On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at about 1525 hours, deputies from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, West Valley Detention Center, responded to reference a possible fight. Deputies Enrique Ramirez and Deputy Samuel Mora responded to and located inmate, Jorge Diaz Millan inside of unresponsive. As Ramirez approached he observed Diaz Millan's cellmate, Ceasar Wilkinson inside of inside of the right of Diaz Millan and patting at his face. Ramirez handcuffed Wilkinson and removed him from the cell. Mora escorted Wilkinson down the stairs into the day room of
At about 1530 hours, Deputy Enrique Ramirez used his Sheriff's radio to broadcast a "Code Blue." A code blue is known throughout the facility as a medical emergency where someone is unconscious or not breathing. Ramirez checked for a pulse on Diaz Millan and did not feel one. Ramirez noticed Diaz Millan lay in a pool of water on the floor and was face down in the cell. Ramirez pulled Diaz Millan out of the cell and turned him over to lay supine. Ramirez immediately began to give cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to Diaz Millan and waited for medical staff to respond.
West Valley Detention Center Medical Staff began to arrive on scene shortly after the Code Blue was called out. The first medical staff to arrive on scene was Registered Nurse stated she was the assigned Unit 1 nurse and was inside of the infirmary doing charting when she heard the code blue broadcasted over the Sheriff's radio. grabbed her medical supply bag and quickly made her way to Unit 1. entered and observed Ramirez performing CPR on Diaz Millan. Ramirez, and Mora moved Diaz Millan further out of the cell to provide medical staff more room to work on Diaz Millan. advised Deputies to continue CPR as she grabbed an ammonia packet and placed it into Diaz Millan's nose to alert him. Diaz Millan showed no reaction and Deputies continued CPR. placed a blood pressure cuff and an oxygen meter, neither device had a reading. Other medical staff arrived and continued to perform life saving measures on Diaz Millan.
Wilkinson was escorted from Deputy Eliasib Sanchez was assigned to watch Wilkinson. While Wilkinson was seated in a chair in the he asked Sanchez if Diaz Millan was going to be okay. Sergeant Ixco arrived and moved Wilkinson out and secured him into an attorney interview room, which was located upstairs in

Wilkinson was seated on the lower bunk bed and faced the cell door. Diaz Millan grabbed a pack of peanut butter and told Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter, as he slammed it down. Wilkinson refused to eat the peanut butter and Diaz Millan got angry at Wilkinson. Diaz Millan told Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter, or Diaz Millan would kill him. Wilkinson stated Diaz Millan began to count down, "3-2-1" and kicked Wilkinson in the face just above his right eye as he was seated on the bed. Wilkinson was stunned and looked up as Diaz Millan began to kick Wilkinson again. Diaz Millan slipped on the wet floor and Wilkinson jumped up and took Diaz Millan down to the ground inside of the cell. Wilkinson wrapped his left arm around Diaz Millan's neck and grabbed his left arm with his right hand. Wilkinson began to choke Diaz Millan. Wilkinson was afraid to let go because he believed Diaz Millan would kill him.

Wilkinson stated he positioned himself on top of Diaz Millan and held onto his neck. Wilkinson held onto Diaz Millan's neck with his left arm and yelled for help. Wilkinson removed his right hand from his grip and pounded on the cell door. Diaz Millan was breathing heavy, and Wilkinson believed Diaz Millan was hyping himself up to hurt Wilkinson, Wilkinson held onto Diaz Millan's neck until deputies arrived at the cell. Wilkinson did not want to hurt Diaz Millan, but feared Diaz Millan was going to kill him in the cell.

