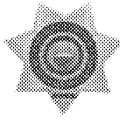

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1200 hours, Randall entered the [REDACTED] grocery store, located at [REDACTED], in Victorville, armed with a knife. Randall openly carried the knife in his right hand as he approached the alcohol aisle. Randall removed an alcohol bottle from the shelf, opened it, and drank from the alcohol bottle. Victorville Sheriff's Station deputies were dispatched and arrived at approximately 1208 hours. Victorville deputies contacted Randall inside WinCo as he continued to hold the knife and drank from the alcohol bottle. Deputies gave Randall multiple commands to drop the knife multiple times, which Randall ignored. Randall ran from deputies and ignored all commands to drop the knife. Randall ran away from deputies with the knife in his hand and continued around the corner of an aisle. Once around the corner out of sight from the deputies, Randall stopped and turned toward deputies. As the deputies approached, Randall raised the knife over his head and swung the knife at them. Deputies attempted to back away, a lethal force encounter (LFE) occurred, and Randall was struck by gunfire. Deputies rendered medical aid to Randall, who was later transported to a hospital for further treatment. Detectives from the Specialized Investigations Division, Homicide Detail responded and assumed the investigation.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1202 hours, deputies from the Victorville Sheriff's Station were dispatched to the [REDACTED] Supermarket, located at [REDACTED] in Victorville. Sheriff's Dispatch received a 9-1-1 call from [REDACTED], who reported a subject, later identified as Todderick Randall was inside the store. [REDACTED] reported Randall was armed with a knife or a box cutter. While Randall was inside the store, he obtained a large bottle of alcohol from the shelf and started to drink it. Randall openly carried the knife in his right hand as he drank from the bottle of alcohol. [REDACTED] advised Randall was an "Unwanted subject" at [REDACTED] and requested deputies to respond.

As deputies responded, security officers at [REDACTED] observed Randall, via surveillance cameras. Randall was a Black male, approximately [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] years old, and wore a gray tank top shirt and dark colored cut-off sweatpants. Randall remained in the alcohol aisle as he consumed the alcohol from the bottle.

At approximately 1208 hours, Deputies Corrin Cassidy and Cameron Stanley arrived. At approximately 1210 hours, Cassidy made a radio broadcast that Randall had a knife in his hand and stood in the alcohol aisle. Approximately 30 seconds later, Cassidy broadcasted a Taser deployment was ineffective and Randall was running away with the knife in his hand. Moments later, Cassidy broadcasted shots were fired. Medical aid was immediately requested and initiated life-saving measures on Randall. Randall was transported to [REDACTED] for advanced medical care.

Detectives from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, Specialized Investigations Division, Homicide Detail responded and assumed the investigation. At approximately 1400 hours, Detective Jonathan Ramstad, and Crime Scene Specialist (CSI) [REDACTED] processed the crime scene. The crime scene was contained within the [REDACTED] Supermarket, near aisle 6. Based on the scene evidence, Stanley fired seven rounds from his handgun, in a southeast direction, toward Randall.

During the crime scene processing, investigators located seven fired cartridge casings (FCCs), four fired bullets, and Taser darts/wires. Investigators located a silver folding utility knife on the ground, under a food display shelf. Investigators located a large quantity of suspected blood where Randall was detained after the shooting occurred. Southeast from the scene of the shooting, investigators located four suspected bullet strikes in various aisle display stands.

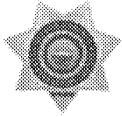

Investigators reviewed the surveillance footage from [REDACTED] which captured the events which led to the lethal force encounter (LFE). According to the surveillance footage, at approximately 1159 hours, Randall entered [REDACTED] alone. Investigators confirmed Randall entered [REDACTED] with a silver object, later confirmed to be a box-cutter, in his right hand. Randall continued into the store and walked around several aisles, as he passed multiple customers with the box-cutter in his hand.

At approximately 1200 hours, Randall arrived at aisle six, which contained numerous bottles of alcohol. Randall picked up a large bottle of margarita mix, which he opened. Randall walked up and down aisle six and drank from the bottle of alcohol. Randall held the bottle in his left hand and continued to hold the box-cutter in his right hand. Randall continued to make unusual and erratic movements and appeared to communicate with subjects not there. Several customers walked past Randall and he appeared to consume a large amount of alcohol from the bottle.

At approximately 1210 hours, Cassidy and Stanley arrived and contacted Randall on aisle six. Stanley and Cassidy wore Department approved Class-A uniforms, with San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department patches on each shoulder, name plates, and Sheriff's badges on their chests. Randall appeared agitated as he openly displayed the box-cutter to Cassidy and Stanley. As Cassidy and Stanley stood approximately 20-feet away from Randall, Randall bladed his body to the deputies, and swung the box-cutter downward several times.

Randall continually held the box-cutter in his right hand, as Cassidy and Stanley gave him multiple commands to "Drop the knife." After approximately 30 seconds, Cassidy deployed her Taser at Randall. Randall backed away and utilized the box-cutter to cut the Taser wires free. Randall ran away from Cassidy and Stanley holding the box-cutter and the alcohol bottle in his hands. Stanley and Cassidy chased Randall as he proceeded toward the checkout lanes of the store.

As Randall exited the aisle, he quickly turned around the corner of the aisle and stopped. Randall ducked downward and turned toward the approaching deputies. Randall stepped closer toward the approaching deputies and raised the box cutter to shoulder height and quickly accelerated his right hand toward Cassidy and Stanley. As Randall swung the knife, Cassidy attempted to back away and Stanley fired seven rounds from his duty handgun at Randall. Simultaneously to Stanley's gunshots, Cassidy deployed her Taser a second time as she fell to the ground.

Randall was struck multiple times by gunfire, and he fell to the ground. Stanley and Cassidy approached Randall, handcuffed him to the rear, and immediately began to render Randall medical aid. Randall was transported to [REDACTED] and underwent surgery for his injuries.

After detectives reviewed the surveillance footage, it was apparent as Randall exited the aisle, he quickly turned around the corner of the aisle and stopped. As Stanley and Cassidy approached, Randall ducked downward, turned toward them, and appeared to lay in wait for the deputies to arrive. Once in sight, Randall raised the knife to shoulder level and threw it at Stanley and Cassidy. As Cassidy stopped and attempted to back away from Randall, she fell backwards away from him. During the crime scene processing, investigators located Randall's knife under a food display shelf, directly behind where Cassidy fell.

As investigators recovered the box-cutter, it was approximately two feet under the display shelf and the razor blade holder was opened. Randall's box-cutter was found to be a silver and black Huskey box-cutter. The box-cutter was silver, made of metal, and the handle was approximately four inches long. The box-cutter's blade was a lockable, folding blade, comprised of metal, which was silver colored. The blade end of the box-cutter holder opened and allowed the user to replace disposable razor blades.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1430 hours, Deputy Jared Sims interviewed [REDACTED] worked as a [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] in Victorville. At approximately 1200 hours, [REDACTED] was advised by another [REDACTED] employee, [REDACTED] that a male, later identified as Todderick Randall, was in the store with a knife or box-cutter. [REDACTED] walked around the store and searched for Randall. A few minutes later [REDACTED] located Randall in aisle six, which contained the store's alcohol supply.

Randall held what appeared to be a recently opened alcohol bottle, which was taken from the store's shelf. Randall drank from a bottle as he held a folding box-cutter in his right hand. According to [REDACTED] Randall made unusual movements and [REDACTED] believed he was under the influence of an unknown narcotic and was "Tweaking out." Believing Randall was a potential threat, [REDACTED] did not attempt to contact him.

At approximately 1203 hours, [REDACTED] contacted Sheriff's Dispatch and requested deputies respond to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] continued to watch Randall and prevented several customers from entering aisle six. [REDACTED] warned the customers to stay away from Randall as he was armed with a knife. As [REDACTED] awaited deputies' arrival, Randall drank a large quantity of alcohol from the bottle.

At approximately 1208 hours, Deputies Corrin Cassidy and Cameron Stanley arrived. [REDACTED] contacted the deputies near the front entry doors and escorted them to aisle six. As [REDACTED] waited several feet away, Cassidy and Stanley contacted Randall near the middle of the liquor aisle. According to [REDACTED] as Stanley and Cassidy contacted Randall, he made eye contact with them and took a fighting stance. [REDACTED] watched as Randall bladed his stance and appeared to tense his body.

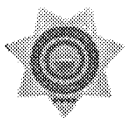

Randall held the box-cutter in one of his hands, which was down near his side. As deputies talked to Randall, he raised the box-cutter up and down, parallel with his body.

Once Randall raised the box-cutter, Stanley unholstered his handgun, but kept it down at his side. Stanley told Randall to "drop the knife," four to five times, but Randall ignored the commands. While Stanley gave Randall commands, Cassidy pointed her Taser at Randall. Randall refused to drop the knife and Cassidy deployed her Taser at Randall.

According to [REDACTED] the Taser was ineffective, and Randall ran away from deputies. Stanley yelled an unknown number of times for Randall to "Stop!" Randall eventually reached the end of the alcohol aisle, he turned, and ducked behind a large pallet of drinks. Once Randall crested the end of the aisle, [REDACTED] ran down another aisle, and lost sight of Randall, Stanley, and Cassidy. As [REDACTED] attempted to catch up, he heard three to four gunshots. [REDACTED] re-acquired view of Randall as he fell to the ground. Randall fell on his stomach and his head faced toward [REDACTED]. Due to obstructions in the aisle, [REDACTED] was unable to see Stanley or Cassidy fire any weapons.

Immediately after Randall fell to the ground, Stanley and Cassidy approached and handcuffed him. As Randall lay motionless, a large amount of suspected blood, pooled under his body. Once handcuffed, Stanley and Cassidy applied pressure to Randall's back and requested medical aid to respond.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1720 hours, Randall's surgery was completed, and his medical status was stabilized. Randall was admitted into [REDACTED] where he remained sedated.

On Saturday, August 20, 2022, at 0054 hours, Randall was absentee booked into West Valley Detention Center (WVDC) for PC 245(c).

On Sunday, August 21, 2022, at approximately 0930 hours, Detectives Justin Carty and Jonathan Ramstad contacted Randall at [REDACTED]. During the contact, Carty read Randall his Miranda Warning, and Randall declined to provide a statement. The interview was concluded and no further questions were asked.

Once the Faro completed each scan cycle, the tripod and Faro were repositioned, and additional scans were completed.

10 that said, "C. Stanley", and then city of Victorville underneath it. I
11 had green uniform pants, black pair of Danner Tachyon boots,

13 then right next to my belt buckle I had my audio recorder, extra
14 set of unit keys, my department issued firearm, which was a

5 RAMSTAD: Alright, Cameron at this time I'm going to ask you to if you can
6 provide a narrative of what exactly happened that day. If you can
7 be as descriptive as possible and start from the beginning all the
8 way to the end.

9

10 STANLEY: Okay. I started my day off at 0430 hours. I was assigned to
11 uniformed patrol in the city of Victorville. I dressed out in the
12 Class A uniform that I described earlier, I drove a marked
13 Sheriff's patrol vehicle that was --had emblems on each side,
14 and it was equipped with overhead lights and sirens. I did not go
15 to briefing that morning due to a priority call I had to go to since I
16 was out assigned to the early car. I handled the priorities at the
17 beginning of the shift when other people were in briefing. I was at
18 another priority call where a transient refused to leave a store,
19 just about half a mile from [REDACTED]

20

21 I got the dispatch broadcasted the call for service over the air.
22 They broadcasted that there was a black male adult inside
23 [REDACTED] that wore a gray tank top and black cut off sweatpants, if I
24 remember correctly around 25 to 30 years old, and he was
25 drinking from a bottle of alcohol and carried a knife in his hand,
26 which was described as a box cutter or pocketknife. Deputy
27 Cassidy and the male was not combative at the time of the
28

1 incident. Deputy Cassidy took the call for service and I
2 immediately over our computers assisted her in the call. We left
3 from the location I was at across the bridge, which I think was
4 the [REDACTED]

5
6 And we arrived at the [REDACTED] at approximately the same time.
7 She pulled into the parking lot first, she parked just south of the
8 main entrance, and we entered the store together. When we
9 entered the store, I observed that there was the store was
10 heavily populated with a lot of customers. We kind of had to like
11 maneuver around them when we entered the store. I remember
12 looking at the checkout lines and seeing a decent amount of
13 people standing in line. When we made contact with the RP, he
14 appeared to be kind of frightened. He didn't really talk to us, I
15 tried to ask him a question and he just he motioned us to follow
16 and walked at a quick pace. And when we got to the incident
17 location, which was about two, there was like the bread section
18 and then there was I believe two aisles, the large aisles.

