, 2021 at WVDC. Wilkinson stated he was previously housed in a different cell by himself. On October 6, 2021, at about 1200 hours Wilkinson was moved from his cell and housed in [REDACTED].

When Wilkinson arrived at [REDACTED] he realized there was another male inside of the cell, later identified as Diaz Millan. Wilkinson stated Diaz Millan immediately started to act strange and pull at his shirt sleeve as he was placed into the cell. Diaz Millan told Wilkinson to take his shirt off. Wilkinson advised Diaz Millan to stop and stated he just wanted to serve his time and go home. Wilkinson did not want any problems with Diaz Millan. Diaz Millan continued to display strange and aggressive behavior while Wilkinson was in the cell with him.

Wilkinson claimed he became so uncomfortable with Diaz Millan he pushed the intercom button and requested to be placed on suicide watch. Wilkinson told deputies this because he wanted to be moved out of the cell with Diaz Millan. Diaz Millan accused Wilkinson of killing his family in Guerrero, Mexico. Wilkinson had no idea what Diaz Millan talked about. Diaz Millan told Wilkinson he was a fighter and punched and kneed the cell door. Diaz Millan hit the door very hard and Wilkinson feared Diaz Millan would strike him.

Wilkinson was seated on the lower bunk bed and faced the cell door. Diaz Millan grabbed a pack of peanut butter and told Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter, as he slammed it down. Wilkinson refused to eat the peanut butter and Diaz Millan got angry at Wilkinson. Diaz Millan told Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter, or Diaz Millan would kill him. Wilkinson stated Diaz Millan began to count down, "3-2-1" and kicked Wilkinson in the face just above his right eye as he was seated on the bed. Wilkinson was stunned and looked up as Diaz Millan began to kick Wilkinson again. Diaz Millan slipped on the wet floor and Wilkinson jumped up and took Diaz Millan down to the ground inside of the cell. Wilkinson wrapped his left arm around Diaz Millan's neck and grabbed his left arm with his right hand. Wilkinson began to choke Diaz Millan. Wilkinson was afraid to let go because he believed Diaz Millan would kill him.

Wilkinson stated he positioned himself on top of Diaz Millan and held onto his neck. Wilkinson held onto Diaz Millan's neck with his left arm and yelled for help. Wilkinson removed his right hand from his grip and pounded on the cell door. Diaz Millan was breathing heavy, and Wilkinson believed Diaz Millan was hyping himself up to hurt Wilkinson. Wilkinson held onto Diaz Millan's neck until deputies arrived at the cell. Wilkinson did not want to hurt Diaz Millan, but feared Diaz Millan was going to kill him in the cell.

Wilkinson sustained a large welt above his right eye, approximately three inches in length. Wilkinson's right eye was red, and it appeared he suffered broken blood vessels in his eye. Wilkinson refused medical treatment. The injuries were photographed and documented by crime scene specialist [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Detective Jonathan Cavender, Crime Scene Specialists [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] processed the crime scene. The crime scene was located within Housing [REDACTED] at West Valley Detention Center, located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, in Rancho Cucamonga. [REDACTED] was located at the east portion of [REDACTED]. The Housing unit was a cell style housing unit, with six housing segments, which contained eight cells on the bottom tier and eight cells on the top tier. The cells were located on the east wall of [REDACTED] was located on the top tier, south of the staircase. The housing unit was accessed from the housing corridor via a pneumatic door located in [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was a 13'x7' cell, which consisted of a two bunk beds along the east wall and a desk, toilet and sink along the south wall. Inside the cell Cavender observed a blue mattress on the top bunk and numerous court paperwork for the suspect, Ceasar Wilkinson, located on the bottom bunk. On the bottom bunk, Cavender located a San Bernardino County inmate orange shirt, size XXL. The shirt had a white label on the front left of the shirt with the label "Wilkinson, C SBSUP 25." On the desk inside [REDACTED] Cavender observed a San Bernardino County inmate orange shirt, size XXXL, two white socks, and a San Bernardino County inmate orange shirt, size medium. The floor of the cell had an approximately 2'x3' puddle of water, which appeared to be leaking from the toilet. Cavender did not locate any weapons or blood inside the cell.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at about 2345 hours to Thursday, October 7, 2021 at about 0045 hours, Cavender conducted inmate interviews of the inmates housed in [REDACTED].

At about 0039 hours, Cavender interviewed Inmate [REDACTED] (Booking Number [REDACTED]), inside [REDACTED] was housed in [REDACTED] with Inmate [REDACTED] (Booking Number [REDACTED]). On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, [REDACTED] was in his [REDACTED] and heard a loud noise. [REDACTED] described the noise was the sound of someone fighting. [REDACTED] knew the sound was a fight because he heard two people yelling, and the sound of individuals striking the walls. [REDACTED] heard an unknown inmate say there was a fight in [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] heard an unknown inmate yell "help him, help him."

Due to the fight, [REDACTED] pressed the intercom button in his cell, which is the way inmates from inside the cell can communicate with the [REDACTED] control booth. When an inmate presses the control button, a loud "bing" sound comes from the speaker, which indicates to the inmate the intercom was working. After approximately 11 "bings," [REDACTED] received a [REDACTED] from the [REDACTED] control booth. A female from the [REDACTED] control booth answered the intercom, and [REDACTED] informed the female there was a fight in [REDACTED]. As [REDACTED] communicated with the control boot, the intercom turned off. [REDACTED] pressed the intercom button a second time. [REDACTED] waited for approximately "five bings" before the female in the control boot answered again. [REDACTED] told the female a second time that there was a fight in [REDACTED] and deputies needed to go upstairs to investigate the disturbance. After approximately 30 seconds after the second intercom call, two deputies entered the segment and walked upstairs to [REDACTED]. Shortly after the deputies arrived, several medical personnel arrived in the segment and went upstairs. Due to where [REDACTED] cell was positioned, he was unable to see any additional events.

According to [REDACTED] approximately a day or two prior to October 6, 2021, the victim, Jorge Diaz-Milan was involved in an altercation with his previous cellmate. [REDACTED] did not know the name of the cellmate and did not know what exactly occurred between Diaz-Millan and the cellmate. [REDACTED] was made aware of the fight by speaking to other inmates in [REDACTED].

Cavender interviewed all inmates, who were housed in [REDACTED]. Through interviews, Cavender learned that many of the inmates heard, what they believed to be a fight occurring in [REDACTED]. Although the inmates heard a fight in [REDACTED], no other inmate, besides [REDACTED] alerted deputies of the fight.

On Sunday, October 10, 2021, at 1508 hours, doctors at [REDACTED] declared Diaz Millan to be brain dead after a series of tests. Diaz Millan was still on life support pending the procurement of his organs and contact with his family. Deputy Coroner Mark Johnson provided his investigation report number 702110298.

SUSPECT INTERVIEW: Ceasar Wilkinson

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 2320 hours, Detective Malcolm Page and I conducted an interview with Ceasar Wilkinson inside a private interview room, at West Valley Detention Center, located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, in Rancho Cucamonga. The interview was recorded on my department issued audio recorder and I later placed a copy of the recording into evidence.

Prior to the interview, I read Wilkinson his Miranda Rights per my department issued Miranda card. To question number one, Wilkinson stated, "Yea I do", indicating he understood his rights. To question number two, Wilkinson stated, "Yea I'll talk to you", indicating he was willing to speak with me. The following is a summary of our interview with Wilkinson.

On Wednesday, September 22, 2021, Wilkinson was booked into West Valley Detention Center (WVDC). Wilkinson admitted he was under the influence of methamphetamine at the time of his arrest and booking. According to Wilkinson he was housed with another inmate later identified as [REDACTED] in [REDACTED]. Wilkinson was booked into WVDC on several different occasions and was classified as a General Population (GP) inmate. Upon Wilkinson's arrival, he discovered [REDACTED] was a quarantine unit for newly arrested inmates booked into WVDC.

Wilkinson remained with [REDACTED] for approximately one day. During Wilkinson's first days at WVDC, he claimed to hallucinate from the methamphetamine he took prior to his arrest. Wilkinson's hallucinations included objects and voices which were not real. On approximately Friday, September 24, 2021, Wilkinson

SUSPECT INTERVIEW CONTINUED: Ceasar Wilkinson

According to Wilkinson, after the fight with [REDACTED], deputies attempted to move Wilkinson to another cell within WVDC. As deputies moved Wilkinson, he ran down a housing unit corridor, away from deputies. Deputies eventually captured Wilkinson and escorted him to [REDACTED]. While in [REDACTED], Wilkinson was re-classified as [REDACTED] was [REDACTED] n. Wilkinson was initially housed alone and claimed he ran away from deputies to avoid being housed with any additional inmates [REDACTED].

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at about 1200 hours, Wilkinson was moved by Deputy Andrew Castillo from [REDACTED] and housed in [REDACTED]. As Wilkinson arrived at [REDACTED], he noticed a Hispanic male, later identified as Jorge Diaz Millan, was already in the cell. Once Castillo placed Wilkinson into [REDACTED], the cell door closed, but his handcuffs remained on. Wilkinson initially feared being handcuffed alone in a cell with Diaz Millan, but after several minutes, Castillo removed Wilkinson's handcuffs through the tray slot in the cell door.

According to Wilkinson, Diaz Millan immediately started to act erratically and quickly moved around the cell. Diaz Millan pulled Wilkinson's shirt sleeve with his fingers and demanded Wilkinson remove his shirt. Wilkinson told Diaz Millan to leave him alone several times, but he continued to pull at Wilkinson's shirt. Wilkinson claimed he told Diaz Millan that he did not want any problems, and desired to serve his time and go home. Diaz Millan continued to display strange and aggressive behavior while Wilkinson was in the cell.

At one point, Wilkinson claimed he became so uncomfortable with Diaz Millan that he pushed the intercom button [REDACTED]. According to Wilkinson, Deputy Enrique Ramirez contacted him at the cell door. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Ramirez allegedly told Wilkinson to remain in [REDACTED].

After Ramirez walked away, Diaz Millan asked Wilkinson where he was from. Wilkinson responded he was from Texas and Diaz Millan immediately accused Diaz Millan of killing his family in [REDACTED] Mexico. Wilkinson had no idea what Diaz Millan talked about and became increasingly concerned for his safety. Wilkinson believed Diaz Millan was mentally unstable and watched as he punched the cell door and wall with his fists.