Wilkinson sustained a large welt above his right eye, approximately three inches in length. Wilkinson's right eye was red, and it appeared he suffered broken blood vessels in his eye. Wilkinson refused medical treatment. The injuries were photographed and documented by crime scene specialist

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Detective Jonathan Cavender, Crime Scene Specialists
and processed the crime scene. The crime scene was located within Housing I
at West Valley Detention Center, located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, in Rancho Cucamonga.

along the south wall. Inside the cell Cavender observed a blue mattress on the top bunk and numerous
court paperwork for the suspect, Ceasar Wilkinson, located on the bottom bunk. On the bottom bunk,
Cavender located a San Bernardino County inmate orange shirt, size XXL. The shirt had a white label on the
front left of the shirt with the label "Wilkinson, C SBSUP 25." On the desk inside Cavender observed
a San Bernardino County inmate orange shirt, size XXXL, two white socks, and a San Bernardino County
inmate orange shirt, size medium. The floor of the cell had an approximately 2'x3' puddle of water, which
appeared to be leaking from the toilet. Cavender did not locate any weapons or blood inside the cell.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at about 1200 hours, Wilkinson was moved by Deputy Andrew Castillo from and housed in an As Wilkinson arrived at he noticed a Hispanic male, later identified as Jorge Diaz Millan, was already in the cell. Once Castillo placed Wilkinson into the cell door closed, but his handcuffs remained on. Wilkinson initially feared being handcuffed alone in a cell with Diaz Millan, but after several minutes, Castillo removed Wilkinson's handcuffs through the tray slot in the cell door.
According to Wilkinson, Diaz Millan immediately started to act erratically and quickly moved around the cell. Diaz Millan pulled Wilkinson's shirt sleeve with his fingers and demanded Wilkinson remove his shirt. Wilkinson told Diaz Millan to leave him alone several times, but he continued to pull at Wilkinson's shirt. Wilkinson claimed he told Diaz Millan that he did not want any problems, and desired to serve his time and go home. Diaz Millan continued to display strange and aggressive behavior while Wilkinson was in the cell.
At one point, Wilkinson claimed he became so uncomfortable with Diaz Millan that he pushed the intercom button According to Wilkinson, Deputy Enrique
Ramirez contacted him at the cell door. \
Ramirez allegedly told
Wilkinson to remain in Example
After Ramirez walked away, Diaz Millan asked Wilkinson where he was from. Wilkinson responded he was from Texas and Diaz Millan immediately accused Diaz Millan of killing his family in Mexico. Wilkinson had no idea what Diaz Millan talked about and became increasingly concerned for his safety. Wilkinson believed Diaz Millan was mentally unstable and watched as he punched the cell door and wall with his fists.

Diaz Millan told Wilkinson he was a fighter as he continued to throw punches and knees strikes at the cell door. In Wilkinson's opinion, Diaz Millan stuck the cell door very hard, and he feared Diaz Millan would be able to knock him out with one strike with the amount of power he had. While Wilkinson stayed in an unknown inmate approached the cell door. The inmate told Wilkinson to, "Be careful" around Diaz Millan because he fought his last cellmate the day prior.

As the day continued, Diaz Millan's behavior continued to become hostile toward Wilkinson. While Wilkinson sat on the lower bunk and faced the cell door, Diaz Millan grabbed a pack of peanut butter and told Wilkinson to eat it.

After ordering Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter, Diaz Millan slammed the peanut butter packet onto the floor in front of Wilkinson. Wilkinson refused to eat the peanut butter and Diaz Millan got visibly angry and ordered Wilkinson to eat the peanut butter again or "I'll kill you in three seconds." After Diaz Millan threated to kill Wilkinson, he began to count down, "3-2-1"

As Diaz Millan counted down, Wilkinson remained seated on the bottom bunk. After Diaz Millan counted to one, he kicked Wilkinson one time in the head. Diaz Millan's right shin impacted the right side of Wilkinson's face and forehead, above his right eye. Diaz Millan's kick stunned Wilkinson but did not render him unconscious. After Diaz Millan kicked Wilkinson in the face, Wilkinson saw Diaz Millan began to kick him again with his right foot. Wilkinson believed he must fight for his life to avoid being killed by Diaz Millan. As Diaz Millan swung his right leg toward Wilkinson a second time, he slipped and fell to the floor. Wilkinson believed he needed to grasp onto Diaz Millan and keep him on the floor to avoid being further assaulted or possibly killed.

