NARRATIVE

On August 23, 2022, Eli Baker was arrested by the San Bernardino County Probation Department and booked at High Desert Detention Center. Baker was housed in Unit 4, Segment B, Cell 4, a General Population unit. Baker did not have a cellmate.

On Thursday, November 10, 2022, Deputy A. Villalobos was assigned to Unit 4. Inmate Eli Baker was housed in Unit 4, Segment B, Cell 4 and was active throughout the evening. He freely moved from his cell to the dayroom, during tier time, without difficulty and did not appear to be in distress. At approximately 2115 hours, Baker was alone in his cell and appeared to begin having a medical emergency. He made no attempt to notify HDDC staff of his condition. Baker positioned himself, in a kneeling position on the floor, with his head tucked in front of his body.

Approximately two minutes later, Villalobos conducted her safety log check and discovered Baker on the floor. Baker did not respond to Villalobos as she attempted contact with him at his cell door. At approximately 2123 hours, medical aid was summoned. Minutes later, HDDC nursing staff arrived and Baker was removed from his cell where he remained unresponsive. CPR was initiated and nursing staff administered several doses of Narcan. Baker had no obvious injuries. Paramedics arrived and assisted with medical aid until Baker was pronounced deceased at approximately 2204 hours. A review of the safety logs did not show any discrepancies.

DEPUTY INTERVIEW: Anelis Villalobos

On Friday, November 14, 2022, at approximately 1439 hours, Detective Jonathan Cavender and I interviewed San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) Deputy Anelis Villalobos at the Specialized Investigations Division office located at 808 E. Mill Street, San Bernardino. I recorded the interview with my department-issued belt recorder and put a copy of the recording into evidence. The following is a summary of Villalobos' statement.

Before starting the interview, I advised Villalobos I was conducting an investigation of the incustody death of Eli Baker. I explained to Villalobos she was not ordered to speak with me and could not be disciplined for refusing to provide me with a statement. Villalobos understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the incident.

Villalobos was employed by SBCSD as a deputy sheriff since assigned to High Desert Detention Center. On the date of the incident, November 10, 2021, starting at 2000 hours, Villalobos began an overtime shift at HDDC and was assigned to Unit 4. Villalobos was the only deputy assigned to the unit. During the shift's briefing, personnel were told there was a possible fentanyl overdose in Unit 4 on the previous shift. Based on Villalobos' training and experience, she knew there was the possibility additional fentanyl could be possessed by inmates in the unit.

At approximately 2118 hours, Villalobos entered Unit 4, Segment B, to complete her observation logs. According to Villalobos, approximately every hour, deputies conducted observation logs to ensure the inmates were alive, safe, and not violating facility rules.

Villalobos started on the left side of the bottom tier at Cell 1. Less than one minute later, Villalobos approached Cell 4 and looked into the cell through the bottom window of the closed door. Villalobos observed Eli Baker on the ground in a crouched position with his arms tucked under his upper torso and his chin tucked down toward his chest. Baker wore orange corrections pants and no shirt. Baker was on the door's right side, as observed from outside the cell. Baker was alone in the cell. The top of Baker's head faced the door, and his buttocks faced the cell's rear wall.

Villalobos identified Baker by his SBCSD inmate identification card on the windowsill of his cell, faced toward the dayroom. For approximately one minute, Villalobos called Baker by his first and last name and tapped on the door with her foot and keys. Villalobos saw Baker was breathing, and he responded to her by raising or "shrugging" his left shoulder. Baker did not respond verbally to Villalobos, which according to her, was not unusual for inmates.

Villalobos initially believed Baker was praying or attempting to get her to open the door to ambush her. Villalobos did not believe Baker needed medical aid because he breathed and moved his shoulder. Villalobos said she would have called for medical on the facility radio if she knew or believed Baker was in medical distress.

According to Villalobos, she was recently off training and did not think about requesting an additional deputy to the unit to assist and evaluate Baker. It was Villalobos' first time working in Unit 4, and she had no previous contact with Baker to know his demeanor, medical/mental health history, or daily activities.