19
20 He said, "That's the guy with the knife", said something around
21 that. And he motioned the guy and I believe I asked him, was he
22 drinking alcohol. The RP said, the reporting party sorry, confirm
23 that he was drinking alcohol and that he wanted him to leave the
24 location. I approached the suspect, I observed that he had an
25 open bottle of alcohol in his hand, which was it looked like yellow
26 margarita mix that was about halfway empty. And he appeared
27 to have drank half of it. His body language appeared to be a little
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disorientated, where he kind of fumbled when he stepped. He didn't say anything to us on the initial contact.

So, I approached I rounded the corner, walked a little bit into the aisle. The suspect kind of faced me and I believe what I said was, "Hey, man, can you do me a favor and toss the knife to the side", and he turned towards me, and he flexed both of his arms with the -- with a, it looked like a folding box knife, like a heavy duty one that you would use in like construction. And then with a bottle of alcohol in his left hand and he kind of flexed in like a aggressive manner.

Just for the record. So, what Deputy Stanley demonstrated was flexing both arms in front of his body with his elbows slightly bent, hands proximately around the waistband area, and hands balled into fists.

STANLEY:

And he there was no verbal response. I asked him again, I said, I forget how I worded it exactly. But I asked him just to drop the knife. It was the same thing, no verbal response and he with the knife in his hand, he kind of moved it back and forth, once again in an aggressive manner. At that point, I could see the look in his eyes, and he looked kind of like agitated, is the muscles in his face were kind of flexed and he was kind of like glaring at me and my partner. So, I switched to telling him to drop the knife. I told him to drop the knife. It was the same thing. He refused to

1 drop the knife. He kept flexing his arms with a knife in his hand.
2 Not moving, just staying in one spot.
3

4 I asked him again to, or I didn't ask him I told him I commanded
5 him to drop the knife a second time. Same thing, no verbal
6 response just kept his arms flexed towards us and the same look
7 in his eyes just in an aggressive manner. I told him a third time to
8 drop the knife, there was still no verbal response, and he refused
9 to drop the knife. The fourth time, same thing, he refused to drop
10 the knife, flexed his arms in the same aggressive manner just the
11 knife was going back and forth. And to me, it looked like he was,
12 if we didn't act, there was a good chance he could run after us
13 just because the aggressiveness he was putting out like I was
14 scared he was going to run after me or my partner.
15

16 So, during that time, I told Cassidy to take out her taser. And
17 then after the fourth time of telling him to drop the knife, I did not
18 feel like he would drop the knife. And I recommended that she
19 utilize her taser. She fired the taser at the suspect, the taser hit I
20 believe it was under his left chest and then his right thigh,
21 approximately around there. The taser was ineffective and the
22 suspect said, "Fuck you", grabbed the taser, pulled them and
23 then myself and Cassie both gave him commands to get on the
24 ground. I believe I told him two times to get on the ground. While
25 the taser was still, the prongs were still in him and both times he
26 refused to get on the ground. He pulled the wires and then
27 started to run away from our location.
28

1 For the safety of the public at that time, I felt like he had there
2 was a strong chance that he could stab somebody just based on
3 his physical cues and everything. So, I started to pursue after
4 him. He rounded the aisle at the end on the north side of the
5 aisle I believe it would be he rounded it. I lost sight of him just for
6 a short amount of time. When I rounded the aisle. I observed him
7 with his right hand up the knife in his hand and it appeared he
8 was lunging at my partner, Cassidy. To protect her safety and
9 mine I fired my firearm to stop him, stop the threat. Because I
10 was scared that he was going to he could have seriously injured
11 one of us or killed us. I fired my firearm, at the time I thought it
12 was four or five times once I observed that he wasn't coming
13 after us anymore and that I stopped that threat. I stopped firing
14 and I immediately went up to him.

15
16 I didn't see the knife in his hand anymore. At the time I couldn't
17 locate the knife. I holstered my firearm, and I placed handcuffs
18 on him. I didn't have gloves on. I ran out of gloves earlier in the
19 day out in my unit. So, I asked the bakery workers located to the
20 left of us for gloves. They gave me gloves. And after he was
21 handcuffed, I started to look for major bleeding to plug those
22 holes. I located I think it was his right arm, a bullet hole that was
23 heavy, bleeding heavily and I plugged that in and then with my
24 right index finger. And with my left hand I was searching for other
25 holes to plug. That's when other deputies arrived for to help with
26 medical assistance. Then there was enough people and
27 Sergeant Laing took me away from that spot and he asked me
28

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1 how many shots I fired in which direction and then they had me
2 step away from the scene.
3
4 RAMSTAD: Okay, thank you for that. We're going to go back to the
5 beginning. What time was that about that she got that and
6 received that call for service?
7
8 STANLEY: I think it was around 11, 11-ish.
9
10 RAMSTAD: How long did it take you to respond from the location that you're
11 at, to by the time you got to the store?
12
13 STANLEY: It was only half a mile away, so it took approximately a minute.
14
15 RAMSTAD: Now hearing that you had a person that was armed with
16 potentially knife inside the store. When you arrived, you said that
17 store was heavily populated?
18
19 STANLEY: Mm-hmm.
20
21 RAMSTAD: How did that make you feel?
22
23 STANLEY: It made me worried about the safety of the customers, it's not
24 very typical for someone to have an open knife and a busy store
25 like that. So, it already makes like, makes the situation different
26 than other situations because we get numerous calls where
27 people have knives, but it's usually closed in their in their pocket.
28

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1 This one, it was open. So, it already makes you worried for the
2 public safety.
3
4 RAMSTAD: Describe [REDACTED] Supermarket.
5
6 STANLEY: It's a large supermarket that it's like discounted food. What's it
7 called? Like a warehouse store? With all different kinds of food.
8
9 RAMSTAD: If you can give an approximate how many customers would you
10 say were in the store that day?
11
12 STANLEY: That I saw, I would say 75 plus, if not more, and that's just from
13 entering the store.
14
15 RAMSTAD: When you met with the RP at the door, you said that he couldn't
16 he didn't describe anything. He just motioned for you to walk with
17 him.
18
19 STANLEY: Mm-hmm.
20
21 RAMSTAD: When you made contact with the suspect. Did you recognize him
22 from any previous contacts?
23
24 STANLEY: No, I've never seen him before.
25
26 RAMSTAD: And when you first made contact with him, how -- what was your
27 distance between you and him?
28

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1 STANLEY: I would approximate about 15 feet.

2

3 RAMSTAD: At some point did you believe that the suspect was under the
4 influence of drugs or alcohol or suffering from any type of mental
5 illness?

6

7 STANLEY: Mental illness, I'm not sure I didn't get to talk to him to learn that
8 but I believe that he was under the influence of alcohol due to
9 the half empty bottle of the margarita mix. And then just the way
10 he when he because when I first contacted him, he was leaning
11 up against the side of the aisle and when he walked to the
12 middle when I did contact him. He just he had an unsteady gait
13 like he was kind of wobbling.

14

15 RAMSTAD: Did you happen to see any of those margarita bottles in the store
16 on that aisle?

17

18 STANLEY: I didn't pay attention.

19

20 RAMSTAD: Can you describe the lighting conditions inside the store at that
21 time of day?

22

23 STANLEY: It was well lit. It appeared that they had all their lights on.

24

25 RAMSTAD: If you can give an approximate, describe that knife for me.

26

27

28

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1 STANLEY: It looked like a folding box cutting knife like the best way I would
2 put it would be like a Millikan box cutting knife. I'm not sure what
3 brand it was but that's just what I'm familiar with. It's like a heavy
4 duty one, about I would say five, six inches with the blade only
5 being like an inch.
6
7 RAMSTAD: At the time now that you've already talked to the RP and now
8 that you're contacting the suspect, at some point was probable
9 cause of a suspected crime established? And if so, what crime.
10
11 STANLEY: The crimes I established was if he didn't enter or didn't leave the
12 store, trespassing. He appeared to be under the influence of
13 alcohol. So, we had public intoxication and when I saw the knife
14 open, I had reasonable suspicion that he and the way he
15 approached me and my partner we had brandishing a knife.
16
17 RAMSTAD: At that moment in time, what was your goal?
18
19 STANLEY: My goal is to stop anything from happening any harm to the
20 public, to detain, to deescalate the situation and detain the
21 suspect.
22
23 RAMSTAD: Okay. And during your initial contact, you described the suspect
24 as being aggressive. Tell me more about that.
25
26 STANLEY: When we usually contact people, they don't usually look the way
27 he looked. He kind of went into like a like a squared stance. Like
28

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1 he was prepared to either fight especially the way his arms were
2 held. They were flexing with a knife in his hand. That gave me a
3 strong indication that if we did approach him closer, he could
4 have acted and could have attacked us. And then just no verbal
5 communication from him. He didn't give me any hint that he
6 wanted to deescalate. Just his whole-body language was just
7 like he was ready to fight.
8
9 RAMSTAD: How did that make you feel? Knowing that he was armed with a
10 knife, and he was not being verbal with you.
11
12 STANLEY: It made me worried for mine and my partner's safety at the
13 moment. Because like I said, it's not every day that someone
14 acts like that with a knife in their hand, and I felt like he could
15 very easily run after us with a knife and attempt to slash or stab
16 us.
17
18 RAMSTAD: At what point did you pull out your firearm?
19
20 STANLEY: Pulled out my firearm after when I first approached him and I
21 asked him the first time to drop the knife and when he turned his
22 body towards me, I pulled out my firearm just in case he ran after
23 us.
24
25 RAMSTAD: What made you choose that weapon system?
26
27
28

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1 STANLEY: I chose my firearm because when him having a knife in his hand,
2 he had a lethal weapon. And I wanted to match his weapon with
3 the lethal weapon and be able to stop the threat if he did come
4 after us.
5
6 RAMSTAD: In your opinion to the knife that he had, could that weapon of
7 cause great bodily injury or death to you or someone else?
8
9 STANLEY: I believe it could, yes.
10
11 RAMSTAD: Tell me more about the verbal commands that were given to
12 Randall and how he responded to you or Cassidy.
13
14 STANLEY: Initially, I asked him to drop the knife. He just kept doing the
15 same motions like flexing his arms and no verbal communication
16 with us. I asked him again to drop the knife, same thing, flexing
17 his arms, no verbal communication. And then I started to
18 command that you drop the knife. I commanded him once. No
19 verbal communication, he just flexed his arms and refused to
20 drop it. I know my partner Deputy Cassidy she was she started
21 giving commands for him to drop the knife and he didn't listen to
22 either one of us throughout any of the commands.
23
24 RAMSTAD: If you remember what were those commands?
25
26 STANLEY: The commands were, "Drop the knife, toss the knife to the side",
27 I believe.
28

1 RAMSTAD: At what point did you tell Cassidy to pull out her taser?

2

3 STANLEY: I believe it was after I asked him to drop the knife and he refused
4 to answer. I think it was after I asked him twice. And then I told
5 her to pull out the taser and then I started commanding him to
6 drop the knife.

7

8 RAMSTAD: And tell me your mindset with having your partner pull out a less
9 lethal option.

10

11 STANLEY: The less lethal options my mindset was telling her to pull it out is
12 if he doesn't comply and he stays there with the knife in his hand
13 we can't approach him. Because it puts us it pretty much makes
14 our own exigency where he could very easily reach us more.
15 And if we are able to use utilize the taser, we could detain him
16 without approaching him with a knife in his hand. My mindset
17 was if we could get the taser deployment and have split the belt
18 which usually we try and split the belt with the taser and get one
19 above the belt line one below the belt line. And it usually causes
20 them to seize up and fall and drop anything in their hand. So I
21 believe that if we could get that it would deescalate the situation
22 without him running away or without him running towards us with
23 the knife.

24

25 RAMSTAD: You described whenever Cassidy deployed her taser you saw
26 the probes hit the suspect.

27

28

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1 STANLEY: Yeah.