Wilkinson admitted he wrapped his left arm around Diaz Millan's neck and pressed his body onto the floor against the cell door. Wilkinson tightened his grip around Diaz Millan's neck and held him in a "Choke hold" position. Wilkinson's left arm remained around Diaz Millan's neck and his right hand grasped his left wrist to securely hold Diaz Millan's neck. Wilkinson believed if he let go of Diaz Millan, Diaz Millan would certainly kill him. Wilkinson explained he held onto Diaz Millan's neck as his chest was pressed onto the right side of Diaz Millan's body. Wilkinson's knees were on the floor on Diaz Millan's right side and approximately 80% of Wilkinson's body weight was pressed against Diaz Millan's back. Wilkinson claimed he did not desire to harm Diaz Millan and as they were pressed near the cell door, Wilkinson banged on the cell door and yelled for help. Wilkinson desired to get the attention of Ramirez, other deputies or inmates nearby in order to secure Diaz Millan. Diaz Millan eventually stopped struggling but continued to breath heavily. Wilkinson claimed he released his right hand from the choke hold and banged on the cell door. Wilkinson estimated he struck the cell door with his right hand approximately five to six times as he screamed for help. Wilkinson's left arm remained around Diaz Millan's neck, but was not held tightly.

After approximately two to three minutes, Wilkinson saw Ramirez walk up the stairs toward After Wilkinson saw Ramirez, he felt safe enough to remove his left arm from around Diaz Millan's neck. As Wilkinson crouched to the right side of Diaz Millan's body, Wilkinson admitted he used an open palm to lightly hit Diaz Millan's face in an attempt to wake him.

As Ramirez opened the cell door, Wilkinson admitted he told Ramirez that Diaz Millan fell. Ramirez handcuffed Wilkinson as Deputy Samuel Mora arrived. Mora escorted Wilkinson to the base of the stairs and told him to sit down. Wilkinson remained seated on a bench as Ramirez and Mora rendered aid to Diaz Millan. Wilkinson became concerned for Diaz Millan's health and believed Diaz Millan was seriously injured. Wilkinson claimed that he yelled toward Ramirez and Mora and admitted that he held Diaz Millan in a choke hold.

As Ramirez continued to render aid to Diaz Millan, Deputy Eliasib Sanchez escorted Wilkinson to Segment G. Wilkinson remained in the clothing he wore at the time of the fight with Diaz Millan and did not wash his hands. Wilkinson sustained pain to his face, forehead, and right eye from the kick by Diaz Millan. Wilkinson adamantly denied that he desired to harm Diaz Millan during the fight. Wilkinson claimed he held onto Diaz Millan's neck while he pressed him to the floor to avoid being killed by Diaz Millan.

Wilkinson could not provide any additional information, and we concluded our interview with him.

WITNESS INTERVIEW: ENRIQUE RAMIREZ

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 2150 hours, Detective Malcom Page and I conducted an interview with Deputy Sheriff Enrique Ramirez in the executive dining room of the West Valley Detention Center (WVDC) located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital recorder and later placed a copy of the recording into evidence. I put the interview in chronological order for the ease of the reader. For a verbatim account please refer to audio recordings of the interview. The following is a summary of the interview.

Prior to the interview, Page explained to Ramirez that we desired to obtain a voluntary statement from him, and no disciplinary action would be incurred if he declined to provide a statement. Ramirez stated he understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement.

Ramirez was a Deputy Sheriff, employed by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for Ramirez' normally scheduled shift was AM1, Tuesday through Friday, from 0800 to 2000 hours. Since February 2021, Ramirez was assigned as a housing deputy for housing Unit 1.