Villalobos continued her safety checks and carried a mattress to the top tier. Villalobos left the mattress near Cell 12, finished her safety checks, and returned to Cell 4 approximately two minutes later. Baker was in the same position and breathing. For approximately two minutes, Villalobos called out to Baker, called him by his first and last name, and tapped on the door, but again, he only responded by raising or "shrugging" his left shoulder. Villalobos told Baker if he did not talk to her, she would have to call the nurse, to which he did not respond. Villalobos again thought Baker was praying or attempting to get her to open the door to ambush her. Villalobos did not believe Baker needed medical aid because he breathed and moved his shoulder.

An unknown inmate in Cell 3 told Villalobos Baker was speaking to him minutes before she entered the segment. Villalobos left the segment, went into the unit's control booth, and told Sheriff's Custody Specialist what had occurred. Told Villalobos to call out a possible man down on the facility radio to get additional deputies and medical staff to the unit in case it was a medical emergency or ambush.

Approximately one minute later, Villalobos broadcast, "Unit 4 nurse, respond for a possible man down, unresponsive," on the facility radio and returned to Cell 4. Baker was in the same position Villalobos previously observed him. Villalobos knelt outside the cell and attempted to get a response from Baker, but he did not move this time.

Approximately two minutes later, an unknown female nurse arrived and looked through the cell door's window at Baker. The nurse told Villalobos to broadcast a "Code Blue" on the radio. Villalobos made the broadcast, and the nurse waved at to open the cell door because deputies did not carry keys to open the cell doors.

opened the cell door from the control booth. As the door opened, Baker's upper body slid forward, and Villalobos observed orange vomit on the ground beneath his head, near his face.

Villalobos and the nurse grabbed Baker's arms, rolled him onto his back, and pulled him out of the cell. Villalobos did not observe any injuries or lividity on Baker. Additional unknown nurses arrived in the segment and took over medical care.

An unknown nurse felt for a pulse near Baker's neck and said they needed to start cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). At that time, Deputy Nathaniel Padilla arrived and performed chest compressions. Villalobos did not observe if rescue breaths were performed. Villalobos stood by and scribed for the nurses.

An unknown nurse administered the first dose of Narcan at 2127 hours. Villalobos opened the automated external defibrillator (AED) case and handed the AED pads to an unknown nurse who placed them on Baker's chest and torso. At 2128 hours, an unknown nurse administered a second dose of Narcan. At 2129 hours, an unknown nurse administered a third dose of Narcan. Villalobos did not observe any changes in Baker after the three doses of Narcan.

Approximately 15 minutes after the "Code Blue" was broadcasted, Sergeant Roosevelt Dutra, American Medical Response (AMR), and San Bernardino County Fire Department personnel arrived. Dutra told Villalobos to write down the names of all personnel in the unit. Villalobos retrieved her notepad and camera from the unit control booth and returned to the segment to gather the involved personnel's names.

One of the AMR paramedics connected Baker to their monitor, but Villalobos did not observe the additional medical treatment rendered. Throughout the incident, personnel took turns performing chest compressions to avoid fatigue. The second AMR paramedic called an unknown person on her cellular telephone and spoke about the care being rendered to Baker.

At approximately 2203 hours, the second AMR paramedic advised all involved personnel to stop life-saving measures. AMR and fire personnel gathered their medical equipment and were escorted out of the unit by deputies. Villalobos took photographs of the segment and Baker's cell, which she gave investigators.

On Friday, November 11, 2022, at approximately 0402 hours, I interviewed San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) Deputy Nathaniel Padilla at High Desert Detention Center (HDDC), located at 9438 Commerce Way, Adelanto. I recorded the interview with my department-issued belt recorder and put a copy of the recording into evidence. The following is a summary of Padilla's statement.

Before starting the interview, I advised Padilla I was conducting an investigation of the in-custody death of Eli Baker. I explained to Padilla he was not ordered to speak with me and could not be disciplined for refusing to provide me with a statement. Padilla understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the incident.