2

3 RAMSTAD: After the probes hit the suspect. You said that the suspect
4 grabbed the taser. I just want to clarify; did you mean he grabbed
5 the taser or he grabbed the probes?
6

6

7 STANLEY: The probes, the wires that were sticking out of the probes.

8

9 RAMSTAD: What was the distance between Cassidy, if you can give an
10 approximate, between Cassidy and the suspect at the time she
11 deployed the taser.
12

12

13 STANLEY: Our initial contact was about 15 feet. I believe we walked a few
14 steps towards him during our contact which would put us about
15 10 to 15 feet and just for a better split of the belt.
16

16

17 RAMSTAD: Can you give an approximate on how long that taser was
18 activated for while those probes were in the suspect?
19

19

20 STANLEY: Let's say three to five seconds.

21

22 RAMSTAD: Just to confirm you said that there was zero effect on the suspect
23 with the taser.
24

24

25 STANLEY: Yeah, it didn't look like it did anything effective.
26
27
28

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1 RAMSTAD: After the taser was in effected or ineffective, how did that make
2 you feel?
3
4 STANLEY: It really made me more worried for our safety and the stores
5 because that was one option that we had that did not work. And
6 at that point, it just, he could have ran after us or went after a
7 customer from that point forward, and it didn't work. So, it just
8 made me worried.
9
10 RAMSTAD: You describe that.
11
12 CARTY: Let's go ahead and take a break, 1401 hours.
13
14 RAMSTAD: Alright, we're going to go back on tape at 1409 hours. Cameron
15 after the taser was ineffective and the suspect Randall pulls the
16 probes out and says, "Fuck you". Tell me what happens next.
17
18 STANLEY: He turns away from me and my partner and he starts running, I
19 believe it would be north down the aisle. And then he -- I pursue
20 after him because at that point, I'm worried about the safety of
21 the public as well and the other customers inside the store. Since
22 it is a heavy populated store, he could have ran into someone
23 and cause serious harm or injury or death to someone else. He
24 turned the corner to go east towards the look like it was the
25 bread aisle. But if you kept going through the bread aisle, you
26 could get to the main doorway. I pursued after him and when he
27 turned the corner to go east, he I lost sight of him for a quick
28

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1 second. Not a quick second, but just for a brief time period and
2 when I turned the corner, he had the knife raised in the air with
3 his right hand, I was about five, five to eight feet, I would say
4 around there away from him. My partner was right next to me to
5 the right and she was actually I would say closer to him. The
6 lighting in the store was good. At that time, I perceived the threat
7 and I point, pointed my firearm towards him and shot due to the
8 exigency of him being that close. With the first I would say the
9 first and second shot I didn't have a clear picture in my sights.
10 But after that, I remember my sights being on his person when I
11 shot.
12
13 RAMSTAD: When you say that you did point and shot. Describe your feet
14 placement in your grip on your gun.
15
16 STANLEY: The grip on my gun was I kept two hands on my gun through the
17 whole time from the moment I pulled it out. Even through running
18 I had both hands on my gun pointed in his direction. My feet
19 placement, I just got done running, so if I remember correctly, it
20 was a little bladed. And I was still moving when I perceived the
21 threat and started firing.
22
23 RAMSTAD: What was your backdrop at the time of the shooting?
24
25 STANLEY: My backdrop because I was -- I ran a little bit past where he was
26 behind him. It was like cases and bottles of soda and other
27 drinks. So, my backdrop would have been into those.
28

1 RAMSTAD: You described that there was an immediate threat to your
2 partner from Randall as he held the knife over his head, and you
3 motion coming down in a forward angle. What would have
4 happened if you did not use force?
5
6 STANLEY: If I didn't use force, I believe that he would have stabbed or
7 slashed my partner.
8
9 RAMSTAD: And when you describe it the weapon system on your belt you
10 said that you had OC spray. Why was that not a viable option at
11 that time?
12
13 STANLEY: It wasn't a good option because I felt like I would have had to get
14 closer to him for an accurate spray. Plus, it could have hindered
15 myself or my partner because we were in an enclosed area. And
16 it could have hindered if we didn't need to do anything else. I
17 don't believe that we, it was a good option for this situation.
18
19 RAMSTAD: In your opinion, do you believe that OC spray would have been
20 effective in stopping him from coming forward with a knife?
21
22 STANLEY: I don't believe so I think he could have still, even if it hurt his
23 eyes or made it where you couldn't see, I think he could have still
24 came at us.
25
26 RAMSTAD: You also said that you were equipped with a rapid containment
27 baton. Explain why that wasn't a viable option.
28

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1 STANLEY: I don't think that's a viable option just because we would have
2 had to get closer to him and it would have caused more exigency
3 for like made our own exigency. And he could have got, he could
4 have very easily if we put ourselves closer to him than he could
5 have reached us with the knife easier.

6
7 RAMSTAD: And you explained that you had also equipped with a taser.

8
9 STANLEY: Correct.

10
11 RAMSTAD: Explain why you didn't choose your taser as a viable option.

12
13 STANLEY: I didn't choose my taser as a viable option because Cassidy had
14 her taser out. And when we with the training for these situations,
15 we're always trained to meet lethal with lethal and only have less
16 lethal if you have a lethal out as well. And since she had her less
17 lethal out, I didn't think it was viable for me to have less lethal out
18 as well, because it puts us in the safety situation if you would
19 have came at us in we already saw once that it was ineffective
20 as well.

21
22 RAMSTAD: You said, just going back a brief second, you said as he turned
23 the corner from the aisle. You lost visual for a quick second or a
24 short time. Can you give an approximate on exactly what you
25 mean?

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1 STANLEY: I would say about a second. I lost visual of him just because he
2 turned the corner, and I was still in the aisle and there was the
3 divider of the aisle prevented me to see him. And then when I
4 turned the corner, I was able to observe him again.
5
6 RAMSTAD: You said that you were between five and eight feet away from
7 Randall at the time of the Lethal Force Encounter. Was that for
8 all of your shots, or just for the first few? Describe that to me.
9
10 STANLEY: It was for the first few. When I saw him with a knife in his hand, I
11 believe I took a few steps back after I perceived the threat.
12
13 RAMSTAD: At the time of the shooting, did you have any visual obstructions?
14
15 STANLEY: No.
16
17 RAMSTAD: Was there any potential for crossfire between deputies or any
18 citizens in the store at the time of the shooting?
19
20 STANLEY: I did not observe any.
21
22 RAMSTAD: At the time of the shooting, did you hear your gunshots?
23
24 STANLEY: Yes, I did.
25
26 RAMSTAD: Could you hear what anyone else was saying?
27
28

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1 STANLEY: I cannot. I didn't hear anyone saying anything.
2
3 RAMSTAD: If any tell me what commands were given just prior to the
4 shooting.
5
6 STANLEY: Just prior to, just the same commands. I think the last command
7 that I gave was get on the ground when Cassidy deployed her
8 taser.
9
10 RAMSTAD: If you did not fire your weapon, what do you think would have
11 happened?
12
13 STANLEY: I think that Deputy Cassidy would have been stabbed or slashed.
14
15 RAMSTAD: At the initial time of the incident, you remember firing four to five
16 rounds. Why did you stop firing?
17
18 STANLEY: I stopped firing because I observed that the threat was gone. I
19 didn't observe the knife in the suspect's hand anymore. And he
20 fell to the ground, and I did not think he would come at us
21 anymore.
22
23 RAMSTAD: You said medical aid responded. Who requested medical aid? If
24 you know.
25
26 STANLEY: Cassidy, she requested medical aid over the air.
27
28

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1 RAMSTAD: And describe to me, what is over the air?
2
3 STANLEY: We have our radios on us and she messaged to dispatch over
4 the radio. It's a police radio, handheld but we, our myself and
5 Cassidy, I believe she did had an earpiece and a mic that's
6 attached to her uniform and --
7
8 [REDACTED] Motioning towards the collar area.
9
10 STANLEY: -- and she asked for medical aid.
11
12 RAMSTAD: You describe Randall suffered from multiple gunshot wounds
13 and that you were rendering aid. And specifically, you said you
14 were attempting to plug his gunshot wounds, describe that to
15 me.
16
17 STANLEY: When I say plug a gunshot wound, I use my finger to block any
18 major bleeding so he would not bleed out.
19
20 RAMSTAD: And what was your intent with that?
21
22 STANLEY: To preserve his life to make it where he didn't bleed out and die
23 right or at all.
24
25 RAMSTAD: After the shooting, what if anything did Randall say?
26
27 STANLEY: I don't remember anything.
28

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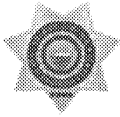
1 RAMSTAD: And if you can remember, after the LFE occurred, how long did it
2 take for medical personnel to arrive on scene?
3
4 STANLEY: I believe it was within five minutes.
5
6 RAMSTAD: Okay, I'm sure my partner Justin will have some questions for
7 you. Are you still doing okay?
8
9 STANLEY: Yeah.
10
11 CARTY: Okay. Just some clarifying stuff. You said that you in the
12 beginning you assisted but over your computer, describe how
13 you assist a call for service on your computer.
14
15 STANLEY: We have a little a tab we could type into and to do it easily
16 without having to like message dispatch over our police radio. I
17 typed in A-E and then Cassidy's callsign, which I forget which it
18 was, I believe it was 17 "Paul" 24. But I so if it was "Paul" 24 I
19 would have typed in A-E-1-7-P-2-4, and that would have put me
20 on her call as well.
21
22 CARTY: And you stated you contacted the reporting party. Was the
23 reporting party a store employee?
24
25 STANLEY: Yes, he was.
26
27
28

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1 CARTY: And you told us earlier the suspect grabbed the taser. Describe
2 what hand he grabbed the taser darts with and if he still held
3 anything in his hands when he was grabbing these darts.
4
5 STANLEY: If I remember correctly when she deployed the taser, and the
6 darts struck him he dropped the bottle of alcohol out of his hand.
7 And he was able to grab the wires with his so it would be with his
8 left hand.
9
10 CARTY: Did he still hold on to the knife at that time?
11
12 STANLEY: Yes, I believe so.
13
14 CARTY: As you made contact with the suspect in the aisle. Did you
15 observe any other customers within that aisle?
16
17 STANLEY: No, I did not.
18
19 CARTY: As the suspect ran away from you guys in the aisle. Did you
20 observe any customers in his backdrop or anywhere around in
21 that area of the store?
22
23 STANLEY: I didn't observe anyone, no. Not that I saw.
24
25 CARTY: And then, once the suspect turns that corner and you begin to
26 fire your duty weapon, can you describe the cadence in which
27 your rounds were fired?
28

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1 STANLEY: They were all consecutive. Those, like is that what you're
2 asking?
3
4 CARTY: Yeah.
5
6 STANLEY: Were consecutive or not?
7
8 CARTY: So, 1-2-3-4 or what was the cadence?
9
10 STANLEY: It was 1-2-3-4-5-6-7.
11
12 CARTY: Okay, all in a row?
13
14 STANLEY: Yes.
15
16 CARTY: Okay. I think that's all I have for now.
17
18 RAMSTAD: Did you see where the knife went?
19
20 STANLEY: No, I did not.
21
22 RAMSTAD: Alright, do you have anything, anything else Justin? Okay. We
23 are going to conclude this interview at 1623 hours.

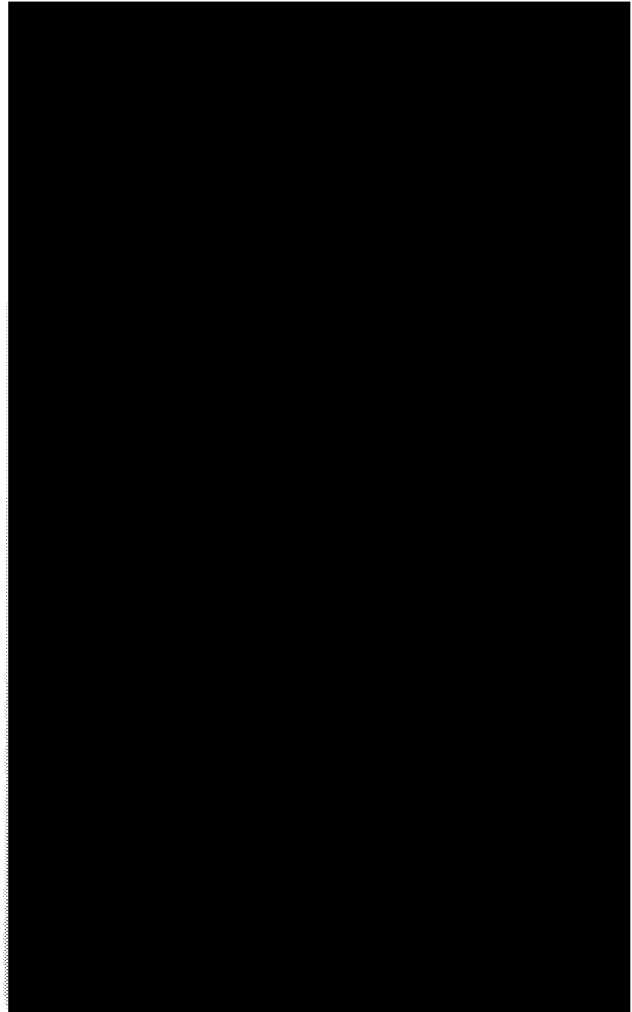

Cassidy had a cloth United States flag sewn above her right breast pocket. Cassidy had a gold-colored nameplate pinned underneath the flag. The nameplate displayed "C. Cassidy" in black lettering. Cassidy had a gold-colored San Bernardino County Sheriff's badge pinned above her left breast pocket. Cassidy's shirt displayed San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department patches on both the right and left shoulders.