Unit 1 contained Segments A through F and an administrative segregation unit. Unit 1 housed general population and protective custody (PC) inmates. PC inmates ranged from, PC 1, PC 2, and PC 3 classified inmates. PC inmates wore an orange over red inmate uniform. PC inmates were housed with other inmates within the same classifications. The Segments contained 16 cells. Each cell housed one or two inmates. Segment A housed suicide watch inmates who are isolated from other inmates. Unit 1 contained seriously mentally ill lockdown (SMIL) inmates, a classification which required them to be handcuffed to the rear and leg-shackled when moved within the facility, by staff. There were four designated deputies assigned to Segments A, B, C, D, E and F. The deputies accompanied mental health clinicians who treated inmates with mental illnesses.

Ramirez' duties as a housing deputy included conducting hourly inmate observation logs to ensure inmates were accounted for and were in good health. During each hour, Ramirez walked through each segment and observed every cell to ensure every inmate was alive and did not need medical attention.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Ramirez worked his normal shift which started at 0800 hours.
Ramirez was assigned to work with Deputy Samuel Mora and Sheriff's Custody Specialist
Ramirez worked at least two shift rotations with in Unit 1. Mora was on his first

Ramirez looked into the cell and noticed Wilkinson stood by the cell door. Wilkinson wore a white shirt and red pants. Wilkinson's clothing appeared clean and in good order. Diaz-Millan sat on the desk chair, hands clasped together, facing the wall. Diaz-Millan did not say anything to Ramirez. Ramirez described Wilkinson as high-functioning and coherent. Ramirez did not observe any injuries on Wilkinson's body. Ramirez previously looked up Wilkinson's jail booking photograph and knew how he looked. Ramirez noticed the floor on the inside of the cell was wet. Ramirez recalled Mora mentioned Diaz-Millan recently washed himself and cleaned the inside of his cell. According to Ramirez, it did not appear a physical confrontation occurred.

Ramirez asked Wilkinson what the problem was. Wilkinson whispered through the tray door as he spoke to Ramirez. Ramirez recalled how the television background noise made it hard to hear Wilkinson. Ramirez told Wilkinson to speak up so he could hear him. Wilkinson said he did not belong here. Ramirez understood that Wilkinson felt he should not be classified as

Ramirez offered to work with Wilkinson and see if he could eventually be reclassified as general population inmate. Ramirez told Wilkinson to "Champ it out" and attempted to motivate Wilkinson. Ramirez told Wilkinson that he could possibly return to general population

While Ramirez spoke with Wilkinson, Wilkinson admitted that he was scared, but did not specify what he was scared of. Ramirez asked Wilkinson if he was scared because it was his first time in jail. Wilkinson told Ramirez how he was getting out (of jail) in December and did not want to get in trouble. Ramirez told Wilkinson that he had right "mind set" and encouraged Wilkinson to follow the facility classes, emphasizing how Wilkinson's release date was only two months away. Ramirez recalled Wilkinson describing Diaz-Millan as being "weird". Ramirez did not ask Wilkinson any questions clarifying this statement. Wilkinson did not mention any problem between he and Diaz-Millan. Wilkinson did not threaten to hurt himself or Diaz-Millan. Ramirez estimated the contact with Wilkinson lasted approximately five minutes. Ramirez did not record his contact with Wilkinson. Ramirez believed the contact was routine and unimportant. Ramirez compared his interaction with Wilkinson like a routine contact with an inmate requesting toilet paper, which he would also not audio record.