SUSPECT INTERVIEW CONTINUED: Ceasar Wilkinson

Diaz Millan told Wilkinson he was a fighter as he continued to throw punches and knees strikes at the cell door. In Wilkinson's opinion, Diaz Millan stuck the cell door very hard, and he feared Diaz Millan would be able to knock him out with one strike with the amount of power he had. While Wilkinson stayed in [REDACTED] an unknown inmate approached the cell door. The inmate told Wilkinson to, "Be careful" around Diaz Millan because he fought his last cellmate the day prior.

As the day continued, Diaz Millan's behavior continued to become hostile toward Wilkinson. While Wilkinson sat on the lower bunk and faced the cell door, Diaz Millan grabbed a pack of peanut butter and told Wilkinson to eat it.

After ordering Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter, Diaz Millan slammed the peanut butter packet onto the floor in front of Wilkinson. Wilkinson refused to eat the peanut butter and Diaz Millan got visibly angry and ordered Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter again or "I'll kill you in three seconds." After Diaz Millan threatened to kill Wilkinson, he began to count down, "3-2-1"

As Diaz Millan counted down, Wilkinson remained seated on the bottom bunk. After Diaz Millan counted to one, he kicked Wilkinson one time in the head. Diaz Millan's right shin impacted the right side of Wilkinson's face and forehead, above his right eye. Diaz Millan's kick stunned Wilkinson but did not render him unconscious. After Diaz Millan kicked Wilkinson in the face, Wilkinson saw Diaz Millan began to kick him again with his right foot. Wilkinson believed he must fight for his life to avoid being killed by Diaz Millan. As Diaz Millan swung his right leg toward Wilkinson a second time, he slipped and fell to the floor. Wilkinson believed he needed to grasp onto Diaz Millan and keep him on the floor to avoid being further assaulted or possibly killed.

Wilkinson admitted he wrapped his left arm around Diaz Millan's neck and pressed his body onto the floor against the cell door. Wilkinson tightened his grip around Diaz Millan's neck and held him in a "Choke hold" position. Wilkinson's left arm remained around Diaz Millan's neck and his right hand grasped his left wrist to securely hold Diaz Millan's neck. Wilkinson believed if he let go of Diaz Millan, Diaz Millan would certainly kill him. Wilkinson explained he held onto Diaz Millan's neck as his chest was pressed onto the right side of Diaz Millan's body. Wilkinson's knees were on the floor on Diaz Millan's right side and approximately 80% of Wilkinson's body weight was pressed against Diaz Millan's back. As Wilkinson held Diaz Millan in the choke hold, Diaz Millan kicked his feet and attempted to pull Wilkinson's left arm away from around his neck.

SUSPECT INTERVIEW CONTINUED: Ceasar Wilkinson

Wilkinson claimed he did not desire to harm Diaz Millan and as they were pressed near the cell door, Wilkinson banged on the cell door and yelled for help. Wilkinson desired to get the attention of Ramirez, other deputies or inmates nearby in order to secure Diaz Millan. Diaz Millan eventually stopped struggling but continued to breath heavily. Wilkinson claimed he released his right hand from the choke hold and banged on the cell door. Wilkinson estimated he struck the cell door with his right hand approximately five to six times as he screamed for help. Wilkinson's left arm remained around Diaz Millan's neck, but was not held tightly.

After approximately two to three minutes, Wilkinson saw Ramirez walk up the stairs toward [REDACTED]. After Wilkinson saw Ramirez, he felt safe enough to remove his left arm from around Diaz Millan's neck. As Wilkinson crouched to the right side of Diaz Millan's body, Wilkinson admitted he used an open palm to lightly hit Diaz Millan's face in an attempt to wake him.

As Ramirez opened the cell door, Wilkinson admitted he told Ramirez that Diaz Millan fell. Ramirez handcuffed Wilkinson as Deputy Samuel Mora arrived. Mora escorted Wilkinson to the base of the stairs and told him to sit down. Wilkinson remained seated on a bench as Ramirez and Mora rendered aid to Diaz Millan. Wilkinson became concerned for Diaz Millan's health and believed Diaz Millan was seriously injured. Wilkinson claimed that he yelled toward Ramirez and Mora and admitted that he held Diaz Millan in a choke hold.

As Ramirez continued to render aid to Diaz Millan, Deputy Eliasib Sanchez escorted Wilkinson to Segment G. Wilkinson remained in the clothing he wore at the time of the fight with Diaz Millan and did not wash his hands. Wilkinson sustained pain to his face, forehead, and right eye from the kick by Diaz Millan. Wilkinson adamantly denied that he desired to harm Diaz Millan during the fight. Wilkinson claimed he held onto Diaz Millan's neck while he pressed him to the floor to avoid being killed by Diaz Millan.

Wilkinson could not provide any additional information, and we concluded our interview with him.

[REDACTED] was the attending doctor assigned to examine Jorge Diaz-Millan. Diaz-Millan was in the [REDACTED] Diaz-Millan was unconscious and attached to a ventilator. [REDACTED] advised Diaz-Millan was reportedly "down" for over 30 minutes and without oxygen. Diaz-Millan was possibly "brain dead" due to the extended amount of time without oxygen. [REDACTED] advised medical staff would keep Diaz-Millan in a medically induced coma, to allow Diaz-Millan's body to recuperate. [REDACTED] believed Diaz-Millan was comatose without the sedation. [REDACTED] said medical personnel would remove Diaz-Millan from anesthesia in a day or two and see if he woke up.

[REDACTED] determined Diaz-Millan was anemic and had a low platelets level. [REDACTED] added Diaz-Millan's electrolytes and potassium levels could have caused cardiac arrest. [REDACTED] was not "entirely convinced" an assault alone caused Diaz-Millan's condition.

[REDACTED] observed the following injuries on Diaz-Millan's body: Ligature marks on his neck. [REDACTED] did not observe petechiae around the eyes. [REDACTED] observed a bruising on his right bicep and right hand. [REDACTED] advised the bruising on Diaz-Millan's chest was due to chest compressions during cardiopulmonary resuscitation. [REDACTED] advised he would transfer care to another physician.

[REDACTED] did not have any additional information to provide, and I ended my interview with him.

WITNESS INTERVIEW: ENRIQUE RAMIREZ

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 2150 hours, Detective Malcom Page and I conducted an interview with Deputy Sheriff Enrique Ramirez in the executive dining room of the West Valley Detention Center (WVDC) located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital recorder and later placed a copy of the recording into evidence. I put the interview in chronological order for the ease of the reader. For a verbatim account please refer to audio recordings of the interview. The following is a summary of the interview.

Prior to the interview, Page explained to Ramirez that we desired to obtain a voluntary statement from him, and no disciplinary action would be incurred if he declined to provide a statement. Ramirez stated he understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement.

Ramirez was a Deputy Sheriff, employed by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for [REDACTED] Ramirez' normally scheduled shift was AM1, Tuesday through Friday, from 0800 to 2000 hours. Since February 2021, Ramirez was assigned as a housing deputy for housing Unit 1.

Unit 1 contained Segments A through F and an administrative segregation unit. Unit 1 housed general population and protective custody (PC) inmates. PC inmates ranged from, PC 1, PC 2, and PC 3 classified inmates. PC inmates wore an orange over red inmate uniform. PC inmates were housed with other inmates within the same classifications. The Segments contained 16 cells. Each cell housed one or two inmates. Segment A housed suicide watch inmates who are isolated from other inmates. Unit 1 contained seriously mentally ill lockdown (SMIL) inmates, a classification which required them to be handcuffed to the rear and leg-shackled when moved within the facility, by staff. There were four designated deputies assigned to Segments A, B, C, D, E and F. The deputies accompanied mental health clinicians who treated inmates with mental illnesses.

Ramirez' duties as a housing deputy included conducting hourly inmate observation logs to ensure inmates were accounted for and were in good health. During each hour, Ramirez walked through each segment and observed every cell to ensure every inmate was alive and did not need medical attention.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Ramirez worked his normal shift which started at 0800 hours. Ramirez was assigned to work with Deputy Samuel Mora and Sheriff's Custody Specialist [REDACTED] Ramirez worked at least two shift rotations with [REDACTED] in Unit 1. Mora was on his first Unit 1 rotation. During Ramirez' shift, Ramirez and Mora completed hourly inmate observation logs for Unit 1 before every hour. [REDACTED] was assigned to oversee the unit.

██████████ controlled the unit cell doors, tracked staff entering the unit, and ensured Ramirez and Mora remained safe while conducting hourly inmate observation logs.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, between 1245 and 1300 hours, ██████████ told Ramirez that inmate Caesar Wilkinson was moved from ██████████ while Ramirez was at lunch. Ramirez looked at the surveillance cameras and saw Deputy McGill Castelo move Wilkinson into ██████████. Castelo was assigned to ██████████ but came to ██████████ to assist due to the number of inmates and staff movement within the unit. Wilkinson was subsequently housed with inmate Jorge Diaz-Millan. Ramirez did not assist with Wilkinson's move. Ramirez explained ██████████ did not have a designated ██████████ deputy at the time of Wilkinson's move and was subsequently moved by Castelo. Ramirez was busy moving unrelated inmates from intake to suicide watch.

Wilkinson was moved to accommodate an unrelated inmate who needed to be housed alone in ██████████

██████████ health clinicians and the Classification division. Ramirez normally looked up inmates' backgrounds before they were housed in the unit to ensure inmates are properly housed. Ramirez explained how housing deputies gained experience by working the unit, allowing them to learn how inmates get along with each other. Ramirez was busy with other tasks and did not look up Wilkinson's history prior to his move into ██████████. After Wilkinson was moved, Ramirez looked up Wilkinson's jail records. Ramirez learned Wilkinson previously fought his cellmate and attempted to escape from ██████████. Ramirez believed Wilkinson first arrived at ██████████ approximately two days ago but was not sure. Ramirez did not have knowledge of Diaz-Millan's history. Ramirez did not know or have prior contacts with Wilkinson or Diaz-Millan.