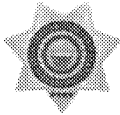

3 CASSIDY: 17P23. So, beat three for the city.

4

5 CARTY: What was your unit number?

7 CASSIDY: I don't remember.

9 CARTY: Did you have a rider or a partner?

11 CASSIDY: No.

13 CARTY: What uniform were you wearing that day?

14

15 CASSIDY: I was wearing my class A uniform, which was a tan buttoned
16 down with my badge on the left side of my chest, a nameplate on
17 the right side of my chest. A black bulletproof vest underneath.
18 For my pants, I wore the green BDU's. I had the regular trouser
19 belt, the duty belt. I wore my department issued belt recorder, my
20 handcuff case, my gun on my right side of my hip. To the rear of
21 that was my unit keys. I had a tourniquet on the left side. I had
22 pepper spray, my taser and three magazines.

23

24 CARTY: And then.

26 CASSIDY: I had black boots and I had sheriff's patches on both of my
27 shoulders.

2 CARTY: Alright. Did you have your belt recorder activated?

10 CARTY: Were you wearing a body-worn camera?

24 incident?

26 CASSIDY: The night prior I had held over until about 1230 and I came in at
27 about 10 o'clock the day of the shooting. I think I had, I probably
28

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1 had about eight hours of sleep.

3 CARTY: Okay and then the prior 48 hours?

4

5 CASSIDY: I would say about 16.

6

7 CARTY: Okay. Were you under a doctor's care or taking prescribed
8 medications that affected your ability to perform at the time of the
9 shooting?

10

11 CASSIDY: No.

12

13 CARTY: What weapons did you use?

14

15 CASSIDY: I used my taser.

16

17 CARTY: And how do you typically load your taser?

18

19 CASSIDY: It has two cartridges inside of it. As soon as you activate it, It's
20 already loaded.

21

22 CARTY: Were you injured?

23

24 CASSIDY: No.

25

26 CARTY: Alright Cassidy, I appreciate that. At this time, we're going to go
27 ahead and open it up to you for a narrative. If you just start at the
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beginning of your shift and give us the day's events.

CASSIDY:

Okay. Like I'd mentioned previously, I normally can't come in at seven o'clock in the morning, but due to staying over, I came in at about 10 o'clock in the morning. I got to work. I put on my class A uniform. Do you want me to go through it one more time?

CARTY:

You don't have to. You've already covered that.

CASSIDY:

Okay.

CARTY:

Thank you.

CASSIDY:

I put on my class A uniform. I loaded my patrol unit which was marked with sheriff's emblems and had emergency overhead lights and sirens. I loaded my shotgun. I parking lot loaded it. I also had a mini-14 and the less lethal shotgun in the rear. From there, I believe I handled a call at the station and then there was a vehicle pursuit I also assisted with. Then once the vehicle pursuit ended, myself and Deputy Stanley went to a call about half a mile away from [REDACTED]

Once we cleared there, I'm sorry. And that day because I came in late, I did not attend briefing. Once Deputy Stanley and I cleared the call that was about half a mile away, dispatch broadcasted a call to the beat six deputy, that there was an unwanted subject at the [REDACTED] who had either a knife or a box

1 cutter, who was drinking alcohol in the alcohol aisle. Because I
2 knew I was a short distance away, I told dispatch to send me or
3 to put me on that call and make me the primary deputy. It took
4 me maybe a minute or two to get over there.

5
6 I parked my unit directly in front of the slider doors, which would
7 almost be northeast of. When I got there, there was a heavily
8 populated parking lot and store. There was customers coming in
9 and out. I was greeted by the reporting party who was an
10 employee of [REDACTED] He came outside and he didn't really say
11 much at first. He had like, a sense of urgency. Just like, "Come
12 over here. Let me show you what the problem is." I had to kind of
13 physically maneuver through the customers that were coming in
14 and out because it was, you know, it was almost the afternoon
15 time.

16
17 Myself and Deputy Stanley kind of had to, he was walking so
18 quickly to get us there. We kind of had to speed up. I exchanged
19 a few words with the employee, something along the lines of
20 "You don't want him here?" And he's like, "Yeah, we want him,
21 we want him gone." And so, the alcohol aisle is on the right side
22 of the store, if you will. When you walk in those doors, it's directly
23 to the right and that was the alcohol aisle. Both aisles were
24 different forms of alcohol, and I observed the suspect in the aisle
25 holding the knife in his right hand and a bottle of alcohol in his
26 left. He was kind of stumbling around, had a very aggressive
27 stance. It was like, almost like, a bladed stance and he was kind
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CASSIDY:

of like, flexing like his arms with a knife still gripped in his hand.

I'm just going to pause there so I can describe that for the record. So, Deputy Cassidy put both of her arms in front of her body with both elbows bent and both hands balled in fists. And the fists were at about waist level.

At that point, you know, it's through training when we see a subject carrying a knife, you know, it's, we would utilize our firearm. But due to knowing that I had a partner with me, you know, we could utilize less lethal options. Because Stanley essentially got to the subject just a little bit before I because I was speaking with the employee. He had his firearm out and that's when you could actually hear me re-holster my gun and switch to my Taser. So, at that point, I know Stanley had asked him, "Hey, do you mind putting the knife down?" I told him or ordered him about two to three times, "Drop the knife. Put the knife down."

And I had essentially put the laser, not the sights, the taser puts two red dots on target. So, I put them on his upper body area. And at that point, I'm sorry, I back tracked a little bit, but when we first made contact with him, it was almost as if he turned his attention towards us. He didn't say anything at all, but his body language, I perceived that, you know, he acknowledged the police presence. So, when I had the lasers on him, I deployed the Taser, both of them went into his upper body and he

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immediately tried to swipe and pull them out of his body.


From there, he kind of took some steps backwards, turned and began running. At that point in time, I felt it was pertinent that I broadcast that the subject is now running through the store with a knife in his hand. For the point being, we don't know who's on the other side. There could be family and kids and, you know, we knew he was under the influence of at the very least alcohol, but we didn't know if there's a lack there of for medications, or if he's supposed to be on some sort of medications, and now he's compensating with alcohol. And we just didn't know his mental state.

So, I initially had told dispatch over my radio that you know, we would be out with the subject in the liquor aisle, and I requested a "33," which essentially means emergency traffic only. So, only myself or Stanley would be on the radio. Once he removed one or two of the taser probes and began running, that's when I felt that I needed to get that information out in the event that, he inflicted some type of injury to any customer and wanted to flee the grocery store. That way the responding deputies know, okay, he could be exiting and trying to get into a vehicle or to stage additional medical resources for additional victims.

So, once he reached towards the end of the aisle, because I was doing radio communications, less lethal, and running, he reached the outside of the aisle kind of out of view almost

1 because there's a large stand of, I think soda bottles. And like I
2 said, I still had my taser on him at that point. I was like, my main
3 goal is to disarm him. I did not give any commands at that point,
4 I'm sorry. I deployed my second cartridge, also at his upper
5 body, which was ineffective, and I believe if not seconds after or
6 at the same time, Stanley fired his firearm.

7
8 When that all happened, I wasn't necessarily expecting him to be
9 there. Most foot pursuits that I have been in, it doesn't stop until
10 we catch them. So, for him to stop and essentially ambush
11 Stanley and it was very scary. I mean, it was scary for me. I
12 didn't want to be hurt and I didn't want my partner to be hurt or
13 killed. Also, the threat to the public. I mean, he could have
14 continued on and created other victims like I had mentioned. And
15 when we had rounded that corner and he had stopped, the knife
16 was still in his right hand, and it was raised above his head
17 almost in like a slashing manner to come towards us. There was
18 nothing else there except myself and Stanley.

19
20  For the record during that last statement, Deputy Cassidy
21 demonstrated with her right hand raised above her head and
22 then bringing it forward and bringing it forward and downward in
23 like a swinging or stabbing or slashing type motion.

24
25 CASSIDY:

26 When Stanley fired his firearm, it was right next to my head and I
27 think it was the first round had struck one of the, one or several
28 of the soda bottles. So, with the explosion of the soda, the

1 firearm going off in my ear, the ringing I had, I kind of fell down
2 onto the ground. I had remained there for a couple of seconds to
3 just get more radio traffic out that shots had been fired. And
4 when I got up, I re-holstered my taser and I went to assist
5 Stanley in handcuffing the suspect and then rendering aid.
6

7 At that point, I had witnessed, or I had observed a gunshot to the
8 left arm, the right arm, the back area, which would have been
9 probably an exit wound and a finger graze. Over my radio, I
10 broadcasted that we needed medical aid and they were clear to
11 come inside of the store. I attempted to plug some of the holes to
12 stop the bleeding. And then at that point, he was wearing, the
13 suspect was wearing a grey tank top that was very small. I didn't
14 see any weapons on the top of him and you know, he was
15 wearing black shorts, and I didn't see any bulges of any other
16 weapons. So, at that point, we were more focused on rendering
17 aid than searching his person.
18

19 From there, responding deputies got on scene and they kind of
20 removed Stanley and I from the situation. I do remember there
21 was a bakery employee, I believe, but he was actually inside of
22 the bakery, but he was in somewhat of the immediate area of
23 when the incident took place.
24

25 CARTY: Okay. Thank you very much.
26

27 CASSIDY: I also recall requesting paper towels, anything to stop the
28

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1 bleeding. A trauma kit, over the air, because I knew my partners
2 would probably respond faster than Fire would get there. So, I
3 requested that, we have trauma kits inside of our patrol unit, so, I
4 requested they bring one of those in. Anything to help stop the
5 bleeding of the suspect.
6
7 CARTY: Okay. Alright. Are you guys good to continue to ask more
8 questions? All right. Just to go back a little bit. When you said
9 that you heard dispatch broadcast the call reference a man at
10 [REDACTED] that was broadcast through your police radio?
11
12 CASSIDY: Correct.
13
14 CARTY: Okay and during that broadcast, did dispatch provide any
15 additional information regarding the call for service?
16
17 CASSIDY: Not until I took the call. She broadcasted it was a Black male
18 adult, gray tank top and some sort of black cut off shorts or
19 sweats.
20
21 CARTY: Did they describe if or what weapon the suspect was holding
22 while he, during the call for service?
23
24 CASSIDY: A knife or a box cutter.
25
26 CARTY: Did they describe what that looked like?
27
28

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1 CASSIDY: No.
2
3 CARTY: Okay. When you responded, did you activate your overhead
4 lights and sirens, or did you drive normally to the incident
5 location?
6
7 CASSIDY: I drove normally.
8
9 CARTY: Now when you arrive on scene, you were contacted by an
10 employee. Describe where you were contacted and in detail
11 what information was relayed to you reference the subject inside.
12
13 [REDACTED] Can she add something to the radio broadcast answer?
14
15 CARTY: Yes, sir.
16
17 CASSIDY: The suspect was not "415," which means he was not causing a
18 disturbance while he was holding the knife and the alcohol.
19
20 CARTY: Okay.
21
22 CASSIDY: And then, I'm sorry. Were you asking what the employee?
23
24 CARTY: Yes. When you arrived at the store, you said you were contacted
25 by an employee.
26
27 CASSIDY: Correct.
28

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CARTY: Describe where you were at when the employee met with you and what exactly was exchanged between you and that employee.

CASSIDY: Yeah.

CARTY: And if there were any other department members that were there present at that time, when you spoke with the store employee.

CASSIDY: Yeah. Stanley and I arrived at the same time. We were greeted by the employee just outside of the entry doors and he just kind of like, motioned us in. He didn't really say anything and then he pointed out the suspect in the alcohol aisle. And then I just confirmed with him like, "Hey, you don't want him here?" And he's like, "No, we want him gone." And that was roughly the exchange of words.

CARTY: Okay. So, where you guys had your conversation, you had a clear view of the subject in the alcohol aisle? Or where were you guys standing?

CASSIDY: I was.

CARTY: How did he show you where the subject was?