Ramirez resumed his safety logs checks and normal unit duties. Ramirez was not aware of any additional problems with Wilkinson or Diaz-Millan. Ramirez added that he and Mora were busy throughout the day as the unit was short-staffed. Ramirez explained the deputy assigned to suicide watch unit, was on vacation. Registered Nurse arrived and took over chest compressions. Ramirez estimated he performed three minutes of chest compressions. Ramirez saw Mora on the second floor. Additional unknown nurses arrived to render medical aid to Diaz-Millan. Unknown nurses placed the automated external defibrillator (AED) on Diaz-Millan. The AED advised no shock needed and to continue CPR. Unknown nurses continued chest compressions. An unknown nurse established an intravenous line (IV) on Diaz-Millan, Ramirez instructed Mora to remain with the nurses, Ramirez walked down to the first floor and wrote down the names of the staff who entered the unit. Ramirez instructed Deputy Elisha Sanchez to take Wilkinson to the attorney room in briefed Sergeants Nickalaus Seybert and Rafael Ixco. American Medical Response (AMR) and Rancho Fire Department Station 174 arrived in approximately 25 minutes. Paramedics connected Diaz-Millan to an electrocardiogram machine (EKG). Paramedics brought down Diaz-Millan to the first floor using a portable stretcher and placed him onto a gurney. Paramedics took Diaz-Millan out of the unit approximately eight minutes after they arrived. Ramirez did not provide further information, and I concluded the interview.

On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, at approximately 1525 hours, while at the medical clinic, heard "nurse, can you have the broadcasted over the police radio. became concerned, collected her medical bag, and walked toward was on her way to heard, she heard, "We need an ammonia packet, he is unresponsive" broadcasted over the police radio. walked faster toward and as she entered the unit, she heard "Code Blue." A code blue was a medical emergency on the facility, which required all available medical staff to respond.
was the first medical staff member to arrive at the scene. The entered and immediately ran into the segment and observed an inmate handcuffed on the bottom tier. The ran upstairs and observed an inmate, later identified as Diaz Millan, lying on his back, with his eyes closed. Diaz Millan's head faced toward the segment door.
observed Diaz Millan's skin looked pale and off. noticed Diaz Millan clothes were wet and he was lay in a puddle of water. instructed Deputy Ramirez and Deputy Sanchez to move Diaz Millan out of the water. Deputies moved Diaz Millan out of the cell and onto the platform of the top tier. told Ramirez to begin chest compressions. Ramirez began chest compressions on Diaz Millan. attached a blood pressure cuff to Diaz Millan's right arm and a pulse ox meter on his left hand. Ramirez continued to perform chest compressions. inserted an ammonia packet into Diaz Millan's nostril and did not get any response. did not get any readings from the pulse ox or the blood pressure cuff. switched with Ramirez and began to conduct chest compressions.

RN arrived at the scene and had the automated external defibrillator (AED), which was used to administer an electrical shock to restart a patient's heart back into rhythm. placed the AED pads onto Diaz Millan as administered chest compressions. As the AED evaluated Diaz Millan's vitals, it verbally indicated a shock was not advised and to continue CPR.
RN to record the medical procedures by medical staff administered on Diaz Millan as they were completed. As recorded the medical procedures, RN's and were present. Diaz Millan's oxygen saturation levels were found to be 94% after the IV was inserted. At 1543 hours, RN received a blood pressure reading for Diaz Millan, which read 79/47. At 1543 hours, a second 2 milliliter dose of Narcan was given to Diaz intravenously (IV). At approximately 1544 hours, Diaz Millan's pupils measured approximately 4MM and were slightly reactive. At approximately 1547 hours, an Oropharyngeal Airway (OPA) was inserted into Diaz Millan's mouth to open his airway. was unsure who inserted the OPA. Approximately one minute after Ramirez broadcasted the possible code blue, multiple medical staff ran to
ensured the entry routes to were opened and clear of obstructions. observed multiple medical staff and deputies surround Diaz Millan, but was unable to see any specific medical aid rendered to him.
As medical staff continued life saving measures to Diaz Millan, the control panels in the unit's control booth stopped operating. Once the control panel stopped operating, lost the ability to open any doors within immediately contacted the SCS assigned to Master Control and sought a solution for the inoperative control panels. According to multiple medical staff members were rendering aid to Diaz Millan and the loss of control to open doors to the unit did not delay or effect the life-saving efforts attempted on Diaz Millan. 