Padilla was employed by SBCSD as a deputy sheriff since and was assigned to Glen Helen Rehabilitation Center but was temporarily assigned to HDDC. Padilla worked the PM-1 shift, Tuesday through Thursday, and every other Monday from 2000 to 0800 hours. On Thursday, November 10, 2022, at approximately 2000 hours, Padilla started his shift at HDDC and was assigned to Unit 6 with Deputy Guilibaldo Montenegro.

On Thursday, November 10, 2022, at approximately 2120 hours, Padilla was in Unit 6 when Deputy Anelis Villalobos broadcasted, "Man down, Unit 4," on the facility radio. Sergeant Roosevelt Dutra responded on the radio and asked if Villalobos needed additional deputies. Villalobos replied that she needed one additional deputy for an unresponsive inmate.

Padilla responded and arrived at Unit 4, Segment B, approximately one minute later. Padilla observed four to five unknown nurses (Padilla did not know the nurses' names), and Villalobos knelt next to a white male adult, later identified as Eli Baker. Baker wore orange inmate issued jail pants, and his upper body was bare. Padilla did not observe any injuries on Baker. Baker lay supine, unconscious, and unresponsive outside of Cell 4. The nursing staff performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Baker. One nurse performed chest compressions as a second placed automated external defibrillator (AED) pads on Baker's chest and abdomen.

Approximately one minute later, Padilla took over for the nurse and continued chest compressions for approximately 10 minutes. As Padilla performed chest compressions, nurses delivered rescue breaths with a bag-valve-mask and started an intravenous line in Baker's right arm. Padilla continued chest compressions for five to ten minutes, during which a nurse administered an additional dose of Narcan. American Medical Response (AMR) and San Bernardino County Fire Department personnel arrived, connected Baker to their medical equipment, and took over lifesaving measures.

The AMR paramedic spoke to a doctor on her cellular telephone, and approximately 20 minutes later, the doctor told medical personnel to stop lifesaving efforts. Medical personnel were escorted out of the unit and gave deputies their names for the crime scene log. Padilla assisted Villalobos, who photographed Baker's cell. Padilla did not observe any signs of a struggle inside the cell.

Once Villalobos completed her photographs, the segment was secured. Approximately 30 minutes later, Padilla entered the segment to conduct a count, complete a safety log, and escort the medication nurse. Padilla and the nurse exited the segment, and it was re-secured.

Padilla had no previous contact with Baker and never worked in Unit 4.

Padilla had no further information, and the interview was concluded at approximately 0426 hours.

On Friday, November 11, 2022, at approximately 0439 hours, I interviewed San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) Deputy Jonathan Thompson at High Desert Detention Center (HDDC), located at 9438 Commerce Way, Adelanto. I recorded the interview with my department-issued belt recorder and placed a copy of the recording into evidence. The following is a summary of Thompson's statement.

Before starting the interview, I advised Thompson I was investigating the in-custody death of Eli Baker. I explained to Thompson that he was not ordered to speak with me and could not be disciplined for refusing to provide me with a statement. Thompson understood and agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the incident.

Thompson was employed by SBCSD as a deputy sheriff since and was assigned to HDDC. Thompson worked the PM-1 shift, which was Tuesday through Thursday, and every other Monday from 1930 hours to 0800 hours. On Thursday, November 10, 2022, at approximately 2000 hours, Thompson began his shift at HDDC and was assigned to Male Intake with Deputy Arturo Rodriguez

On Thursday, November 10, 2022, at approximately 2120 hours, Thompson was in Male Intake when an unknown deputy broadcasted, "Man down, Unit 4," on the facility radio. Thompson remained in intake to complete his job duties but heard "CPR in progress" broadcasted on the radio several minutes later. Approximately 20 minutes later, American Medical Response (AMR) arrived at HDDC, followed by San Bernardino County Fire Department five to ten minutes later. Deputy Reed Powell escorted AMR personnel, and Deputy Rudy Faile escorted SBCFD personnel from the intake yard to Unit 4.