CASSIDY: Yeah. If I remember correctly, it was like, the alcohol aisle and

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1 we were just like, about to round the corner.
2
3 CARTY: Okay.
4
5 CASSIDY: To see him.
6
7 CARTY: So, you guys walked into the store.
8
9 CASSIDY: With him.
10
11 CARTY: And were down one of the main aisles close to where the alcohol
12 aisle was?
13
14 CASSIDY: Yeah. We walked through the register area.
15
16 CARTY: Okay. Describe how you felt when you arrived on scene knowing
17 there was a man inside, armed with a knife. You said there were
18 several customers coming in and out, going and it was pretty
19 populated inside that store.
20
21 CASSIDY: Yeah.
22
23 CARTY: How did that make you feel?
24
25 CASSIDY: I mean, it sounded like a weird, like a bizarre situation. Someone
26 holding a knife, drinking alcohol inside of a grocery store. It's not
27 normal. So, my natural reaction was like okay, like you know, my
28

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1 senses were a little heightened. Granted, we do go to many calls
2 for service with people with knives, but I haven't experienced
3 anything like that day. So it was a little heightened. I was a little
4 like, worried about what could happen.

5
6 CARTY: Describe [REDACTED] Supermarket when you entered there.

7
8 CASSIDY: It's a large grocery store. It's, it's only by itself in the parking lot.
9 Like, it's not attached to any other buildings. That day in
10 particular, I mean, it's open 24 hours, but it's, from my
11 experience, it's always fairly populated with people. Especially
12 trying to get through like I said, earlier, I had to kind of maneuver
13 through people. Almost all the registers were full of people.

14
15 CARTY: Okay. So, as you meet with the store employee and you guys
16 walk towards the alcohol aisle, you said at some point you
17 unholstered your firearm. When did you, can you describe when
18 you removed your firearm?

19
20 CASSIDY: Yeah.

21
22 CARTY: From your holster.

23
24 CASSIDY: Yeah. So, when I took a couple of steps into the aisle and kind of
25 realized, okay, I can immediately tell like by his body language,
26 he turned, faced us and he did like clenching the fists and flexing
27 his arms and almost did like, kind of like a head nod and like,
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1 bobbing his head. One foot was in front of the other like in a
2 bladed stance like ready to fight. That's when I initially had pulled
3 out my firearm. I didn't pull it, remove it completely, but I just
4 pulled it up and then clicked it back into place. Because I already
5 knew that Stanley had lethal coverage, and that's when I
6 transitioned to a taser.

7
8 CARTY: Okay. We understand Randall was contacted in the alcohol aisle,
9 but can you give us, describe more of the interior, the
10 supermarket, the stores, that aisle and the distance between you
11 and Randall, as you guys make contact with him?

12
13 CASSIDY: Yeah. So, the alcohol specifically, where we were facing him, to
14 the left was more of like wine bottles and the dry liquors. And on
15 the right side was the refrigerated section with large boxes of
16 beer. He was probably about a quarter of the way up. So, we
17 only took a couple steps before we were about 10 to 15 feet
18 away from him.

19
20 CARTY: Okay and when you first contacted Randall, or at some point
21 during your contact with him, were you able to, did you believe
22 he was under the influence of any alcohol, drugs or anything?

23
24 CASSIDY: Yes, I felt he was under the influence of the very least alcohol.
25 His eyes were glossed over and there was I mean, his eyes just
26 appeared all black like there's no like, just evil in his eyes, if you
27 will.
28

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1
2 CARTY: Okay. At that point when you guys first make contact, does he,
3 describe if Randall says anything to you at all.
4
5 CASSIDY: He said nothing. No words. He didn't say anything back when we
6 gave him the commands to drop the knife. Yeah, no response.
7
8 CARTY: So, as you make contact with him, there's no response from him.
9 What are you doing at this point?
10
11 CASSIDY: So, at the very beginning or when I had my taser out?
12
13 CARTY: You said when you first contacted him, you were within 10 to 15
14 feet.
15
16 CASSIDY: Correct.
17
18 CARTY: Okay. So, at what point do you remove your taser? And what.
19
20 CASSIDY: Yeah.
21
22 CARTY: Orders and demands are you guys giving him at that point?
23
24 CASSIDY: Yeah. So, I removed my taser. I turned it to the "on" switch and I
25 put the lasers onto his chest area. I took probably a couple of
26 steps forward just to ensure that when I did deploy it, it was
27 going to be effective and on his person.
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1

2 CARTY:

Okay and describe any attempts, tactics utilized to de-escalate the situation.

3

4

5 CASSIDY:

So, Stanley asked him to drop the knife. And then when I, when we went first came up, I was like, "Hey, man, what's going on?" And you try to be, you know, it wasn't like an immediate attack on him. It was kind of like, trying to talk to him, ask him to drop the knife. Tell him to drop the knife, then utilize the taser. Our goal is to disarm him and get him into custody and see what's really going on. What kind of help he may need or if there's a crime.

6

7

14 CARTY:

Okay. At some point, was probable cause of a suspected crime established?

15

16

17 CASSIDY:

Yes. So, upon contacting the employee he confirmed, essentially, he's trespassing. We don't want him here. Upon our initial contact, we have open container, possibly public intoxication, possibly brandishing a weapon due to the blade being exposed, as well as resisting arrest. Because he was not responding to us, not following orders.

18

19

20

23

24 CARTY:

Okay. Describe where you were positioned while first contacting Randall.

25

26

27 CASSIDY:

Face to face.

28

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1

2

CARTY: Okay. Where at in the aisle or did you have cover or concealment in any place?

3

4

5

CASSIDY: No.

6

7

CARTY: Describe your observations. I know you were 10 to 15 feet away, staring at each other. Describe the weapon he had in his hand.

8

9

10

CASSIDY: Yeah. So, it appeared to be more of a box cutter, but the blade appeared larger than just the normal, maybe half inch blade. It appeared much larger, but it looked to be a box cutter more than like a kitchen knife.

11

12

13

14

15

CARTY: So, at this point, you pull out your taser, you have the laser's on his chest.

16

17

18

CASSIDY: Yeah.

19

20

CARTY: What commands are being given and when do you decide to fire the first cartridge?

21

22

23

CASSIDY: After several commands to drop the knife and to put it down by myself and Stanley, I know on audio, he says just do it, basically. Just to get the probes in him and once I deployed the first cartridge, I told him to get on the ground about two to three times I would say, and he ignored those by trying to pull out the probes

24

25

26

27

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1 and then began running.

2

3 CARTY: Prior to you deploying your taser, describe how Randall held the
4 knife and what hand it was in.

5

6 CASSIDY: It was in his right hand, and a complete grip on the knife the
7 whole time. He never looked to consider dropping it. It was in his
8 hand the whole time and with a clenched fist.

9

10 CARTY: Okay. At the time of deployment, what is your distance between
11 you and Randall at this point?

12

13 CASSIDY: I would say it's still about 10 to 15.

14

15 CARTY: Feet?

16

17 CASSIDY: Feet.

18

19 CARTY: Okay. Describe if the taser was effective or ineffective and what
20 response Randall had to the taser?

21

22 CASSIDY: It was ineffective. Like I said he had tried to swipe it, pull out the
23 probes. I don't recall him saying anything. I more heard, grunting
24 and then taking steps back to, to run away from it.

25

26 CARTY: Okay. Describe at this time where your partner, Stanley is
27 standing when you deploy those taser darts and now Randall's

28

1 back, trying to pull the tasers out and run.

2

3 CASSIDY: Yeah. For the most part, we were side by side. I think when I
4 took a couple of steps forward to get a better angle on the
5 suspect, I think he was maybe just a step or two behind me. And
6 then we ran together until we got to the end of the aisle.

7

8 CARTY: Describe the immediate threat Randall posed as he held the
9 knife and began to run away from you guys in the aisle.

10

11 CASSIDY: At that point, my fear for the safety of the public was probably at
12 its highest peak. Because like I said, again, I didn't know who
13 was on other sides of, you know, there's, I had already seen
14 families, children, just so many people inside of that store. I
15 mean, he could have easily, you know, stabbed whoever and
16 tried to flee and then do what he also did is stop, turn towards us
17 and attempt to ambush us.

18

19 CARTY: Okay. As your taser darts are ineffective and he's still holding the
20 knife and now running away from you guys, how did that make
21 you feel?

22

23 CASSIDY: I was scared. For me personally, I have used my taser numerous
24 times and I've always been successful in getting them into
25 custody and disarming them or whatever the case was at the
26 time. So, this was the very first time that my taser did not work
27 on someone. So, it was even more scary for me because I was

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1 like, okay, this person has a knife. They're trying to hurt or kill my
2 partner, myself and anyone in that store.

3
4 CARTY: After your first deployment of your taser darts, were any other
5 less lethal weapon systems used?
6

7 CASSIDY: No, just the taser, but I had deployed the second cartridge once
8 we had finished running through the aisle.
9

10 CARTY: Okay. As you're now running through the aisle, what's in your
11 backdrop? What do you see behind Randall as he's running
12 through this aisle? Do you see customers? Anybody at the end
13 of the aisle or anybody within the aisle with you guys?
14

15 CASSIDY: In that moment, I don't recall seeing anyone, but I mean, after
16 reviewing the video, it appeared there was, there was a couple,
17 like a male and a female, while running, not looking at him when
18 we turned.
19

20 CARTY: And describe how you felt as Randall turned that corner from the
21 aisle you guys were running.
22

23 CASSIDY: I was worried that he would continue to run and hurt someone. I
24 don't think I was expecting him to stop and swing the knife at us.
25

26 CARTY: Describe your distance between you and Randall as he makes,
27 gets to the end of the aisle. And you say he turns around and an
28

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1 end display of soda, I believe you said, as he turns around. What
2 is your distance between you and him at that point?
3
4 CASSIDY: I'd say it was about three to five feet.
5
6 CARTY: Describe what you observed when you turn that corner. Did you
7 ever lose sight of Randall as he turned the corner to that display
8 stand?
9
10 CASSIDY: I don't think I lost sight of him, but I think like, when he turned
11 and faced us, because before, we just saw his back. So, I think it
12 was more of the alarm of like, oh shoot. He's facing us now, and
13 now the knife is in the air. That was
14
15 CARTY: Okay. Describe that in detail as far as the knife in the air.
16 Describe how he's holding it, what the knife looks like, what he's
17 doing with his body, if he's saying anything.
18
19 CASSIDY: Yeah. I don't recall him saying anything. So, the knife appeared
20 to be like a dark silver color. Maybe rusted a bit, but I just
21 remember the blade was exposed and it was fairly large. He still
22 held it like gripped in his hand and while it was up in the air, the
23 blade was facing like, downward and towards us.
24
25 CARTY: Okay. Just to clarify, you're demonstrating by holding your right
26 hand up above your head and coming in a downward motion.
27
28

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1 CASSIDY: Correct.

2

3 [REDACTED] With the blade protruding from the pinky side of his fist.

4

5 CASSIDY: Yeah.

6

7 CARTY: Describe your decision to utilize the taser you used versus any
8 other less lethal option.

9

10 CASSIDY: I felt the taser would be most effective if it worked because it
11 would, you know, cause the neuromuscular incapacitation, which
12 would lock up the body and essentially release the knife or the
13 box cutter from his hand. I felt if I would have utilized my baton I
14 could have still been injured. And then you know pepper spray,
15 it's, it just, I feel like that would just not work due to possibly
16 incapacitating myself or my partner, just making it worse. There's
17 no guarantee that he would drop the knife with pepper spray.

18

19 CARTY: Okay. Indicate the [REDACTED] you've received to operate the taser.
20 Any special circumstances or distances?

21

22 CASSIDY: Yeah. So, I believe per the manual, it's about effective at about
23 15 to 25 feet, but based on my personal experiences and
24 [REDACTED], it's more about 10 to 15 feet. I was [REDACTED] in the
25 academy. I had been tased before with the same taser.