Bentacu's normally scheduled shift was Wednesday through Friday from 0600 to 1800 hours, and every other Tuesday. On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, Bentacu was assigned as the Core Rover. At approximately 1530 hours, Bentacu was the intake area when he heard a code blue in on his handheld police radio. Bentacu and Deputy Mark Jebbia responded to Upon their arrival, Bentacu observed Deputies Enrique Ramirez, Samuel Mora, and numerous medical staff around an inmate, later identified as Jorge Diaz-Millan. Diaz-Millan was supine on the second-floor tier, left of the staircase. Bentacu saw medical personnel perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Diaz-Millan. As Bentacu arrived Registered Nurse (RN) performed chest compressions on Diaz-Millan. Bentacu immediately called American Medical Response's (AMR) directly and requested a "Code 3" response from AMR and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department personnel. Bentacu told AMR, medical staff were performing CPR on an inmate. Bentacu explained, it was normal protocol to call AMR directly for immediate response, instead of calling 9-1-1. Bentacu remained on the first floor as he coordinated paramedics' response. Bentacu left the unit and returned with the facility's GoPro camera. Bentacu walked to the second floor and took digital photographs of the scene as medical staff conducted lifesaving measures to Diaz-Millan. After Bentacu completed photographing the scene, he walked down the stairs to the bottom level of Paramedics from AMR and Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department arrived between five to 10 minutes after Bentacu's call.

On Tuesday, November 16, 2021, at approximately 0746 hours, I interviewed Fire Fighter at the Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department (RCFD), located at 11297 Jersey Boulevard, Rancho Cucamonga. I digitally recorded my interview with and I later copied the audio recording to the case file. The following is a summary of my recorded interview with
On Wednesday, October 6, 2021, was assigned to RCFD Medic Engine with Engineer Paramedic and Captain At approximately 1541 hours, was dispatched to the West Valley Detention Center (WVDC), located at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga, for an unresponsive patient. At approximately 1550 hours, arrived at the WVDC intake yard.
and the crew from were escorted to by an unknown deputy. observed deputies, several medical personnel from WVDC, and personnel from American Medical Response (AMR) on the second tier of walked upstairs and observed an inmate later identified as Jorge Diaz-Millan, supine on the floor outside of an opened cell door. saw WVDC medical personnel performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Diaz-Millan.
was advised by WVDC medical personnel that Diaz-Millan was found in his cell and was unconscious for approximately 30 minutes. was told the WVDC medical personnel had an Intravenous (IV) line started, administered three rounds of Narcan, and two rounds of epinephrine.
At approximately 1558, took over chest compressions from an unknown nurse. and switched positions after two minutes. At approximately 1601 hours, noticed a return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC). CPR was stopped after they noticed the ROSC. felt Diaz-Milan had a carotid and radial pulse. In noticed Diaz-Milan had an electronic rhythm of his heart that was captured on the monitor. It advised the other medical personnel Diaz-Milan had ROSC and advised they needed to transport him. Advised they needed to get vitals for Diaz-Milan before they transported him. Diaz-Milan was connected to a 12-lead echocardiogram (EKG), blood pressure cuff, and oxygen sensor. Diaz-Milan was placed on a soft carry bag, carried downstairs, and placed on AMR's gurney. Diaz-Milan was taken to the intake yard and placed into the back of the ambulance.
and an unknown paramedic from AMR were in the back of the ambulance and were driven by an AMR emergency medical technician (EMT). At approximately 1605 hours, Diaz-Milan was transported to . At that time, Diaz-Milan was still unconscious but had a pulse.
continued to give breaths to Diaz-Milan with a bag valve mask (BVM) connected to an ambu bag.