At approximately 2148 hours, Sergeant Roosevelt Dutra requested Thompson respond to Unit 4 over the facility radio. Thompson responded to Unit 4 and arrived at approximately 2150 hours. Thompson observed facility nurses, deputies, and emergency medical service personnel in Segment B, surrounding a white male adult, later identified as Eli Baker. Baker lay supine and unresponsive on the ground outside of Cell 4. Baker wore orange corrections pants and was nude from the waist up. Baker appeared unconscious and had no visible injuries. Medical personnel performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Baker. Baker had intravenous lines and automated external defibrillator pads attached to his body. Thompson did not observe any medications given to Baker but overheard an unknown nurse say Baker received three doses of Narcan.

Thompson contacted Dutra, who told him to assist Deputy Anelis Villalobos in preserving the scene and gathering contact information for the involved personnel. Thompson told Villalobos what she needed to do, then took over providing chest compressions for Dutra. Thompson, Deputy Nathaniel Padilla, and an unknown nurse performed chest compressions and switched positions every two minutes for approximately ten minutes.

The AMR paramedic told everyone to stop life-saving measures, at which time CPR was stopped. Deputies escorted everyone out of the segment and secured the door. Thompson observed the inside of Baker's cell from the outside. There was one mattress on the bottom bunk and no signs of a struggle, which indicated to Thompson that Baker was housed alone in the cell. Thompson had no previous contact with Baker and never worked in Unit 4.

On Thursday, November 10, 2022, Dutra worked an overtime shift at HDDC and was scheduled to work from 1800 hours to 0600 hours.

JAIL INTELLIGENCE TEAM INVESTIGATION:

On Tuesday, May 7, 2024, I contacted Detective Zachery Rugge from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) Internal Affairs Division.

Rugge told me on Monday, November 10, 2022, he was assigned to the SBCSD Jail Intelligence Team, alongside Sergeant Alex Collins and Detective Jose Ortiz. On Monday, November 10, 2022, Collins, Rugge, and Ortiz were called out to assist with the in-custody death investigation of Inmate Eli Baker.

Rugge informed me JIT completed an investigation into the incident but were unable to positively identify the source of the fentanyl which caused Baker's overdose. This investigation included review of video surveillance, jail logs, and conducting interviews with inmates. The investigation became cold, as no further investigative leads were available.

On Friday, November 11,2022, at 0143 hours, I was assigned incident #CO223140109. The call wasinitially reported on Thursday, November 10, 2022, at 2219 hours, by High Desert Detention Center (HDDC), Deputy Sheriff K. Lewis, who called to report the death of Eli Baker, age , at HDDC.

RESPONSE TO SCENE:

At 0320 hours, I responded from the Central Coroner Office to High Desert Detention Center and arrived at 0406 hours.

STATEMENT- HOMICIDE DETECTIVE S. THURMAN SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT (SBCSD):

At 0430 hours, I spoke with Homicide Detective S. Thurman on scene. The following is a summary of his statement:

Baker was an inmate at High Desert Detention Center since August 2022. He was the sole occupant of cell 4B4. On Thursday, November 10, 2022, at 2115 hours, Deputy Villalobos conducted a safety check and found Baker unresponsive, on the floor of his cell. Deputy Villalobos requested medical personnel at 2128 hours and began CPR. American Medical Response (AMR) personnel responded to the scene at 2135 and continued advanced cardiac life support (ACLS). Despite life saving measures, Baker remained unresponsive. Paramedic pronounced death at 2203 hours.

Baker was suspected of having overdosed after; another inmate, on the second floor above him, was found to have overdosed approximately one hour before.

PARAMEDIC RUNSHEET:

I obtained the paramedic report from the Inland Counties Emergency Medical Agency website. The following is a summary of that report:

AMR received the call at 2128 hours. Medic Engine VC197 was dispatched at 2128 hours and arrived on scene at 2135 hours. When paramedic personnel arrived on scene, Baker was supine on the floor, near the entrance of a cell, unresponsive and pulseless. Detention center staff, including nurses and law enforcement, performed CPR.

Advanced cardiac life support (ACLS) was initiated at 2126 hours. Baker remained unresponsive and pulseless, and Paramedic pronounced death at 2203 hours.