Ramirez first learned of an issue in ██████████ after performing an inmate safety log check, approximately 35 to 45 minutes after Ramirez returned from lunch. Ramirez was in the control booth when ██████████ informed him an inmate from ██████████ pushed the intercom button and screamed into the microphone. ██████████ requested Ramirez check the welfare of the inmates. Ramirez noted it was not uncommon for ██████████ inmates to yell profanities to staff over the intercom.

At approximately 1300 hours, Ramirez entered ██████████ to check on ██████████. Wilkinson waved at Ramirez. Ramirez told Wilkson to hold on as Ramirez walked upstairs and stopped at ██████████ where he spoke to Wilkinson and Diaz-Millan.

Ramirez looked into the cell and noticed Wilkinson stood by the cell door. Wilkinson wore a white shirt and red pants. Wilkinson's clothing appeared clean and in good order. Diaz-Millan sat on the desk chair, hands clasped together, facing the wall. Diaz-Millan did not say anything to Ramirez. Ramirez described Wilkinson as high-functioning and coherent. Ramirez did not observe any injuries on Wilkinson's body. Ramirez previously looked up Wilkinson's jail booking photograph and knew how he looked. Ramirez noticed the floor on the inside of the cell was wet. Ramirez recalled Mora mentioned Diaz-Millan recently washed himself and cleaned the inside of his cell. According to Ramirez, it did not appear a physical confrontation occurred.

Ramirez asked Wilkinson what the problem was. Wilkinson whispered through the tray door as he spoke to Ramirez. Ramirez recalled how the television background noise made it hard to hear Wilkinson. Ramirez told Wilkinson to speak up so he could hear him. Wilkinson said he did not belong here. Ramirez understood that Wilkinson felt he should not be classified as [REDACTED]

Ramirez offered to work with Wilkinson and see if he could eventually be reclassified as general population inmate. Ramirez told Wilkinson to "Champ it out" and attempted to motivate Wilkinson. Ramirez told Wilkinson that he could possibly return to general population [REDACTED]

While Ramirez spoke with Wilkinson, Wilkinson admitted that he was scared, but did not specify what he was scared of. Ramirez asked Wilkinson if he was scared because it was his first time in jail. Wilkinson told Ramirez how he was getting out (of jail) in December and did not want to get in trouble. Ramirez told Wilkinson that he had right "mind set" and encouraged Wilkinson to follow the facility classes, emphasizing how Wilkinson's release date was only two months away. Ramirez recalled Wilkinson describing Diaz-Millan as being "weird". Ramirez did not ask Wilkinson any questions clarifying this statement. Wilkinson did not mention any problem between he and Diaz-Millan. Wilkinson did not threaten to hurt himself or Diaz-Millan. Ramirez estimated the contact with Wilkinson lasted approximately five minutes. Ramirez did not record his contact with Wilkinson. Ramirez believed the contact was routine and unimportant. Ramirez compared his interaction with Wilkinson like a routine contact with an inmate requesting toilet paper, which he would also not audio record.

Ramirez resumed his safety logs checks and normal unit duties. Ramirez was not aware of any additional problems with Wilkinson or Diaz-Millan. Ramirez added that he and Mora were busy throughout the day as the unit was short-staffed. Ramirez explained the deputy assigned to [REDACTED] suicide watch unit, was on vacation. Suicide watch logs required safety checks every 15 minutes.

Ramirez believed all safety logs were performed on time except the meal logs. ██████ told Ramirez she forgot to annotate the lunch log time. Ramirez was at lunch during the meal log time.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1525 hours, ██████ Mora, and Ramirez were in the control booth. ██████ told Ramirez an inmate in ██████ pushed the intercom button, but there was no answer. Additional inmates from cells ██████ and ██████ pushed their respective intercom buttons. ██████ spoke to an inmate in cell ██████ who said cell ██████ needed help. ██████ asked Ramirez to check on cell ██████

Ramirez entered ██████ alone. Ramirez heard several inmates yell ██████ needed help. An unknown inmate from ██████ pointed toward ██████ Ramirez went upstairs and approached ██████. ██████ turned on the light inside ██████ as Ramirez walked to the cell door. Ramirez described door as all metal with two glass windows. One window on the top portion of the door and second window was on the bottom portion of the door. Ramirez did not hear any noise from ██████ as he walked up to the door. Ramirez looked inside the cell and noticed Diaz-Millan's body face down on the floor. Diaz-Millan's head faced left and was against the bottom of the door. Diaz-Millan's right arm was near his head, and his left arm down to his side. Diaz-Millan wore a white shirt and red pants. Ramirez believed Diaz-Millan was unconscious. Ramirez activated his digital recorder when he first noticed Diaz-Millan on the floor.

Wilkinson was in a "football stagger" position, to the right side of Diaz-Millan's body. Ramirez further described Wilkinson bent over at the waist with his knees near the floor. Ramirez saw Wilkinson on top of Diaz-Millan, but not pressing down on his body. Ramirez clarified there was some space between Wilkinson and Diaz-Millan's bodies. Wilkinson's left hand was on top of Diaz-Millan's head or cheek. Ramirez thought Wilkinson was attempting to wake up Diaz-Millan. Ramirez did not see Wilkinson's right hand, but it was possibly on the sink. Wilkinson immediately stood up upon noticing Ramirez. Wilkinson appeared in shock and had a "worried" look, according to Ramirez. Wilkinson did not say anything to Ramirez. Wilkinson wore a white shirt and red pants. No one else was in the cell.

Ramirez said Diaz-Millan was in good health 30 minutes prior and wondered what happened to him. Ramirez ordered Wilkinson to turn around and approach the door to be handcuffed. Ramirez opened the food tray door and handcuffed Wilkinson, without incident. Ramirez signaled for ██████ to open the cell door. Diaz-Millan's body was at the doorway. Ramirez instructed Wilkinson to step over Diaz-Millan. Wilkinson stepped over Diaz-Millan and Ramirez placed him to the right of the cell. Mora immediately arrived and escorted Wilkinson to the first-floor day room.

Ramirez saw Diaz-Millan's body flat on the floor. There was moisture underneath his body. Ramirez grasped Diaz-Millan's shoulders, pulled him out and lay him in front of [REDACTED]. Ramirez turned Diaz-Millan's body face up. Diaz-Millan body was lethargic. Ramirez observed a laceration on Diaz-Millan's nose. Diaz-Millan took a gasp of air. Ramirez felt a pulse on Diaz-Millan's right hand and knew he was still alive. Ramirez used his radio and called for the [REDACTED] nurse to help him in Segment E. Ramirez performed a sternum rub on Diaz-Millan's chest. Diaz-Millan gasped for air a second time. Ramirez felt a weak pulse on Diaz-Millan's right hand. Ramirez called out to Diaz-Millan and attempted to wake him. Ramirez placed Diaz-Millan's left knee over the right knee, and placed his hands underneath his body, in the event Diaz-Millan vomited. Ramirez performed a second sternum rub. Diaz-Millan again grasped for air. Diaz-Millan's eyes were dilatated, his mouth was dry, and his hands turned white and blue in color. Ramirez checked Diaz-Millan but felt no pulse. Ramirez used his handheld radio and broadcasted a "possible code blue" and began chest compressions on Diaz-Millan.

Registered Nurse [REDACTED] arrived and used an ammonia packet to arouse Diaz-Millan. There was no reaction from Diaz-Millan, and his eyes rolled back. Ramirez resumed chest compressions. Registered Nurse [REDACTED] arrived and took over chest compressions. Ramirez estimated he performed three minutes of chest compressions. Ramirez saw Mora on the second floor. Additional unknown nurses arrived to render medical aid to Diaz-Millan. Unknown nurses placed the automated external defibrillator (AED) on Diaz-Millan. The AED advised no shock needed and to continue CPR. Unknown nurses continued chest compressions. An unknown nurse established an intravenous line (IV) on Diaz-Millan. Ramirez instructed Mora to remain with the nurses. Ramirez walked down to the first floor and wrote down the names of the staff who entered the unit. Ramirez instructed Deputy Elisha Sanchez to take Wilkinson to the attorney room in [REDACTED]. Ramirez briefed Sergeants Nickalaus Seybert and Rafael Ixco.

American Medical Response (AMR) and Rancho Fire Department Station 174 arrived in approximately 25 minutes. Paramedics connected Diaz-Millan to an electrocardiogram machine (EKG). Paramedics brought down Diaz-Millan to the first floor using a portable stretcher and placed him onto a gurney. Paramedics took Diaz-Millan out of the unit approximately eight minutes after they arrived.

Ramirez did not provide further information, and I concluded the interview.

On Thursday, October 7, 2021, at approximately 1450 hours, I interviewed Registered Nurse (RN) [REDACTED] in a private office inside the medical clinic at the West Valley Detention Center (WVDC). I recorded my interview with [REDACTED] with my department-issued digital recorder, and I later placed a copy into the case file. The following is a summary of our interview.

I explained to [REDACTED] that I wanted to conduct a voluntary interview with her, and no discipline could be brought if she refused to provide a voluntary statement. [REDACTED] agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the death of inmate Jorge Diaz-Millan.

[REDACTED] was an RN who worked at WVDC for [REDACTED] worked the day shift on Wednesday, October 6, 2021, from 0730 hours to 2000 hours. [REDACTED] was assigned as the Housing Nurse for [REDACTED] in charge of handling all sick call slips.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1525 hours, while at the medical clinic, [REDACTED] heard "[REDACTED] nurse, can you [REDACTED] broadcasted over the police radio. [REDACTED] became concerned, collected her medical bag, and walked toward [REDACTED] While [REDACTED] was on her way to [REDACTED], she heard, "We need an ammonia packet, he is unresponsive" broadcasted over the police radio. [REDACTED] walked faster toward [REDACTED], and as she entered the unit, she heard "Code Blue." A code blue was a medical emergency on the facility, which required all available medical staff to respond.

[REDACTED] was the first medical staff member to arrive at the scene. [REDACTED] entered [REDACTED] and immediately ran into the segment and observed an inmate handcuffed on the bottom tier. [REDACTED] ran upstairs and observed an inmate, later identified as Diaz Millan, lying on his back, with his eyes closed. Diaz Millan's head faced toward the segment door.