26

27 CARTY: Okay. I know you said you utilized your laser. There was also

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1 sight on that taser. Did you rely on the laser, the two lasers
2 themselves or did you utilize your front sight?
3

4 CASSIDY: I relied on the lasers themselves.
5

6 CARTY: Okay and describe your stance grip, your point of aim during the
7 second taser deployment.
8

9 CASSIDY: I believe I had just came to like a stop from running. My arm was,
10 my right arm was still holding the taser, still pointed outward
11 towards his upper body. Due to the time sensitivity and the
12 rapidness of the situation, I didn't give any commands. My main
13 goal was to hopefully disarm him and that's why I deployed the
14 second cartridge.
15

16 CARTY: Do you believe the second cartridge darts struck the suspect?
17

18 CASSIDY: Yes.
19

20 CARTY: Okay. Did it have any effect on him?
21

22 CASSIDY: No.
23

24 CARTY: After you deploy your second darts, what happens next?
25

26 CASSIDY: That's when, I think I had mentioned before, I think it was
27 possible that he was tased and struck by gunfire at the same
28

1 time. So the soda bottles had exploded from one or the first or
2 second round from Stanley's firearm. So, when that exploded, I
3 fired my taser and his gun was right by my ear, I just had fell
4 backwards. So, when I had fallen down to the ground, I heard
5 the brass clank on the ground. I had heard my taser kind of
6 clacking from being ineffective and that's when I broadcasted
7 over the air that, shots have been fired. And then that's when I
8 got up, assisted in handcuffing, assisted in rendering medical aid
9 and then requesting additional resources through dispatch.

10
11 CARTY: Okay. You stated you round the corner was as if Randall
12 ambushed you guys. Can you just describe "ambush" for me,
13 please?

14
15 CASSIDY: Yes. So, once he took off running down the liquor aisle and went
16 to make that right turn, he did have the, that cover, like the
17 concealment to hide behind. He essentially stopped as he was
18 rounding the corner, turned around, and then brought the knife
19 up into the air and instead of continuing to run. So, in my opinion,
20 I felt that would be most adequately described as "ambushed."

21
22 CARTY: Okay. Describe how much time elapsed from the time you shot
23 your second taser darts to the time you heard the first gunshot
24 being fired.

25
26 CASSIDY: I think it was about 12 seconds.

27
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The second taser dart, not the first.

CARTY:

Yeah. From the time you deployed your second taser darts towards the suspect. Between that and then the beginning of gunfire.

CASSIDY:

I think it was only about a couple of seconds. So, then if he were to have been tased and shot at the same time, I mean, there's a five second ride on each cartridge. So, it's still possible that he was potentially getting the effects of that second cartridge.

CARTY:

Describe what you heard as far as if anyone else was giving commands or saying anything at the time just prior to the LFE?

CASSIDY:

I don't recall hearing anything or anyone say anything.

CARTY:

What was your intent in firing your taser?

CASSIDY:

To disarm the suspect and to get him detained into custody.

CARTY:

Do you remember seeing anyone else in the area at the time of the shooting or the backdrop?

CASSIDY:

The only person that I recall seeing was the gentleman working in the bakery, but he was inside of the bakery. And behind barriers of the countertops and things like that.

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1 CARTY: Okay. Where did Randall fall? And what, if anything, was in his
2 hands?

3
4 CASSIDY: Because I had fallen onto the ground, I didn't see where he had
5 fell. But when I got up, I think Stanley had already moved him
6 onto his stomach. And then that's when I assisted in putting his
7 hands behind his back and getting him into handcuffs. I don't
8 remember seeing anything else really. I don't remember seeing
9 the knife. I don't remember seeing alcohol.

10
11 CARTY: Okay. Earlier, you stated that you requested medical aid to
12 respond.

13
14 CASSIDY: Correct.

15
16 CARTY: And you also provided medical aid.

17
18 CASSIDY: Correct.

19
20 CARTY: Describe how long it took from the time you fell down on the
21 ground, to you begin now providing life saving measures to the
22 suspect on the ground and what medical aid you provided.

23
24 CASSIDY: So, from the time that I fell onto the ground and got up to assist
25 in rendering aid to him, I would say it was only a few seconds.
26 But by the time that Victorville Fire and AMR, American Medical
27 Response, responded, it had to be at least under five minutes or
28

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1 around there.

2

3 CARTY: Okay. Describe what medical aid you performed or provided to
4 Randall.

5

6 CASSIDY: I kind of assisted in pointing out the wounds that he had and then
7 I applied pressure to the left arm where there was a gunshot
8 wound.

9

10 CARTY: Okay. Describe Randall's injuries. Did Randall say anything to
11 you after he fell to the ground? And if so, what?

12

13 CASSIDY: I don't remember hearing him say anything. His eyes were open.
14 I was trying to get him to talk to me. I know I had said that
15 several times. And he had a gunshot wound to his left arm, right
16 arm. I believe there was an exit wound in his back area and a
17 finger graze to one of his fingers on his hands.

18

19 CARTY: And after you requested medical aid, how long was it until
20 medical personnel arrived on scene? And what type of life saving
21 measures did you see them perform, if any?

22

23 CASSIDY: Yeah. I believe it was under five minutes or about five minutes
24 and I was not present to see what they did. I had been kind of
25 pulled away at that point.

26

27 CARTY: Okay. I think my partner might have some follow up questions.

28

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1

2 RAMSTAD: You guys doing, ok?

3

4 CARTY: Are you doing ok right now?

5

6 RAMSTAD: I got a few questions for you. You said at some point, a crime
7 was established. What crime were you going to arrest him for?

8

9 CASSIDY: So, at that point, you know, the employee had confirmed that he
10 was trespassing. They didn't want him there due to him having a
11 knife and he had opened a bottle of alcohol and began drinking
12 it. So, at that point, just get him detained and get him identified
13 and kind of go from there and get him away from the property.

14

15 RAMSTAD: If you guys didn't use force, what do you think he would have
16 done with that knife?

17

18 CASSIDY: I think he would have hurt or killed someone for sure.

19

20 RAMSTAD: Okay and based off your description of that knife. Would you
21 classify that knife as a deadly weapon that could cause great
22 bodily injury or harm?

23

24 CASSIDY: Yes.


25

26 RAMSTAD: Alright.

27

28

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1 CARTY: There's one final question. When you first contacted Randall and
2 you asked him to drop the knife. If he would've dropped the
3 knife, what would you guys have done at that point?
4
5 CASSIDY: At that point, I would have got the knife away from him and told
6 him to put his hands behind his back, order him to his knees or
7 somewhere where we had an advantage, put him in handcuffs
8 and kind of went from there.
9

8 anything, continued to grip onto it. And same thing the third time.
9 Nothing, no response, continued to hold it.

11 CARTY: Okay. Earlier you described that when you shot your taser, the
12 darts impacted his chest area. Describe in detail where those
13 taser probes hit, darts hit on his chest, if able to.

14

15 CASSIDY: It was the upper torso area, more on the right side of his chest.

16

17 CARTY: Describe the distance between each dart if you can.

18

19 CASSIDY: I would say they were both, I'd say maybe the top laser was on
20 his like, the upper torso like, nipple area or clavicle area and then
21 the stomach on the second laser.

22

23 CARTY: Okay. Earlier you described that during the lethal force
24 encounter, you heard brass hitting the ground. Describe "brass
25 hitting the ground."

27 CASSIDY: The gun shell casings from Stanley firing his duty weapon. It was

13 anything, it kind of makes like a clacking sound. And yeah, those

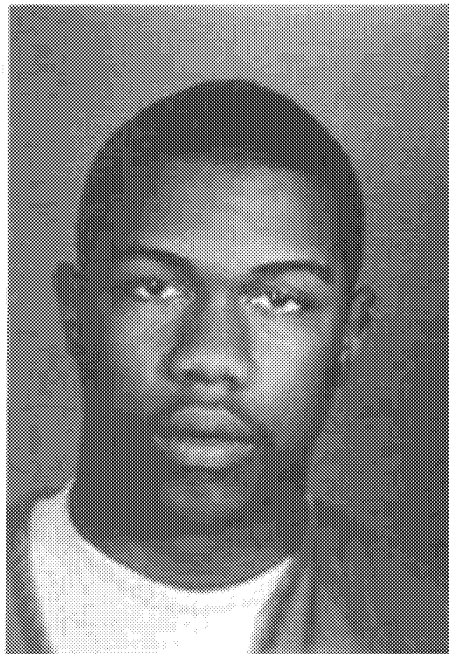

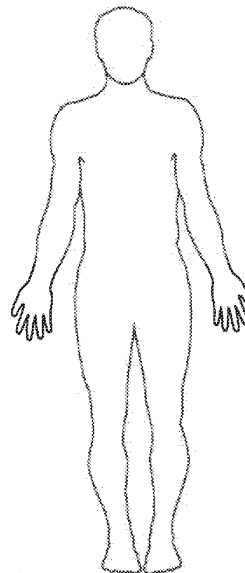

Victorville deputies contacted Randall inside [REDACTED] as he continued to hold the knife and drank from the alcohol bottle. Deputies gave Randall multiple commands to drop the knife multiple times, which Randall ignored. Randall ran from deputies and ignored all commands to drop the knife. Randall ran away from deputies with the knife in his hand and continued around the corner of an aisle. Once around the corner out of sight from the deputies, Randall stopped and turned toward deputies. As the deputies approached, Randall raised the knife over his head and swung the knife at them. Deputies attempted to back away, a lethal force encounter occurred, and Randall was struck by gunfire. Deputies rendered medical aid to Randall, who was later transported to a hospital for further treatment.

Randall – "Yeah."

Randall – "Uhhh na I have nothing to say, I said no I have nothing to say."

I concluded the interview with Randall and no further investigative questions were asked.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, I was assigned as a CPS/APS Deputy in the city of Victorville. At about 1225 hours, I assisted Deputies with an assault with a deadly weapon investigation at the [REDACTED] in the city of Victorville. I arrived on scene at 1225 hours.

REPORTING PARTY INTERVIEW: [REDACTED]

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at about 1235 hours, I contacted [REDACTED] inside the [REDACTED] supermarket. The following is a summary of what he stated.

[REDACTED] was the supervisor at the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was approached by a coworker, identified as [REDACTED] and advised there was a black male adult, later identified as Todderick Randall, walked around the store with a knife. NARRATIVE**ASSIGNMENT/ARRIVAL:**

On Friday, August 19, 2022, from 0700 hours to 1900 hours, I was assigned uniformed Patrol in the City of Victorville as 17P71, mall detail. I wore a Class D uniform and drove a marked patrol sheriff's unit, equipped with a steady, forward-facing red light and sirens.

At about 1212 hours, I self-initiated to assist Deputies at [REDACTED] reference to an unwanted subject. At about 1214 hours, I arrived on scene.

DEPUTY OBSERVATIONS/ACTIONS:

I arrived at the location and assisted Deputy D. Ramos with crowd control. I gathered [REDACTED] employee's who stood outside the business and escorted the employee's through the left main entrance to the business and staged them pending further investigation.

Deputies inside the business broadcasted medical personnel were exiting the business with Randall to transport him by ground to [REDACTED] to be flown to [REDACTED] for further treatment. I positioned my assigned patrol vehicle (17-04) behind the ambulance. I exited my patrol vehicle, walked toward the ambulance and I opened the rear door to Ambulance VC143, medical personnel placed Randall in the rear and closed the doors.

At about 1223 hours, I entered by patrol vehicle (17-04) followed behind American Medical Response (AMR) VC143 to [REDACTED]. At about 1231 hours, AMR and I arrived at [REDACTED]. Air Mercy 22 (Pilot [REDACTED] Nurse [REDACTED] and Medic [REDACTED]) was present at [REDACTED] upon arrival.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] contacted AMR VC143 Medical personnel at the ambulance bay. Medical personnel continued to treat Randall in the rear of the ambulance. At 1243 hours, medical personnel removed Randall from the ambulance and escorted Randall to the airship [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] loaded Randall into the airship and safely secured him.

Due to Randall's custody status, I was present inflight and flew in the helicopter with Randall and flight team. At about 1312 hours, we arrived at [REDACTED] staff was present at the helipad. Randall was removed from the airship, escorted into the trauma center's emergency room for further treatment.

At about 1353 hours, medical staff transferred Randall from the emergency room to surgery (OR room#1). I was present seated outside OR room#1, with Deputy Che while Randall was in surgery.

At about 1459 hours, Sheriff's Service Specialist [REDACTED] arrived at [REDACTED] to drive me back to my vehicle which was left at [REDACTED]. Che remained outside the surgery (OR room #1) door until the conclusion of Randall's surgery.

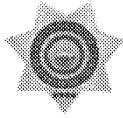

NARRATIVE**ASSIGNMENT/ARRIVAL**

On, 08/19/2022, from 0700 hours to 1700 hours, I was assigned to uniformed school resource officer for Victorville School District. I wore my class "D" uniform identifying myself as a Deputy Sheriff and drove a sheriffs marked patrol unit. While at Village Elementary School, I was made aware of a armed suspect, later identified as Todderick Randall, running from deputies via radio transmission. I dispatched myself to the [REDACTED] grocery store located at, [REDACTED], to assist my partners with a armed suspect. I arrived on scene at approximately 1210 hours.