SCENE DESCRIPTION:

The scene was at High Desert Detention Center, at 9438 Commerce Way in the city of Adelanto. Baker was housed in unit four, a two-story housing segment. The segments had 16 cells in total each, eight cells on the first floor and eight cells on the second floor. Baker was assigned to cell 4B4 on the first floor. Baker was the only occupant. His body was supine by the cell door with medical devices surrounding him.

BODY EXAMINATION:

On November 11, 2022, at 0500 hours, I began the body examination at the scene.

Physical Description:

The body was that of an adult male appearing to be age The complexion was fair. The head was bald. The eyes were blue. There were teeth on the upper and lower gums. The body was approximately 6 feet and 1 inch tall and weighed approximately 185 pounds.

Body Position:

The body was on a cement-like floor. The head was oriented to the south and was facing the left shoulder. The feet were oriented to the north. Both arms were extended outwards on each side, away from the torso. The lower extremities were parallel to the body.

Clothing:

The body was clad in orange pants, boxers, white socks, and orange sandals. The clothing was appropriately draped on the body.

Therapeutic Devices:

The following therapeutic devices were observed on the body:

- There were electrocardiogram pads on the upper chest, close to the neck, and lower abdomen.
- There were defibrillator pads on the right upper chest and left side of torso.
- There were intravenous lines on the right and left cubital fossa of both arms.

Observations:

I observed brown purge from the mouth. There was no tache noire present on the eyes. The eyes were congested. The teeth were present on the upper and lower gums.

Tattoos:

I did not observe tattoos on the body.

Trauma:

I observed the following trauma on the body: There was a linear abrasion on the right upper shoulder. There were no other visible or palpable signs of trauma or fractures to the skull, face, torso, arms or legs.

Postmortem Changes:

I palpated the chest, abdomen, upper and lower back and all extremities and they felt cold. Palpable blanching lividity with purple discoloration was present on the posterior upper and lower torso. The body had generalized rigor mortis which was easily broken in all extremities.

Conclusion:

I concluded the body examination at 0520 hours. I took a total of 43 digital photographs of the body and





HISTORY OF DEATH: The following information is obtained from the deputy coroner investigative report. The subject was an inmate at the Hight Desert Detention Center since August 2022. On November 10, 2022, at 2115 hours, a deputy conducted a safety check and found him unresponsive on the floor of his cell. Custody medical emergency personnel responded and began cardiac left support. The fire department arrived on scene at 2135 hours. Death was pronounced at the scene.

The subject was the sole occupant of a two-man cell. An hour prior, another inmate overdosed on fentanyl in the same segment as the subject.

GENERAL EXAMINATION: The body is identified by a tag around the right first toe as "Baker, Eli 702208652." The body is that of an unembalmed, adult, White male of the reported age of years. The body weighs 187 pounds and measures 73 inches.

An orange pants, a pair of orange slippers, a pair of white socks, brown boxer shorts.

Evidence of Medical Intervention: EKG pads are on the chest and abdomen. Defibrillator pads are on the chest. Intravenous lines are in both antecubital fossae. A nasal tube is in the left nostril.

Evidence of Postmortem Change: Rigor mortis is present. Lividity is present on the posterior aspect of the body.

There is no coronary atherosclerosis.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: There is no foreign object or lesion in the trachea or bronchi. The right lung is 919 grams, and the left lung is 900 grams. The parenchyma is without hemorrhage or lesions. The pulmonary vasculature is without thromboembolism.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT: The esophagus is unremarkable. The stomach contains 700 ml of emulsified food particles, and the gastric mucosa is unremarkable. In situ and external appearances of the small and large intestines are unremarkable. The appendix and pancreas are unremarkable.