[REDACTED] observed Diaz Millan's skin looked pale and off. [REDACTED] noticed Diaz Millan clothes were wet and he was lay in a puddle of water. [REDACTED] instructed Deputy Ramirez and Deputy Sanchez to move Diaz Millan out of the water. Deputies moved Diaz Millan out of the cell and onto the platform of the top tier. [REDACTED] told Ramirez to begin chest compressions. Ramirez began chest compressions on Diaz Millan. [REDACTED] attached a blood pressure cuff to Diaz Millan's right arm and a pulse ox meter on his left hand. Ramirez continued to perform chest compressions. [REDACTED] inserted an ammonia packet into Diaz Millan's nostril and did not get any response. [REDACTED] did not get any readings from the pulse ox or the blood pressure cuff. [REDACTED] switched with Ramirez and began to conduct chest compressions.

RN [REDACTED] arrived at the scene and had the automated external defibrillator (AED), which was used to administer an electrical shock to restart a patient's heart back into rhythm. [REDACTED] placed the AED pads onto Diaz Millan as [REDACTED] administered chest compressions. As the AED evaluated Diaz Millan's vitals, it verbally indicated a shock was not advised and to continue CPR.

RN [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] to record the medical procedures by medical staff administered on Diaz Millan as they were completed. As [REDACTED] recorded the medical procedures, RN's [REDACTED] and Doctor's [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were present. Medical staff placed an oxygen mask onto Diaz Millan's face and provided oxygen to him. Diaz Millan's blood sugar level was checked and indicated his blood sugar was 170.

At approximately 1541 hours, RN [REDACTED] gave Diaz Millan 2 milliliter's of Narcan in his left thigh, which did not change his condition. At approximately 1541 hours, an IV was inserted into Diaz Millan's right arm and he was given additional fluids and medication. Diaz Millan's oxygen saturation levels were found to be 94% after the IV was inserted. At 1543 hours, RN [REDACTED] received a blood pressure reading for Diaz Millan, which read 79/47. At 1543 hours, a second 2 milliliter dose of Narcan was given to Diaz [REDACTED] intravenously (IV). At approximately 1544 hours, Diaz Millan's pupils measured approximately 4MM and were slightly reactive. At approximately 1547 hours, an Oropharyngeal Airway (OPA) was inserted into Diaz Millan's mouth to open his airway. [REDACTED] was unsure who inserted the OPA. At approximately 1548 hours, a 1 milligram dose of Epinephrin was given to Diaz Millan through the IV. At approximately 1549 hours, a third, 2 milliliter dose of Narcan was given via the IV. At approximately 1551 hours, a second 1 milliliter dose of epinephrin was given to Diaz Millan via the IV. [REDACTED] could not tell me who administered the epinephrin.

At approximately 1551 hours, American Medical Response (AMR) and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department (RCFD) arrived at [REDACTED]. AMR paramedics stated Diaz Millan had an active pulse and chest compressions were continued. CPR was performed for approximately 23 minutes before WVDC medical staff relinquished care to [REDACTED] and RCFD. [REDACTED] and RCFD loaded Diaz Millan onto a soft gurney and escorted him down the stairs.

[REDACTED] could not provide any additional information and I concluded my interview.

The interview was recorded with a digital recorder and I placed a copy of the recording into the case file. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement.

Prior to the interview, I explained to [REDACTED] I was conducting a criminal investigation and I asked her if she would provide a voluntary statement. I told [REDACTED] she had a right to have representation present during her statement and she could not be disciplined for not providing a statement. [REDACTED] understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement.

[REDACTED] was employed by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department as an SCS for [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] normal assigned shift was AM-1, Tuesday through Friday, from 0730 hours to 1930 hours. [REDACTED] was assigned to the control booth in [REDACTED] at WVDC for approximately [REDACTED] was normally worked with [REDACTED] Housing Deputies Enrique Ramirez and Samuel Mora.

[REDACTED] was divided into six individual segments labeled "A" through "F." [REDACTED] was an entry segment into the housing unit and contained an Administrative Housing Segment. [REDACTED] was the outside recreational yard and did not house inmates. Segments A, C, D, E, and F contained 16 individual cells capable of housing two inmates each. Cells one through eight were located on the bottom tier and Cells nine through 16 were located on the second floor of the segment, or top tier. Each intercom system allowed inmates to communicate with the [REDACTED] if needed. According to [REDACTED] routinely pressed the intercom without a legitimate reason and constantly initiated conversation with [REDACTED]. The intercom system recorded all communications between the control booth and the inmates.

[REDACTED] monitored inmate movements within the unit and documented housing changes on an internal log. If a housing change was authorized by [REDACTED] was advised and would notify Ramirez or Mora. [REDACTED] controlled the operation of the housing unit doors from the control booth, to allow inmates out of their cells during required tier time. Ramirez and Mora were equipped with keys and were able to manually open all doors within the unit.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 0730 hours, [REDACTED] started her shift in [REDACTED] with Ramirez and Mora. At approximately 1230 hours, [REDACTED] told Puskas an inmate, later identified as Ceaser Wilkinson, needed to be re-housed from [REDACTED]. Wilkinson was previously classified as a house alone (HA) inmate and was cleared to be housed with another inmate. [REDACTED] had no prior knowledge or dealings with Wilkinson. After [REDACTED] spoke with [REDACTED] received a call from an unknown classification deputy. At approximately 1300 hours, Deputy McGil Castillo, who was assigned to [REDACTED], arrived at [REDACTED]. Castillo asked [REDACTED] if she needed any assistance in the unit. It was common for deputies to arrive from other units and make themselves available to assist in anyway possible. [REDACTED] asked Castillo to move Wilkinson from [REDACTED]. Castillo agreed and walked to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] watched as Castillo handcuffed Wilkinson through the tray door of the cell and escorted him out from [REDACTED]. Castillo escorted Wilkinson to [REDACTED] and placed him into [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not listen to any intercom communication of the segments as Castillo moved Wilkinson. [REDACTED] did not observe Wilkinson resist Castillo in any way.

As Castillo placed Wilkinson into [REDACTED] normally listened over the intercom as inmates were moved to different cells to ensure the escorting deputies did not experience any problems with the inmates. However, [REDACTED] was unsure if she listened to the intercom as Wilkinson was placed into [REDACTED]. After Castillo placed Wilkinson into [REDACTED] he left [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] assumed Castillo did not encounter any problems with Wilkinson.

At approximately 1330, after Wilkinson was placed in [REDACTED] Deputy Eliasib Sanchez and an unknown deputy, who were assigned as [REDACTED] entered the unit with an unknown [REDACTED] clinician. Sanchez walked to the control booth and asked [REDACTED] if inmates in [REDACTED] were out of their cells. Sanchez explained a [REDACTED] clinician desired to be escorted into [REDACTED] to speak to several inmates. [REDACTED] allowed the deputies escort the [REDACTED] clinician into [REDACTED]. As the deputies were inside [REDACTED] saw the clinician speaking to an inmate at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not activate the intercom or listen to the conversation at [REDACTED]. After the deputies and the clinician left [REDACTED] [REDACTED] did not recall any additional contacts with [REDACTED] by deputies or [REDACTED] health staff.

[REDACTED] did not recall any additional contacts to or from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not receive any intercom communication by Wilkinson or Diaz Millan. [REDACTED] affirmed that at no time did she receive any communication from [REDACTED] regarding any problems between Wilkinson and Diaz Millan. [REDACTED] could not remember any attempts on the intercom by Wilkinson or Diaz Millan to be moved from [REDACTED] for any reason. According to [REDACTED] Wilkinson and Diaz Millan made no attempt to communicate with her from the intercom.

received multiple false emergencies from inmates housed in [REDACTED] and was not immediately alarmed. [REDACTED] asked the unknown inmate who was fighting, but the inmate was unable to tell [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] looked at each cell in [REDACTED] but was unable to see any apparent disturbance. [REDACTED] believed the inmate housed in [REDACTED] was out on tier but remained inside the cell.

After [REDACTED] was unable to locate a disturbance, the inmate in [REDACTED] utilized the intercom a second time and told [REDACTED] the fight was in [REDACTED] was on the second tier of the segment and [REDACTED] was located on the first tier. [REDACTED] activated the intercom in [REDACTED] said something, but did not receive a response. [REDACTED] did not remember what she said to [REDACTED] but claimed she did not hear any noises or indications of the reported fight in the cell. During [REDACTED] communication with [REDACTED] Ramirez and Mora were inside the control booth. [REDACTED] reported the alleged fight in [REDACTED] to Ramirez and asked Ramirez to check on Wilkinson and Diaz Millan. As Ramirez obtained latex gloves, [REDACTED] ensured the inmate from [REDACTED] remained in their cell and closed the cell door. Ramirez left the control booth, walked toward [REDACTED] and entered. Approximately one minute after Ramirez left the control booth, Mora exited and followed Ramirez into [REDACTED]

As Ramirez approached [REDACTED] he stopped at the door and appeared to request an inmate, later identified as Ceaser Wilkinson to place his hands out to be handcuffed. [REDACTED] was unable to recall when she activated the intercom in [REDACTED]. Once [REDACTED] activated the intercom, she heard Ramirez say, "Come to the door." After Ramirez told Wilkinson to come to the door, Ramirez handcuffed Wilkinson through the open tray slot in the door. After Wilkinson was handcuffed, Ramirez waved his hand and signaled to [REDACTED] to open the door to [REDACTED]. Approximately one minute passed after Ramirez arrived at [REDACTED] until Ramirez signaled to [REDACTED] to open the cell door.