DEPUTY OBSERVATIONS/ACTIONS

Upon my arrival, I observed Randall lying down on the floor suffering from several suspected gunshot wounds. Randall was lying down on the eastside of the building in the soda aisle. My partners, Deputy A. Ramos and Deputy D. Rapisardi, were assessing the suspect for medical aid. I kneeled down near Randall's left side and assisted with medical aid. I utilized my Leatherman trauma shears and cut Randall's clothing to locate all the gunshot wounds.

After assessing Randall, Deputy Rapisardi directed me to his left pant pocket, where I could locate a tourniquet. I located the tourniquet and handed the tourniquet to Deputy Rapisardi. At approximately 1220 hours, the tourniquet was applied to the suspects upper right arm. I wrote the time "1220" with my ball point pin, indicating, the time of application. Victorville City Fire Department and American Medical Response (AMR) personnel responded to the scene. At approximately 1221 hours, due to the suspects medical status, the chain of custody was transferred to AMR, however, Deputy D. Jones stayed with AMR for custody.

This concluded my observations/actions.

CRIME SCENE LOG

I authored a crime scene log and conducted scene security. All personal on scene was documented on the crime scene log. I forwarded the crime scene log to the original case agent for scanning at the Victorville Police Station.

AUDIO RECORDINGS

All my contacts were recorded with my department issued audio recorder. I downloaded my audio recording at The Victorville Police Station and forwarded them to the case agent.

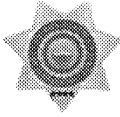

On 09/04/2022, I was assigned to work at the Jail Ward in full uniform located on the fifth floor of [REDACTED] in the city of Colton. I am assigned to AM2 day shift from 0600-1800 hours.

On the above date, at approximately 1445 hours, I was conducting the hourly log check when I was approached by a **Doctor/see confidential**, in the hallway. The doctor told me, he just removed a fired bullet from inside the body of the inmate in room 5106 and placed the bullet in a plastic bag. The inmate assigned to room 5106 was **Randall, Todderick DOB: [REDACTED]**. The Doctor said he was performing wound care to the right hip area when the bullet exited the wound. The doctor didn't realize the bullet was still inside the inmate. The doctor asked me if we needed it for evidence. I told him yes, keep it in the bag, in a safe location until I call my supervisor for further instruction. I immediately called my supervisor, Corporal Armando Castillo. He advised me to stand by while he called homicide. Corporal Castillo spoke to Detective Malcolm Page assigned to homicide. Detective Page's instruction was for me to recover the evidence and book it into West Valley Detention Center under the DR number 172209645 of the original report. I collected the evidence, and booked it into the evidence room, locker #5 at West Valley Detention Center at approximately 1700 hours.

Witness interview: See Confidential

I have attempted to make contact with the Doctor multiple times on the phone using the number he provided with negative results. I have also sent the Doctor an e-mail through the San Bernardino County global system with negative results.

Evidence:

On 09-04-22, I took possession of the evidence/bullet that was placed into a plastic bag by the doctor at approximately 1450 hours. The item is one copper colored bullet/projectile that was in a, "Mushroom" or "Expanded" shape. It appeared to have small amounts of bloody tissue on it.

On 09-04-22 at approximately 1700 hours, I placed the bullet into a manila envelope with a biohazard sticker on the back, and evidence tape along with my initials. I placed an evidence tag on the upper right portion of the envelope displaying the number **2234000761**. I placed the envelope along with a CR3 into evidence locker #5 located at West Valley Detention Center.

On 09-05-22 at approximately 0900 hours, I downloaded one photo of the manila envelope with the CR3 and matching evidence tags into the Vault System. Two photos of the bullet into the Vault System, and one photo copy of the bullet next to a ruler into the Vault System. A total of 4 items were downloaded.

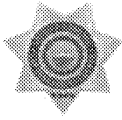

WITNESS INTERVIEW:

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1548 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] in a break room inside [REDACTED] Supermarket, located at [REDACTED], in Victorville. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital audio recorder. I later placed a copy of the audio recording into the case file. The following is a summary of my interview with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] worked for [REDACTED] for approximately [REDACTED]. On Friday, August 19, 2022, [REDACTED] was the [REDACTED] from 1000 hours until 1830 hours. At approximately 1200 hours, [REDACTED] was advised by [REDACTED] employee [REDACTED] a Black male, wearing a tank top, was armed with a knife or box cutter inside the store.

[REDACTED] searched for the subject inside [REDACTED] and located a tall Black male, later identified as Todderick Randall, in the liquor aisle. Randall drank from a premade margarita bottle and had a folding box cutter in his hand. [REDACTED] was not sure in which hand Randall held the knife. Randall made unusual movements and [REDACTED] believed Randall was under the influence and "Tweaking out."

At approximately 1203 hours [REDACTED] contacted Sheriff's Dispatch and requested deputies respond to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised dispatch he would not contact Randall for safety reason's because Randall was armed. [REDACTED] maintained a visual on Randall and kept customers from entering the liquor aisle until deputies arrived. Randall continued to drink from the liquor bottle. The [REDACTED] store manager [REDACTED] went to the office and watched Randall on the store's video surveillance cameras. Approximately five minutes after [REDACTED] called dispatch, [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] over the radio deputies arrived. [REDACTED] contacted Deputies Corrin Cassidy and Cameron Stanley outside WinCo and escorted them to the liquor aisle.

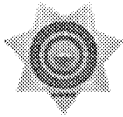
Cassidy and Stanley contacted Randall near the middle of the liquor aisle. [REDACTED] stayed behind the deputies at the southwest end of the liquor aisle. According to [REDACTED] Randall made eye contact with the deputies, took one step toward the deputies, and stopped. Randall took a fighting stance in the middle of the liquor aisle with one foot back and his body tensed up. The box cutter was in one of Randall's hands, down at his side and Randall slightly moved the hand with the boxcutter up and down parallel to his body.

WITNESS INTERVIEW CONTINUED:

Stanley unholstered his handgun and kept it down at his side and told Randall to "drop the knife." Cassidy pointed her taser at Randall, and tased Randall after Stanley gave Randall commands to drop the knife four to five times. The taser did not affect Randall. Randall backed up, while being tased and bumped into the liquor aisle shelf. The taser was activated for approximately 10 to 20 seconds and after the taser stopped, Randall ran northeast from the deputies. Stanley yelled an unknown number of times for Randall to "Stop!" When Randall reached the end of the liquor aisle he turned southeast. [REDACTED] moved southeast one aisle to the soda aisle. Randall ran to the opposite end of the soda aisle. Randall turned around and walked north, back where he ran from. [REDACTED] believed deputies were behind Randall.

When Randall turned around and walked back toward the deputies, [REDACTED] heard three to four gunshots. Randall fell to the ground on his stomach with his head facing toward [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] could not see who fired the shots because his view was obstructed by the shelving and merchandise in the soda aisle. [REDACTED] was too far away and did not see if the box cutter was still in Randall's hand. Immediately after the gunshots, Cassidy and Stanley handcuffed Randall and applied pressure to Randall's back.

After the shooting, [REDACTED] assisted employees and customers exit [REDACTED]. Two to three minutes later several additional deputies entered [REDACTED]. The deputies did not know where to go and [REDACTED] directed deputies to Randall's location. [REDACTED] heard deputies ask for towels and gloves which caused him believe deputies provided Randall medical aid. [REDACTED] walked to the east side of the soda aisle and saw Randall was naked and there was blood on the floor. [REDACTED] went to the back of the store and assisted the remaining employees and customers exit [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not see Randall again.

After [REDACTED] assisted the remaining employees and customers out of [REDACTED] he remained near the entrance of [REDACTED]. Approximately 15 minutes after the shooting, two to three unknown paramedics entered [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not see Randall, or the Paramedics leave [REDACTED].

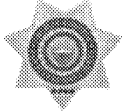

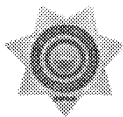

[REDACTED] was employed by [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] and for the [REDACTED] was the [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Supermarket Store [REDACTED]. As the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was tasked with overseeing all departments, which include financials, schedules, and employee relations [REDACTED] workdays are not consistent; however [REDACTED] shift were from 0815 hours to 1715 hours if there was an assistant manager on duty. If there was no assistant manager on duty, [REDACTED] would work from 0815 hours to 1815 hours.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, [REDACTED] arrived at work at 0815 hours. Between 1100 hours and 1200 hours, [REDACTED] was in the receiving office, which is located in the back of the store. [REDACTED] received a call over the handheld radio from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] he was on the phone with the police and he needed his assistance inside of the store.

[REDACTED] walked toward the front of the store and saw [REDACTED] standing near aisle 6 and appeared to look north. When [REDACTED] met up with [REDACTED], [REDACTED] saw a tall Black male, who was later identified as Todderick Randall, in the middle of the aisle 6. According to [REDACTED], Randall was approximately 6' 2" and approximately 175 pounds. From what [REDACTED] could recall, Randall wore a grey tank top with unknown-colored shorts. [REDACTED] watched Randall drink an alcoholic margarita mix in aisle 6. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] he saw Randall armed with a knife.

[REDACTED] told [REDACTED] not to approach Randall because he believed Randall was armed with a knife and under the influence of some type of drug. According to [REDACTED] Randall continued to drink from the alcohol bottle and appeared to talk to himself. [REDACTED] did not feel it was safe to approach or speak to Randall and he wanted to wait for deputies to arrive. [REDACTED] left aisle 6 and went to the security office in the front of the store, where they had their surveillance system. Once [REDACTED] arrived in the security office, he saw two San Bernardino County Sheriff's patrol vehicles arrive at the front of the store.

[REDACTED] continued to watch the surveillance video and watched two uniformed San Bernardino County Sheriff's deputies; one female and one male, walk toward Randall. [REDACTED] watched the female deputy pull out what he believed to be a Taser and point it at Randall. [REDACTED] watched the female deputy shoot the Taser and saw Randall remove the Taser probes. According to [REDACTED] it appeared the Taser had no effect on Randall. After Randall removed the Taser probes, he turned away from the deputies and ran northbound through aisle 6 toward the bakery.

According to [REDACTED] Randall slept on the streets when he was not at the residence. [REDACTED] never saw Randall use narcotics but believed Randall used narcotics to self-medicate.

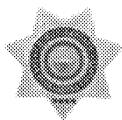

[REDACTED] was a [REDACTED] for [REDACTED], located at [REDACTED] in Victorville. [REDACTED] had many job duties for [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] duties included checking out purchases, assisting with other departments, restocking, and cleaning the store shelves.

At approximately 1210 hours, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] walked the store aisles and looked for items on the wrong shelves. [REDACTED] was near the south corner of the store. [REDACTED] heard [REDACTED] request over the store's handheld radio for the store manager to respond to the center aisle of the store. Generally, the store manager was not contacted over the radio unless there was a problem. The unusual call for the manager over the radio prompted [REDACTED] to walk toward the center aisle to offer her assistance with the unknown issue.

At approximately 1211 hours, [REDACTED] met with [REDACTED] at the center aisle of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if everyone was okay. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] he was on the phone with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] a subject, later identified as Todderick Randall, was in the alcohol aisle and had a knife. [REDACTED] looked down the alcohol aisle and saw Randall holding a knife in his right hand and an alcohol bottle in his left hand. [REDACTED] was approximately 60 feet away from Randall. [REDACTED] described Randall as a black male adult, bald, without a shirt, and possibly wearing jeans. Marron did not see what type of alcohol bottle Randall held, and she only saw the small silver blade of the knife. According to [REDACTED] the knife appeared to be a kitchen knife. [REDACTED] glanced down the aisle and left quickly once she saw Randall with the knife.

At approximately 1213 hours, [REDACTED] went to the front of the [REDACTED] and opened the gates of the closed checkout stands to provide an escape for Randall if he tried to leave. Once [REDACTED] provided an exit path for Randall, she stood on the center aisle between the alcohol aisle and the checkout aisle. [REDACTED] prevented customers from walking down the aisle toward Randall. [REDACTED] could not see Randall from her position.

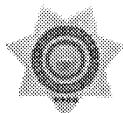

According to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] directed the deputies to the alcohol aisle where Randall stood. [REDACTED] went back to the center aisle and directed customers away from the alcohol aisle. [REDACTED] heard a male and female voice yell repeatedly to "put it down," and "get on the floor." [REDACTED] heard the commands from her location on the center aisle.