On Wednesday, July 5, 2023, I reviewed a video recording of the surveillance camera footage from High Desert Detention Center, Housing Unit 4, Segment B. The recording in Segment B took place on Thursday, November 10, 2022, between approximately 1924 hours and 2052 hours and was labeled "Unit 4B - Cam142 - 172.22.10.142-2022-11-10_19h24min11s000ms." The recording did not capture audio. The following is a summary of the video recording. The times referenced in this report refer to the approximate length of the video recordings, and not the actual time. Inmates were identified by the Unit 4, Segment B housing roster, Jail Information System, and witness statements. Deputies were identified by witness statements.

00:00 – The doors for cells 1-4 were open. Four inmates were in the dayroom, and two inmates were inside cells. Inmate Eli Baker sat on the bottom bunk of Cell 4, oriented toward the open cell door, holding a tray of food in his hands. Two deputies conducted a safety check on the top tier, which resulted in an emergency medical response to the segment due to the discovery of an overdosed inmate in Cell 12. The deputies continued to work in response to the overdose in Cell 12. (Baker is circled in red in the below photograph.)

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

HMI CELL AUDIO REVIEW:

On Monday, July 17, 2023, I reviewed the Human Machine Interface (HMI) cell audio for High Desert Detention Center (HDDC), Housing Unit 4, for Thursday, November 10, 2022. Upon reviewing the logs of the HMI cell audio, I located a single audio recording which was pertinent to the investigation.

The following is a summary of the cell audio recording pertinent to this investigation.

142_Housing_4_2022_11_10_21_20_40_by_Start_Time_asc— The HMI recording was approximately one minute and seven seconds long. The audio coincided with the video surveillance footage from Housing Unit 4, Segment B, from approximately the 2:02:41 hours timestamp through 2:03:48 hours timestamp of the surveillance video.

The recording started with a metal banging sound, which video surveillance showed was caused by Deputy Anelis Villalobos knocking at the door of Cell 4. Audio was heard in the background which sounded consistent with a television playing in the unit. Villalobos said, "Baker," twice, then continued knocking at the cell door. Villalobos' voice was faintly heard, but it was muffled and covered by ambient noise. The video surveillance showed Villalobos possibly spoke to an inmate who stood at the door of Cell 3, however what was said was unintelligible through the audio recording. Villalobos knocked at the cell door again, then said, "Baker I have to know that you're okay." Villalobos called Baker's name again, then continued to knock at the cell door. Villalobos continued to knock, call Baker's name, and ask Baker if he was okay for approximately 30 seconds. The recording ended with a metallic banging noise, which video surveillance showed was the result of Villalobos closing Baker's cell door tray slot.

No other cell audio recordings appeared to be relevant to this investigation.

OVERVIEW

On November 10, 2022, at 2250 hours, I was assigned to assist San Bernardino County Sheriff's Homicide detectives with an in-custody death investigation. I responded to the scene, which was located at the High Desert Detention Center (HDDC), 9438 Commerce Way, in Adelanto. I arrived at the scene at 0030 hours on November 11, 2022 and contacted Detective Thurman who was present during scene processing.

OBSERVATIONS

SCENE

The scene was in Unit 4, Segment B of HDDC. The entrance to the segment was on the east side, and cells were along the west wall. There was a staircase along the north wall and showers along the south wall.

PLACARDS / OBSERVATIONS

During the course of the investigation the following listed items/areas were marked with placards. Each numbered or lettered item/area corresponds to the placards as depicted in the photographs. Overall photographs were taken of the scene prior to the placement of placards.

- Placard 1 Deceased male, Eli Baker, was laying on his back on the floor. His feet were pointed to the west and his head was pointed to the east. Both of his arms were extended out to the sides. His legs were in the doorway to cell 4B4, with his upper half outside of the cell. He was wearing orange sandals, white socks, size 2XL orange pants, brown underwear, and no shirt. Medical intervention was still attached to his body. He had IVs in both arms, and AED lead stickers on his chest. On the floor near his head, there was a lot of medical debris, and other medical supplies, including a defibrillator, and a blood glucose reader.
- Placard 2 Medical intervention equipment, debris, and supplies on the floor, outside of the cell. Located north and slightly east of Placard 1.
- Placard 3 Various medical supplies on top of the southwest table in the unit, just east of the cell door. Located east of and above Placard 2.