According to [REDACTED] as she opened the door to [REDACTED] several inmates in adjacent segments were out of their cells on tier. Out of an abundance of caution, [REDACTED] wanted all unsecured inmates in [REDACTED] to be secured in their cell. [REDACTED] ordered the remaining inmates housed in [REDACTED], who were out on tier time, to "Lockdown", until she knew more details about what occurred in [REDACTED]

While securing the additional inmates in Unit 1, [REDACTED] was unable to pay attention to anything Wilkinson or Ramirez said next to [REDACTED]

As Mora approached Ramirez and Wilkinson, Ramirez requested an ammonia pack from [REDACTED] over the police radio. After [REDACTED] heard Ramirez's request, she utilized the intercom system and asked Sanchez, who was in [REDACTED] for an ammonia pack. While [REDACTED] attempted to obtain an ammonia pack from Sanchez, she turned away from [REDACTED]. When [REDACTED] focus returned to [REDACTED] Wilkinson was seated on a bench on the lower floor of [REDACTED]

According to [REDACTED] Ramirez pulled an inmate, later identified as Jorge Diaz Millan, out of [REDACTED] Diaz Millan lay on the floor, wore a white shirt, and was not moving. Ramirez pulled Diaz Millan onto the walkway in front of [REDACTED] and immediately started chest compressions. After Ramirez started chest compressions, he broadcasted a "Possible code blue" over the police radio. A code blue was a medical emergency on the facility, which required all available medical staff to respond. In addition to medical staff, deputies assigned to the facility responded to assist if needed. During a code blue, [REDACTED] duties were to ensure all necessary doors to the unit were opened as required. [REDACTED] monitored and relayed relevant information over the police radio and documented the medical emergency from the control booth.

Approximately one minute after Ramirez broadcasted the possible code blue, multiple medical staff ran to [REDACTED] ensured the entry routes to [REDACTED] were opened and clear of obstructions. [REDACTED] observed multiple medical staff and deputies surround Diaz Millan, but [REDACTED] was unable to see any specific medical aid rendered to him.

As medical staff continued life saving measures to Diaz Millan, the control panels in the unit's control booth stopped operating. Once the control panel stopped operating, [REDACTED] lost the ability to open any doors within [REDACTED] immediately contacted the SCS assigned to Master Control and sought a solution for the inoperative control panels. According to [REDACTED] multiple medical staff members were rendering aid to Diaz Millan and the loss of control to open doors to the unit did not delay or effect the life-saving efforts attempted on Diaz Millan. As [REDACTED] attempted to fix the inoperative control panels, she told Sergeant Rafael Ixco, she no longer controlled the unit doors from the control booth. Ixco advised all personnel to hold the needed doors open as the control panel was fixed.

[REDACTED] was advised to restart the control panels and computers, which resolved the inoperative control panels. As the control panels restarted, multiple American Medical Response (AMR) personnel arrived at [REDACTED]

Sanchez was assigned as a roving [REDACTED] deputy for [REDACTED]. Sanchez helped with other segments within [REDACTED] if needed. The majority of inmates housed in [REDACTED] were classified as [REDACTED]. a [REDACTED] consisted of [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] Some of these inmates were [REDACTED] house alone inmates, which meant they had to be in a cell by themselves. Segment A through F consisted of eight cells on the lower tier and eight cells on the upper tier. A stairway ran up to the top tier and was positioned in the middle of the segment. [REDACTED] had medical staff assigned to the unit 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

On Wednesday October 6, 2021, at approximately 0700 hours, Sanchez was assigned to work [REDACTED]. Among Sanchez' duties, he oversaw groups [REDACTED]. Sanchez described groups as being a group activity within the housing segment that inmates could participate in if they chose to do so. Sanchez and the clinicians would routinely ask the inmates if they wanted to come out for group. If inmates wanted to participate in group, Sanchez handcuffed, and leg shackled each inmate and separately sat them at a table in [REDACTED]. Sanchez had three inmates who wanted to come out for group. [REDACTED] was working with Sanchez and would run the group activity. During this time, Sanchez realized he received a new inmate who he had not seen before in [REDACTED]. Sanchez stated the inmate was Jorge Diaz Millan. Sanchez walked up to Diaz Millan, while he was inside of [REDACTED] and saw Diaz Millan was completely naked. Sanchez asked Diaz Millan if everything was okay and if he was doing good. Diaz Millan did not respond to Sanchez.

█ asked Diaz Millan if he wanted to come out of the cell, but he did not respond. █ was not the normal clinician assigned to █. After group ended, Sanchez conducted observation checks of every cell in █. Sanchez checked █. Deputies check to make sure the inmates have their cell clean █. Sanchez assisted the nurses by removing the inmate from the cell in handcuffs.

At approximately 1201 hours, Diaz Millan was housed with Ceasar Wilkinson. Sanchez did not know where Wilkinson was housed prior to moving into █. At about 1230 hours, Sanchez noticed Wilkinson was moved into █ with Diaz Millan, after █ Clinician █ went to █ and spoke with Diaz Millan.

Clinician █ contacted Diaz Millan who was fully clothed. Sanchez stepped to the side of █ to give Diaz Millan his privacy as he spoke with Clinician █. After the conversation ended, Clinician █ told Sanchez Diaz Millan seemed fine and was not sure why he was housed in █. Clinician █ did not speak to Wilkinson during the cell visit.

At approximately 1530 hours, while Sanchez was working in █ Sheriff Custody Specialist (SCS) █ used the segment intercom to ask Sanchez if he had an ammonia packet. Sanchez told █ he did not have an ammonia packet and told her he would go to the nurse's station to see if there was any there. █ told Sanchez something was going on in █ and that is why she needed the ammonia packet. Sanchez went to █ and went inside of the nurse station. Sanchez retrieved an ammonia packet from a cabinet inside of the nurse's station. Sanchez returned to the housing segments when heard over his police radio, Deputy Ramirez broadcast and possible "Code Blue" in █. Code blue is a saying used in WVDC for a medical emergency.

Sanchez entered Segment E and observed Ramirez and Registered Nurse █ on the top tier. Diaz Millan was on the ground, laying supine. Ramirez began to give Diaz Millan chest compressions. Deputy Mora was also inside of Segment E. █ used her police radio to request for additional medical staff. Sanchez observed Wilkinson on the bottom tier, handcuffed to the rear and leg shackled to the table. Sanchez walked up the stairs to the top tier and assisted Mora and Ramirez in moving Diaz Millan out of █, so medical staff had more room to provide medical attention.

Ramirez asked Sanchez to remove Wilkinson from █. Sanchez escorted Wilkinson into █. Once in █, Sanchez told Wilkinson to sit in a chair.

On Thursday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 2329 hours, Detective Gerad Laing and I conducted an interview with Deputy Samuel Miguel Mora in the executive dining room of the West Valley Detention Center (WVDC) located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital recorder and later placed a copy of the recording into evidence. I put the interview in chronological order for the ease of the reader. For a verbatim account please refer to audio recordings of the interview. The following is a summary of the interview.

Prior to the interview, I explained to Mora that we desired to obtain a voluntary statement from him, and no disciplinary action would be incurred if he declined to provide a statement. Mora stated he understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement.

Mora was a deputy sheriff, hired by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department in [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Mora worked at WVDC since [REDACTED] Mora's normally scheduled shift was Wednesday through Friday, from 0800 to 2000 hours, and every other Tuesday.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at 0800 hours, Mora was assigned as housing deputy in [REDACTED] Mora was assigned to work with Deputy Enrique Ramirez and Sheriff's Custody Specialist [REDACTED] Mora began working [REDACTED] approximately one month ago.

Mora provided the following description for [REDACTED] contained [REDACTED] inmates. [REDACTED] inmates are required to be handcuffed to the rear and leg-shackled when they are moved by staff. [REDACTED] inmates are often housed alone. Inmates are housed in [REDACTED] housed inmates who [REDACTED] Deputies were required to conduct additional observation logs, every 15 minutes. In addition to the frequent observation logs, a deputy was assigned to remain at [REDACTED] at all times. According to Mora, on Wednesday, October 6, 2021, [REDACTED] was not assigned a deputy, which caused Ramirez and Mora to maintain the [REDACTED] observation logs.

Inmates housed in Segment's [REDACTED], were classified as [REDACTED] inmates. Mora and Ramirez performed safety observation logs once every hour for Segment's [REDACTED]. During a safety observation log, Mora and Ramirez enter every segment and check each cell to ensure the inmates are alive and well. Mora and Ramirez alternated segments when conducting hourly safety observation logs.

██████████ contained 16 cells, each cell housing one or two inmates. ██████████ consisted of two tiers, two showers, and a dayroom with tables and chairs. Mora constantly saw new inmates at the beginning of his work week. Mora routinely attempted to learn about each new inmate, once they were assigned to the ██████████

I asked Mora to describe his interactions with inmates Cesar Wilkinson and Jorge Diaz-Millan. Mora never had any interactions with Wilkinson but recalled a contact with Diaz-Millan while feeding inmates their lunches.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1130 hours, Mora fed Diaz-Millan his lunch inside ██████████ prior to Diaz-Millan being housed with Wilkinson. Mora approached cell ██████████ to feed Diaz-Millan. Diaz-Millan was alone in the cell. Diaz-Millan was naked inside the cell waiting to be fed. Mora provided Diaz-Millan a meal and told him he needed to be dressed the next time he was fed. Mora did not notice any injuries on Diaz-Millan. Mora continued serving other inmates. According to Mora, this was his one and only interaction with Diaz-Millan.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1200 hours, Mora was in ██████████ conducting ██████████ safety checks when ██████████ received a call from Classification Deputy Edward Mosqueda. Mosqueda requested inmate Cesar Wilkinson be moved from ██████████, cell ██████████. ██████████ told Mora that Mosqueda called requesting Wilkinson's move. According to Mora, Wilkinson was one of three inmates requiring new housing assignments. ██████████ Deputy McGill Castello moved Wilkinson to ██████████ and housed him with Jorge Diaz-Millan.

According to Mora, Castello was helping ██████████ since they were short staffed. Mora conducted hourly safety logs in ██████████ and did not assist in moving Wilkinson into ██████████. Mora did not discuss Wilkinson's move with Castello. Mora was not made aware of any problems or issues related to Wilkinson's move. Mora did not know why Wilkinson was housed with Diaz-Millan. According to Mora, inmate housing assignments were coordinated through mental health clinicians and the classification division. Mora was not aware of any restrictions housing Wilkinson and Diaz-Millan together.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, between 1300 and 1400 hours, Mora conducted a safety observation log and saw both Diaz-Millan and Wilkinson inside ██████████. Mora could not recall Wilkinson's and Diaz-Millan's exact positions but remembered one inmate stood in center of the cell and one sat on edge of the bottom bunk. Both inmates wore their jail-issued clothing. Mora did not observe any injuries on Diaz-Millan or Wilkinson. Neither inmate mentioned any problems or issues to Mora. Mora believed Ramirez, at some point, conducted safety observation checks on ██████████

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1500 hours, Mora and Ramirez conducted safety observation logs. According to Mora, Ramirez spoke to Diaz-Millan or Wilkinson during Ramirez's observation logs. Mora did not hear Ramirez' conversation with Diaz-Millan or Wilkinson. Mora and Ramirez did not discuss Diaz-Millan or Wilkinson. Mora did not have any of knowledge of a conflict between Diaz-Millan and Wilkinson.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1535 hours, Ramirez, and Mora were inside the Unit 1 control booth working on their respective computer monitors. Two unknown inmates in [REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED], via the intercom, and reported loud noises from the second floor. Mora heard an unknown inmate on the intercom say someone on the second floor was asking for help. [REDACTED] received an intercom call from [REDACTED], but the cell was quiet when she answered the call.

[REDACTED] Ramirez and Mora attempt to determine which [REDACTED] cell had a problem. According to Mora, [REDACTED] turned on the intercoms of cells within [REDACTED] to identify which inmate needed assistance. Mora did not know which intercoms [REDACTED] turned on. An unknown inmate contacted [REDACTED] via the intercom and reported [REDACTED] required help. Approximately one or two minutes after being alerted of a disturbance in [REDACTED] Ramirez stood from his chair and entered [REDACTED] and contacted [REDACTED]. Mora donned gloves and obtained his radio and responded to assist Ramirez.

As Ramirez stood at [REDACTED], he used his facility radio and broadcasted a "Code Blue" and requested assistance from medical staff. Mora entered [REDACTED]. Mora did not hear any disturbance as he walked into the segment. Mora walked up the staircase and observed the door to [REDACTED] open. Ramirez stood outside [REDACTED]. Wilkinson stepped out of the cell and stood to the right of the cell. Wilkinson wore a white shirt, [REDACTED] pants, and sandals. Mora believed Wilkinson's pants were possibly wet, but he was not sure. Wilkinson was handcuffed to the rear. Mora saw a subject, later identified as Diaz-Millan, face down on the floor. The crown portion of Diaz-Millan's head was near the cell door entrance. Mora did not look inside the cell. Mora immediately escorted Wilkinson to the first-floor dayroom and asked him to sit down at a table. According to Mora, Wilkinson said he hoped Diaz-Millan would be okay. Mora did not question Wilkinson. Mora did not observe any injuries on Wilkinson.

Mora returned upstairs to assist Ramirez. Registered Nurse (RN) [REDACTED] arrived to treat Diaz-Millan. Ramirez already pulled Diaz-Millan out of the cell and positioned him faceup. Diaz-Millan's head faced the open cell, and his feet faced the staircase. Ramirez requested Mora look for an ammonia packet and a cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) mask to provide Diaz-Millan oxygen. Mora went into the control booth to look for the ammonia packet but did not find any.

Deputy Elisha Sanchez arrived at [REDACTED] to assist. [REDACTED] instructed Sanchez to obtain ammonia packets from the [REDACTED] nursing station. Mora returned to [REDACTED] to assist Ramirez.

Mora saw Diaz-Millan wore only pants. Diaz-Millan was unconscious and unresponsive. Mora observed Ramirez performing chest compressions on Diaz-Millan. [REDACTED] checked Diaz-Millan's pulse and oxygen levels using an oximeter on his left index finger. Additional nurses arrived to treat Diaz-Millan. Mora documented medical personnel as they arrived to treat Diaz-Millan. Mora did not know the nurses by name or what role each nurse performed, but recalled the nurses performing the following medical interventions (IV) line on Diaz-Millan: A nurse used ammonia inhalant ampules on Diaz-Millan, but ammonia was not effective. Nurses took over the chest compressions performed by Ramirez on Diaz-Millan.

As CPR was performed on Diaz-Millan, several nurses were near Diaz-Millan's head and provided oxygen using a bag value mask. Several nurses alternated performing chest compressions on Diaz-Millan. A nurse established an intravenous line on Diaz-Millan's right arm and connected the line to saline. A nurse administered unknown medication through the IV. An unknown nurse connected Diaz-Millan to an automated external defibrillator (AED). The AED analyzed Diaz-Millan several times. The machine did not shock Diaz-Millan and advised to continue CPR. Mora did not observe any injuries on Diaz-Millan. Mora overheard an unknown nurse say Diaz-Millan had a laceration on his nose. Mora explained facility nurses primarily cared for Diaz-Millan, and he was not directly involved with Diaz-Millan's care.

At approximately 1551 hours, American Medical Response (AMR) personnel arrived on scene. At approximately 1553 hours, Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department arrived on scene. Paramedics obtained Diaz-Millan's medical history and connected him to an unknown machine. Medical staff continued cardiopulmonary resuscitation on Diaz-Millan. Paramedics placed Diaz-Millan on a portable stretcher and took him downstairs. Diaz-Millan was placed on a gurney and taken out of Unit 1.

Mora briefly looked inside [REDACTED]. Mora described the cell being messy with water on the floor. Mora did not enter or remove anything from the cell. Mora went to the first floor and briefed Sergeant Nickalaus Seybert. Sanchez escorted Wilkinson out of the dayroom and into the attorney room in [REDACTED]. Mora never observed any injury to Wilkinson. Mora did not photograph or interview any inmate. A copy of Mora's audio recording was put into evidence.

Mora did not provide further information, and I concluded the interview.

On Thursday, October 7, 2021, at about 1656 hours, I interviewed San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department Sergeant Rafael Ixco in an administrative office of West Valley Detention Center (WVDC), located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, in Rancho Cucamonga. The interview was recorded on my department-issued audio recorder and later placed into evidence. The following was a summary of my interview with Ixco.

Prior to the interview, I explained to Ixco I desired to conduct a voluntary interview with him, and no discipline could be brought if he declined to provide a voluntary statement. Ixco agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the in-custody death of inmate Jorge Diaz Milan.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Ixco was assigned as the supervisor for Housing Units 1 through 8 at the WVDC from 0530 to 1730 hours. Ixco's call sign was "Sam 2" (S2). At about 1500 hours, Ixco was informed by Sergeant Nickalaus Seyvert of a "Code Blue" in [REDACTED]. Ixco was not immediately available because he was with the maintenance department tending to an important but unrelated administrative task. Seyvert told Ixco he would respond to [REDACTED] until Ixco was available. Once Ixco finished his administrative task, he responded to [REDACTED].

When Ixco entered [REDACTED], Ixco observed an inmate, later identified as Ceasar Wilkinson, handcuffed, leg shackled and seated on a steel seat in [REDACTED]. An unknown deputy stood next to Wilkinson. Ixco looked into the [REDACTED] Sally Port and observed Seyvert standing in the entrance of [REDACTED]. Ixco stood in the [REDACTED] Sally Port and did not enter [REDACTED]. While looking through the windows of [REDACTED] Ixco observed numerous medical staff on the second tier who performed medical aid on an inmate, later identified as Jorge Diaz Millan. Ixco observed the [REDACTED] housing deputy, Deputy Enrique Ramirez, scribe the crime scene log.

Ixco walked back to [REDACTED] and informed Ramirez he needed to ensure the collection of names and employee numbers of personnel who entered [REDACTED]. While Ixco was inside [REDACTED] paramedics from American Medical Response (AMR) arrived on scene. As AMR personnel arrived, Ixco escorted Wilkinson to the second tier of [REDACTED] and placed him in a secured cell, by himself.

Once Ixco placed Wilkinson into the cell, Ixco entered the [REDACTED] control booth and gathered the identifying information of Diaz Millan and Wilkinson from the [REDACTED] staff. Ixco left [REDACTED] and responded to Male Intake in order to get information of the mental health staff who housed Wilkinson and Diaz Millan together in [REDACTED], earlier in the day. Ixco retrieved the mental health clinician's information and provided the clinician's name to Sergeant Chad Gomez.

Prior to the interview, I explained to Seyvert I desired to conduct a voluntary interview with him, and no discipline could be brought if he declined to provide a voluntary statement. Seyvert agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the in-custody death of inmate Jorge Diaz Milan.

Seyvert was employed by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for [REDACTED] and assigned to WVDC as a sergeant since [REDACTED]. On Wednesday, October 7, 2021, Seyvert was assigned as the supervisor for the north side of WVDC, which included Units 9 through 16, from 0600 to 1800 hours. Seyvert's call sign was "Sam 3" (S3).

At about 1500 hours, Seyvert was inside the Security Administrative office at WVDC, when he heard "Code Blue in [REDACTED]" broadcasted over the police radio. Seyvert was aware that Sergeant Rafael Ixco was in charge of [REDACTED] but was busy with an administrative task. Seyvert responded from Security Administration to [REDACTED]. When Seyvert entered [REDACTED] he observed approximately 10 to 15 WVDC medical staff and two deputies inside [REDACTED]. Seyvert observed medical staff and deputies render medical aid to an inmate, later identified as Jorge Diaz Millan, outside of [REDACTED]. Seyvert instructed Deputy Mark Jebbia to take photographs and an unknown deputy, later determined to be Deputy Enrique Ramirez to begin a crime scene log. Seyvert observed Diaz Millan's cellmate, Ceasar Wilkinson, inside [REDACTED]. Seyvert instructed an unknown deputy sheriff to escort Wilkinson out of [REDACTED] and into [REDACTED].

While Seyvert was inside [REDACTED], he observed medical staff perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Diaz and observed an automated external defibrillator attached to his chest. Seyvert walked to the second tier and spoke to the nurse supervisor, later identified as RN [REDACTED]. Seyvert asked [REDACTED] if she had enough medical staff on scene, and [REDACTED] told him there were sufficient medical staff. Due to Seyvert's vantage point and the amount of medical personnel on the second tier, he was unable to see any injuries on Diaz Millan.

Seyvert approached Ramirez and informed him no additional personnel were needed. Seyvert remained at the entrance of [REDACTED] and provided scene security. After an unknown amount of time, paramedics from American Medical Response (AMR) and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department (RCFD) arrived on scene. As AMR and RCFD personnel entered the segment, Seyvert remained at the entrance of [REDACTED], until AMR transported Diaz Millan out of the segment on a gurney.

Once Diaz Millan was escorted out of [REDACTED] by AMR, Seyvert instructed [REDACTED] staff to secure [REDACTED] and leave the door to [REDACTED] open, until Homicide investigators arrived on scene. As inmates were still housed in [REDACTED] Seyvert instructed the [REDACTED] deputies to leave the inmates inside their cell and no personnel were allowed inside the segment, unless they conducted their mandated hourly observation logs.

After [REDACTED] was secured, Seyvert returned to Security Administration. Lieutenant Audomero Moreno instructed Seyvert to notify the on-call Homicide Detail about the incident. Seyvert immediately contacted Sergeant Jonathan Woods and advised him of the incident.

During the week of Monday, September 27, 2021, Seyvert was aware of an incident occurred with Wilkinson. On an unknown date, Wilkinson ran out of Unit 12, and ran down the Unit 11/12 corridor. As Wilkinson ran down the hallway, he was apprehended by deputies. A proper use of force report was created, and the incident was documented. Seyvert was unaware of any additional incidents with Diaz Millan or Wilkinson.

An was unable to provide additional information, and I concluded my interview with him.

I recorded the interview with my department issued digital recorder and later placed a copy of the recording into evidence. The following is a summary of the interview.

Prior to the interview, I explained to Jebbia, I desired to obtain a voluntary statement from him, and no discipline could come to him if he declined to provide a statement. Jebbia stated he understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement.

Jebbia was a Deputy Sheriff, hired by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department in [REDACTED]. Jebbia worked at WVDC since [REDACTED]. Jebbia's normally scheduled shift was Wednesday through Friday, from 0600 to 1800 hours, and every other Tuesday.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Jebbia was assigned the "Tom 1" position. This position involved coordinating inmate hospital transports, employee roster changes, and assist with WVDC Bridge functions. At approximately 1530 hours, Jebbia was working Master Control while Sheriff's Custody Specialist [REDACTED] took her scheduled break. Jebbia heard a radio request from [REDACTED] deputies requesting a nurse to respond to the unit. During the initial request, a deputy requested the nurse bring an ammonia packet. An unknown then radioed a possible code blue medical emergency. Deputy Eduardo Perez relieved Jebbia approximately five minutes after the radio call. Jebbia escorted Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department from Intake to [REDACTED].

Jebbia arrived at [REDACTED] and Captain John Walker, an unknown lieutenant, deputies, and nursing staff already present. Jebbia believed there were enough personnel present, and he did not enter the segment.

Jebbia was informed an inmate possibly assaulted his cell mate. Jebbia did not recall who told him about the assault. Jebbia and Deputy Ricky Bentacu contacted inmate Cesar Wilkinson in the attorney room, [REDACTED]. Jebbia activated his digital audio recorder prior to the contact.

Jebbia and Bentacu removed Wilkinson from the attorney room. Wilkinson wore a white shirt and [REDACTED] pants. Jebbia noticed the bottom of Wilkinson's pants were wet. Wilkinson was handcuffed to the rear and leg shackled.

Jebbia noticed a red elevated bump on Wilkinson's forehead. Jebbia recalled a previous contact with Wilkinson. [REDACTED] Wilkinson made statements which Jebbia did not understand and had difficulty communicating clearly. Wilkinson told Jebbia his cell mate threatened to assault or drop kick him. Jebbia believed Wilkinson was in

Ventre and Diaz informed Jebbia Wilkinson got into a fight with a cell mate while housed in [REDACTED] Wilkinson was placed in the [REDACTED] while deputies determined where to house him. Wilkinson attempted to escaped [REDACTED] while waiting in [REDACTED]

Ventre prepared an attempted escape criminal report. Jebbia assisted and interviewed Wilkinson. During the interview, Wilkinson told Jebbia he heard voices and ran out of the unit. Bentacu was a Deputy Sheriff, employed by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for [REDACTED] Bentacu has worked at WVDC for [REDACTED] years. Bentacu's normally scheduled shift was Wednesday through Friday from 0600 to 1800 hours, and every other Tuesday.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Bentacu was assigned as the Core Rover. At approximately 1530 hours, Bentacu was the intake area when he heard a code blue in [REDACTED] on his handheld police radio. Bentacu and Deputy Mark Jebbia responded to [REDACTED].

Upon their arrival, Bentacu observed Deputies Enrique Ramirez, Samuel Mora, and numerous medical staff around an inmate, later identified as Jorge Diaz-Millan. Diaz-Millan was supine on the second-floor tier, left of the staircase. Bentacu saw medical personnel perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Diaz-Millan. As Bentacu arrived Registered Nurse (RN) [REDACTED] performed chest compressions on Diaz-Millan.

Bentacu immediately called American Medical Response's (AMR) directly and requested a "Code 3" response from AMR and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department personnel. Bentacu told AMR, medical staff were performing CPR on an inmate. Bentacu explained, it was normal protocol to call AMR directly for immediate response, instead of calling 9-1-1. Bentacu remained on the first floor as he coordinated paramedics' response. Bentacu left the unit and returned with the facility's GoPro camera. Bentacu walked to the second floor and took digital photographs of the scene as medical staff conducted lifesaving measures to Diaz-Millan. After Bentacu completed photographing the scene, he walked down the stairs to the bottom level of [REDACTED].

Paramedics from AMR and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department arrived between five to 10 minutes after Bentacu's call.

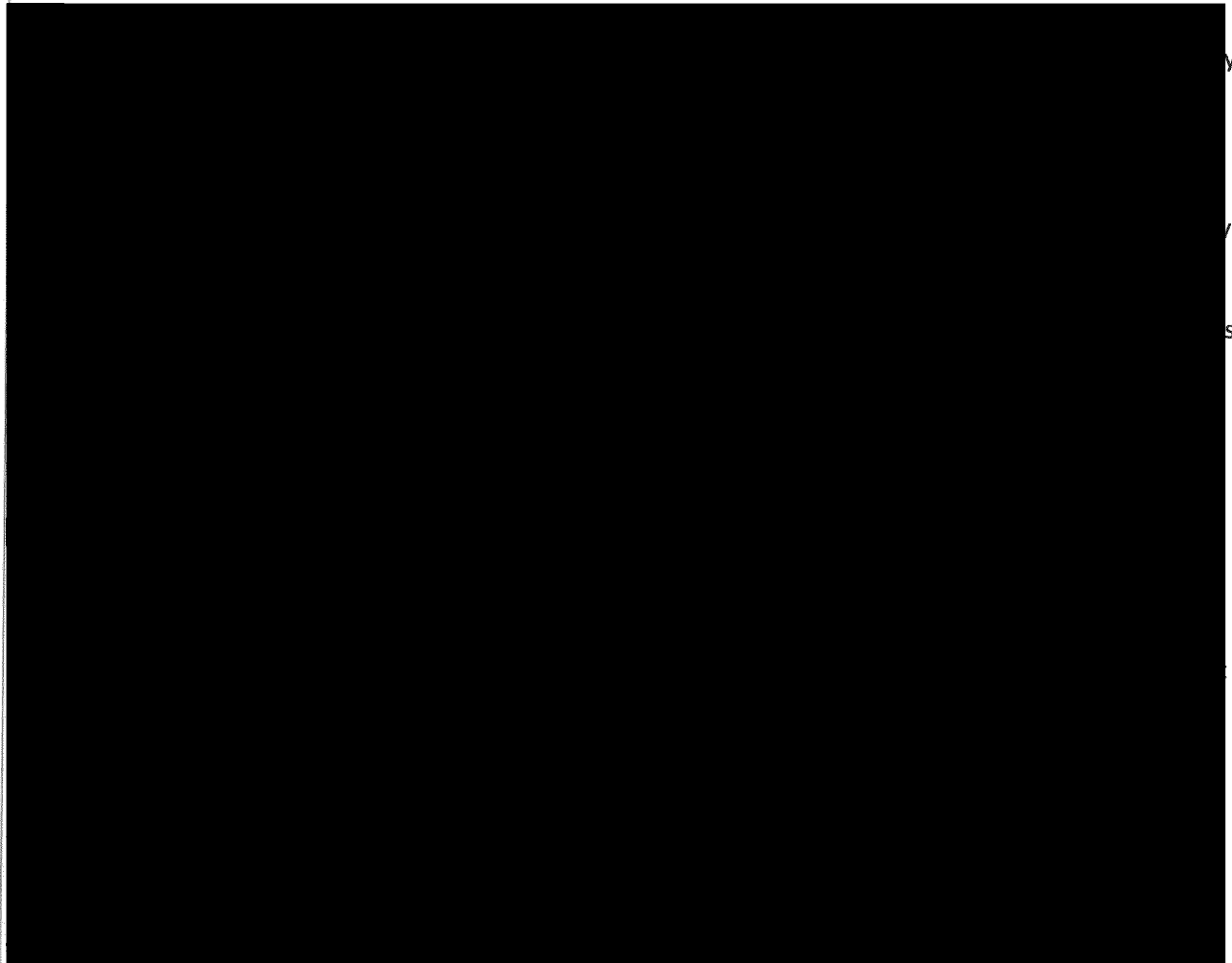

[REDACTED] regular workdays varied from week to week, but she normally worked from 0600 hours to 1830 hours.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1530 hours, while in a private office inside the medical clinic, the assigned Sheriff's Custody Specialist (SCS) announced, "Code blue, [REDACTED]" A code blue indicated a medical emergency within the facility, which required all available medical staff to respond. Designated WVDC medical staff were assigned to specific "Code blue teams," which facilitated efficient medical care efforts during a medical emergency. On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, [REDACTED] was assigned to code blue's "Team 1." [REDACTED] was assigned to obtain the code blue medical equipment bag and respond to the code blue as soon as practicable.

[REDACTED] estimated she arrived at [REDACTED] after approximately one to two minutes after the code blue was broadcasted. Diaz Millan lay supine on the floor, inside [REDACTED] was not breathing, and was lifeless. Diaz Millan wore a white shirt and red, which [REDACTED] requested be removed to place the AED pads onto his chest. As [REDACTED] prepared the AED pads, she observed a large amount of water on the floor of the cell and Diaz Millan's clothing was soaked. To avoid an electrical hazard, [REDACTED] requested Diaz Millan be removed from the cell and placed onto the floor.

Ramirez pulled Diaz Millan by the arms and laid him on his back, outside of [REDACTED] Ramirez removed Diaz Millan's shirt as [REDACTED] placed the AED pads onto Diaz Millan's chest. Prior to the AED's evaluation of Diaz Millan, the AED advised everyone to stop chest compressions and not touch Diaz Millan. During the evaluation, the AED indicated a shock was not advised and to continue chest compressions. Additional medical personnel and deputies ran into [REDACTED] entered the segment and proceeded to the second floor. [REDACTED] noticed medical personnel performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on inmate Jorge Diaz-Millan. [REDACTED] saw RN [REDACTED] Doctor [REDACTED] and Doctor [REDACTED], along with a male deputy, with the Diaz-Millan. [REDACTED] believed [REDACTED] performed chest compression but was not sure.

Diaz-Millan was supine and unresponsive, outside of the cell. Diaz-Millan wore a white shirt and red pants. [REDACTED] noted Diaz-Millan's clothing was soaked with water. An unknown deputy mentioned he located Diaz-Millan face down in his cell. Diaz-Millan had the automated external defibrillator (AED) machine attached to his body. [REDACTED] did not observe any injuries on Diaz-Millan's body.

RN [REDACTED] arrived to assist. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] connected the oxygen tank to the ambu bag valve mask and provided Diaz-Millan rescue breaths. RN [REDACTED] established an intravenous line (IV) on Diaz-Millan's right arm. [REDACTED] obtained a faint blood pressure on Diaz-Millan's left lower leg. The AED machine analyzed Diaz-Millan several times and advised no shock needed and to continue CPR. Diaz-Millan remained unresponsive. RN [REDACTED] and RN [REDACTED] alternated chest compressions. [REDACTED] observed Narcan administered through the

I explained to [REDACTED] I wanted to conduct a voluntary interview with him. [REDACTED] agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the in-custody death of inmate Jorge Diaz-Millan. [REDACTED] worked as a RN at WVDC for approximately [REDACTED] was a Charge Nurse, responsible for coordinating nurses' assignments. [REDACTED] worked the day shift, on October 6, 2021, from 0730 hour to 2000 hours.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1530 hours, [REDACTED] heard a "Code Blue" medical emergency in Housing [REDACTED] on his facility radio. [REDACTED] responded to [REDACTED] to assist with the medical emergency.

When [REDACTED] arrived approximately three minutes after he heard the code blue call, he saw several deputies and medical personnel on the upper tier, performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on inmate Jorge Diaz-Millan. RN [REDACTED] performed chest compressions. Doctor [REDACTED] provided rescue breathing with a bag valve mask. Diaz-Millan was unresponsive on his back, outside of the cell. Diaz-Millan wore underwear and red pants. Diaz-Millan had an intravenous line (IV) established on his right arm.

[REDACTED] checked Diaz-Millan's blood sugar, from his left index finger. Diaz-Millan's blood sugar level was 170 mg/dl. An automated external defibrillator (AED) machine was attached to Diaz-Millan. The AED advised no shock and to continue CPR. [REDACTED] took over chest compressions. [REDACTED] alternated chest compressions with RN [REDACTED] did not notice any injuries on [REDACTED] body while he assisted him. [REDACTED] heard unknown medical staff mention Diaz-Millan had a wound on his nose. [REDACTED] could not see the wound on Diaz-Millan's nose due to the bag valve mask. A nurse administered approximately three rounds of Narcan medication through the IV.

American Medical Response and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department arrived in approximately 25 minutes. Medical staff detected a weak pulse on Diaz-Millan, but he was not breathing. [REDACTED] moved out of the way to allow paramedics to take over medical care for Diaz-Millan. [REDACTED] moved to the first floor to provide room for the paramedics. Paramedics brought [REDACTED] to the first floor using a portable stretcher. Diaz-Millan was placed on the [REDACTED] gurney and taken out of Unit 1. [REDACTED] resumed his normal duties.

[REDACTED] did not have any additional information to provide, and I ended my interview with him.

I explained to [REDACTED] I wanted to conduct a voluntary interview with her. [REDACTED] agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the in-custody death of inmate Jorge Diaz-Millan. [REDACTED] was a doctor for [REDACTED] and worked at WVDC for approximately [REDACTED] years. [REDACTED] worked day shift, from 0600 hours to 1600 hours. [REDACTED] was assigned to work patient care at the WVDC clinic.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1530 hours, [REDACTED] was at the clinic when she heard nurses mention a code blue in [REDACTED] Doctor [REDACTED] Registered Nurse (RN) [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] responded to [REDACTED] carried the emergency supply bag.

Upon arriving at [REDACTED] Segment E, [REDACTED] noticed the patient supine on the second floor. Diaz-Millan's blood sugar level checked normal. According to [REDACTED], Diaz-Millan did not appear pale. Registered nurses [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] alternated performing chest compressions. [REDACTED] placed an oropharyngeal airway device (OPA) on Diaz-Millan and ventilated him using an ambu bag mask.

The AED machine analyzed Diaz-Millan several times. The machine advised no shock needed and to continue CPR. Narcan medication was administered by unknown nurse through an intravenous line (IV) located on Diaz-Millan's right arm. The IV was connected to a saline bag. Medical staff continued CPR and administered a second round of Narcan. Diaz-Millan remained unresponsive. [REDACTED] requested epinephrine medication. Registered nurse [REDACTED] prepared an epinephrine dose and provided it to [REDACTED] administered one milligram of epinephrine through the IV. Diaz-Millan remained unresponsive, medical staff continued CPR. An additional round of Narcan was administered through the IV, Diaz-Millan remained unresponsive. A second dose of epinephrine was

I explained to [REDACTED] I wanted to conduct a voluntary interview with her, and no discipline could be brought if she declined to provide a voluntary statement. [REDACTED] agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the death of inmate Jorge Diaz-Millan.

[REDACTED] was an RN for [REDACTED] and worked at WVDC for [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] worked the day shift on Wednesday, October 6, 2021, from 0730 hours to 2000 hours. [REDACTED] was assigned as the Housing Nurse for [REDACTED].

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1530 hours, [REDACTED] was notified of a "Code Blue," a medical emergency, in Housing [REDACTED] by an employee inside the medical clinic. [REDACTED] responded to [REDACTED] from the medical clinic to assist with the medical emergency.

[REDACTED] responded to Unit 1 and was directed to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] entered [REDACTED] and saw several deputies and medical personnel on the top tier. [REDACTED] was the last facility medical personnel to arrive at [REDACTED]. As [REDACTED] arrived, she saw an unknown person perform chest compressions on the inmate, later identified as Jorge Diaz-Millan. Diaz-Millan was supine on the top tier, just outside of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] asked the Charge Nurse, [REDACTED] what assistance she could provide. [REDACTED] was advised they had enough medical personnel rendering aid to Diaz-Millan.

In anticipation of the arrival of paramedics from American Medical Response (AMR), Flores moved medical equipment on the top tier to make room. [REDACTED] saw the medical staff continued life-saving measures on Diaz-Millan. Flores' view of Diaz-Millan was blocked by multiple personnel, and she was unable to confirm who performed specific medical aid to Diaz-Millan. [REDACTED] removed Naloxone (Narcan) and had it prepared if it was needed. [REDACTED] stood the distance of approximately four feet from where Diaz-Millan was.

After approximately 20 minutes, AMR and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department (RCFD) personnel arrived. AMR and RCFD placed Diaz-Millan on a soft gurney, and he was removed from [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] did not perform any medical treatment on Diaz-Millan, nor did she have any contact with him. [REDACTED] did not have any additional information to provide, and we concluded our interview with her.

At approximately 1541 hours, [REDACTED] was dispatched to the West Valley Detention Center (WVDC), located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga, for an unresponsive patient. At approximately 1550 hours, [REDACTED] arrived at the WVDC intake yard.

[REDACTED] and the crew from [REDACTED] were escorted to [REDACTED] by an unknown deputy. [REDACTED] observed deputies, several medical personnel from WVDC, and personnel from American Medical Response (AMR) on the second tier of [REDACTED] walked upstairs and observed an inmate later identified as Jorge Diaz-Millan, supine on the floor outside of an opened cell door. [REDACTED] saw WVDC medical personnel performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Diaz-Millan.

[REDACTED] was advised by WVDC medical personnel that Diaz-Millan was found in his cell and was unconscious for approximately 30 minutes. [REDACTED] was told the WVDC medical personnel had an Intravenous (IV) line started, administered three rounds of Narcan, and two rounds of epinephrine.

At approximately 1558, [REDACTED] took over chest compressions from an unknown nurse. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] switched positions after two minutes. At approximately 1601 hours, [REDACTED] noticed a return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC). CPR was stopped after they noticed the ROSC. [REDACTED] felt Diaz-Milan had a carotid and radial pulse. [REDACTED] noticed Diaz-Milan had an electronic rhythm of his heart that was captured on the monitor. [REDACTED] advised the other medical personnel Diaz-Milan had ROSC and advised they needed to transport him. [REDACTED] advised they needed to get vitals for Diaz-Milan before they transported him. Diaz-Milan was connected to a 12-lead echocardiogram (EKG), blood pressure cuff, and oxygen sensor. Diaz-Milan was placed on a soft carry bag, carried downstairs, and placed on AMR's gurney. Diaz-Milan was taken to the intake yard and placed into the back of the ambulance.

[REDACTED] and an unknown paramedic from AMR were in the back of the ambulance and were driven by an AMR emergency medical technician (EMT). At approximately 1605 hours, Diaz-Milan was transported to [REDACTED]. At that time, Diaz-Milan was still unconscious but had a pulse. [REDACTED] continued to give breaths to Diaz-Milan with a bag valve mask (BVM) connected to an ambu bag.

[REDACTED] observed deputies, several medical personnel from WVDC, and personnel from American Medical Response (AMR) on the landing of the second tier of Segment E. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] assisted with CPR as [REDACTED] obtained information from WVDC medical staff. [REDACTED] was the scribe and documented significant events and times for their medical report.

As [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] performed CPR, [REDACTED] obtained information from WVDC medical personnel. At approximately 1605 hours, Diaz-Milan was placed into the ambulance and transported to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] rode in the back of the ambulance with the paramedic from AMR.