Approximately four minutes after the deputies arrived and were giving commands to put the knife down, [REDACTED] heard a popping sound that she believed was a Taser. [REDACTED] was not able to see if anyone was Tased but heard an unknown subject scream after the Taser was deployed.

[REDACTED] stood in the center aisle, at the southwest end of the soda aisle. The soda aisle was one aisle southeast of the alcohol aisle. Approximately 100 feet northeast of [REDACTED] position, [REDACTED] saw Randall run southeast toward the bakery. [REDACTED] only saw Randall for a moment before she moved southeast on the main aisle, near the checkout stands. [REDACTED] heard deputies give commands to Randall to "get on the floor" and "put down the knife."

Approximately one to two minutes after the Taser was deployed, [REDACTED] heard four to five suspected gunshots. [REDACTED] did not see the deputies or Randall when the gunshots went off. The gunshots were slow and repetitive and echoed throughout the building. [REDACTED] remained on the center aisle and continued to tell customers to stay away from the area. Additional deputies arrived at the [REDACTED] but [REDACTED] could not recall if they arrived before or after she heard the gunshots.

[REDACTED] looked down the soda aisle, and saw Randall handcuffed face down on the ground. [REDACTED] was approximately 100 feet away from Randall. Randall appeared to be unconscious. An unknown male deputy turned Randall over and rubbed Randall's chest. Randall did not react to the chest rub. The male deputy began chest compressions on Randall. [REDACTED] stayed away from Randall and instructed customers to exit the store.

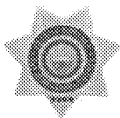

At approximately 1200 hours Fillippi took her lunch break and went to her upstairs office and ate lunch at her desk.

[REDACTED] ate lunch at her desk and heard several gunshots. [REDACTED] looked out the viewing glass window, which was upstairs by her office. [REDACTED] saw an unknown male and unknown female hold each other near the bakery department. [REDACTED] saw two uniformed San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department deputies standing near the bakery. [REDACTED] observed one deputy was a White female adult with blonde hair and the other was a White male adult.

[REDACTED] did not see anyone else and explained her view was blocked by the aisles of merchandise and display stands. [REDACTED] immediately exited the store and took shelter from the gunfire. After several minutes, [REDACTED] observed a Black male adult, later identified as Todderick Randall, on a medical gurney being wheeled out by medical personnel. [REDACTED] described Randall as having blood on his chest and wore no shirt.

[REDACTED] had no additional information, and I concluded my interview with her.

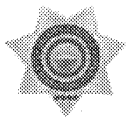

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1425 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] in a break room inside [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED], in Victorville. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital audio recorder. A copy of the audio recording was later placed into evidence. The following is a summary of my interview with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] worked for [REDACTED] for approximately [REDACTED]. On Friday, August 19, 2022, [REDACTED] was the [REDACTED] from approximately 0830 hours until 1700 hours. On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1210 hours, [REDACTED] worked in the [REDACTED] and heard something fall in the soda aisle, which is approximately 15 feet northwest of the bakery. It was common for items to fall in the soda aisle and [REDACTED] did not think much of it.

[REDACTED] walked to the front of the bakery and heard gunshots. [REDACTED] turned around and saw a male deputy wearing a tan uniform, later identified as Cameron Stanley, fired two to three gunshots. Stanley was approximately five to ten feet from the northeast opening of the soda aisle. Stanley was in a shooting stance and pointed a handgun towards the soda aisle. [REDACTED] could not see what the deputy shot at because her view was obstructed by a support pole. The soda bottles at the end of the soda aisle exploded. [REDACTED] crouched down behind the Bakery counter.

At the opening of the northeast end of the soda aisle [REDACTED] saw a black male, later identified as suspect Todderick Randall, fall face first on the floor. [REDACTED] saw a pool of blood on the floor near Randall's upper body. [REDACTED] did not see any additional deputies. Stanley asked for gloves and towels to provide medical aid to Randall. Another [REDACTED] employee, [REDACTED], said, "I got you."

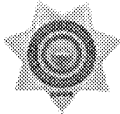
[REDACTED] noticed two customers, a Hispanic female, and a Hispanic male in their [REDACTED], crouched down near the candle rack in the bakery. The Hispanic female covered her ears with her hands and the Hispanic male held onto her. 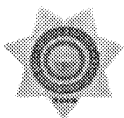

[REDACTED] was assigned to AMR Ambulance VC143 (VC143) with Paramedic [REDACTED]

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1200 hours, Falkowski was at the AMR office, located at 14828 Seventh Street, in Victorville. [REDACTED] received an alert on his work phone and via radio broadcast that there was a gunshot victim at [REDACTED], located at [REDACTED] Victorville. VC143 responded with their emergency lights and sirens activated.

At approximately 1210 hours, VC143 arrived at [REDACTED]. A medic engine from the Victorville Fire Department arrived at [REDACTED] simultaneously as VC143. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were directed into the [REDACTED] by deputies. A deputy informed [REDACTED] there was a subject, later identified as Todderick Randall, with gunshot wounds and an unknown deputy who needed to be evaluated. [REDACTED] continued to Randall to evaluate the gunshot wounds.

As [REDACTED] approached Randall, he saw three deputies trying to control the bleeding from the gunshot wounds. Randall was supine near the north corner of [REDACTED]. Randall was handcuffed and had a tourniquet on his right arm. [REDACTED] described Randall, as a Black male adult, approximately [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] years old, with short hair, approximately 130 pounds, and approximately 6'02" tall. According to [REDACTED] deputies cut off Randall's clothing before [REDACTED] arrived at the location, and they used his clothing as a bandage to control bleeding. Randall did not speak and was in and out of consciousness.

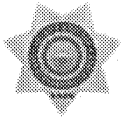

According to [REDACTED], he could tell the difference between entry and exit wounds. Gunshot entry wounds were typically much smaller and looked like a small hole, and exit wounds appeared as if the skin exploded. Additionally, Randall had an abrasion on his right ring finger.

An airship was requested by Victorville Fire Department personnel. MA22 was on the helipad at [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED] in Victorville. Randall was placed on a gurney and placed into VC143. At approximately 1213 hours, [REDACTED] drove VC143 with its emergency lights and sirens activated to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] and a Victorville Fire Department paramedic, later identified by investigators as [REDACTED], provided medical care for Randall during transport. An intravenous (IV) was established in Randall's left inner elbow, and Randall was given medications to prevent additional bleeding. Paramedics instructed Randall to take a deep breath. Randall replied, "I am," and said he had difficulty breathing. Randall's heart rate was approximately 60 beats per minute, and his respiration rate was approximately 20 breaths per minute. Randall's heart rate and respiration rate were in the lower range, which concerned [REDACTED] because someone's heart rate was usually above 100 beats per minute after a traumatic injury. Randall's blood pressure was significantly low at approximately 74 over 60.

At approximately 1220 hours, VC143 arrived at [REDACTED]. Randall was prepared for the flight and evaluated by MA22's flight crew. Flight nurse [REDACTED] established a second IV in one of Randall's feet. Randall was loaded into MA22 and flown to [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] did not have any additional information, and I concluded my interview with him.

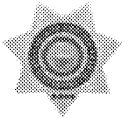

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 2109 hours, I conducted an interview with Mercy Air Flight Paramedic [REDACTED] in an office at Mercy Air, located at 7070 Summit Valley Road, in Hesperia. I recorded the interview on my department-issued digital recorder, and I later placed a copy of the recording into the case file. The following is a summary of my interview with Sexton.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, Sexton was assigned to Airship Mercy Air 22 (MA22) with Flight Nurse [REDACTED] and Pilot [REDACTED]

On Friday, August 19, 2022, between 1220 to 1230 hours, MA22 was on the helipad at Victor Valley Global Medical Center (VVGMC), located at 15248 Eleventh Street, in Victorville. MA22 received a radio broadcast that Victorville Fire Department Medic Engine 312 (ME312) requested air transport for a gunshot patient. The patient was later identified by investigators as Todderick Randall. There was a radio frequency created so MA22 could communicate with ME312. ME312 advised over the radio they were approximately 8 to 12 minutes away from [REDACTED]

MA22, ME312 arrived at [REDACTED] approximately 8 to 12 minutes after the initial call. An American Medical Response (AMR) employee and Victorville Fire Department employee briefed [REDACTED] on Randall's condition. [REDACTED] was informed that four 9mm rounds struck Randall. Randall was pale, cold, and sweating profusely. Randall had a strong odor of blood. In Sexton's experience, the strong smell of blood was common when someone lost a large amount of blood. Randall was awake and able to communicate with [REDACTED] asked Randall if he had any medical conditions, such as heart problems, high blood pressure, diabetes, or shortness of breath. Randall answered no to all the questions. Randall had gunshot wounds to his right forearm, his abdomen left of the belly button, midline at the hip bone, and on his lower back above his buttocks. Randall had a tourniquet on his right arm, above the gunshot wound.

Before leaving [REDACTED], [REDACTED] inserted an intravenous (IV) into Randall's left foot and [REDACTED] started an IV in Randall's left forearm. [REDACTED] gave Randall a blood transfusion. Randall's vitals improved after receiving the blood transfusion. According to Sexton, Tranexamic acid was given to Randall to help his blood clot and prevent bleeding.

Approximately 20 minutes after the AMR ambulance arrived at [REDACTED], MA22 flew from [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED] in Colton. Deputy Deshaun Jones rode in MA22 with [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and Randall. During the flight, Randall's blood pressure and skin color improved. Randall moved around and appeared to be in pain. Randall yelled and

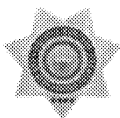

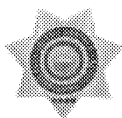

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1212 hours, ME312 was dispatched to a call for service reference to a gunshot victim at [REDACTED], located at [REDACTED], Victorville. ME312 responded from the intersection of Valley Center Drive and La Paz Drive, in Victorville. At approximately 1217 hours, ME312 arrived at [REDACTED] and was cleared to enter the building by San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department deputies. An American Medical Response (AMR) ambulance with two AMR employees arrived at [REDACTED] at the same time as ME312. [REDACTED] saw someone cut off Randall's clothing but could not recall if it was AMR personnel or a deputy. [REDACTED] saw approximately 100cc of blood pooling on the floor around Randall. [REDACTED] did not see any weapons or fired cartridge casings on the floor around Randall.

[REDACTED] did a trauma assessment of Randall and observed six gunshot wounds on Randall's body. Randall had two gunshot wounds in his lower abdomen area, one gunshot wound in the back of his left shoulder, one gunshot wound in his lower left back above the buttocks, one gunshot wound on the inside of his right forearm, and one gunshot wound on the outside of his right forearm. Randall had a tourniquet on his right arm, above the two gunshot wounds. Randall was not actively bleeding when [REDACTED] assessed him. [REDACTED] did not observe any other signs of trauma on Randall's body.

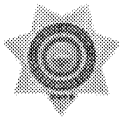

Randall was loaded onto a gurney and into the AMR ambulance. At approximately 1230 hours, an AMR Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) drove the AMR ambulance to [REDACTED]. The AMR paramedic and [REDACTED] provided medical aid to Randall while he was transported.

While in the ambulance, [REDACTED] took Randall's vitals. Randall's blood pressure was 73 over 40, and his heart rate was 62. According to [REDACTED], Randall's blood pressure was low and consistent with blood loss. [REDACTED] and the AMR EMT attempted to insert an intravenous (IV) on the inside of Randall's left elbow but were unsuccessful. 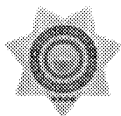

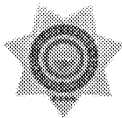

[REDACTED] worked for Mercy Air as a flight nurse for approximately [REDACTED]. On Friday, August 19, 2022, [REDACTED] was assigned to Mercy Air 22 from 0600 hours until Saturday, August 20, 2022, at 0600 hours.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, [REDACTED] Pilot [REDACTED], and Paramedic [REDACTED] were inside the Mercy Air 22 helicopter at [REDACTED]. At approximately 1228 hours, they received a call over the helicopter radio regarding a gunshot wound victim. Mercy Air 22 was requested to transport the gunshot wound victim to [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED] in Colton. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] grabbed their equipment from the helicopter and took it down to the bottom of the ramp of the helicopter landing pad.

Approximately 10 minutes after [REDACTED] received the call regarding a gunshot wound victim, an American Medical Response (AMR) ambulance arrived. [REDACTED] opened the rear of the ambulance and saw an unknown AMR Paramedic, an unknown Victorville Fire Department (VFD) Paramedic, and a Black male, later identified as Todderick Randall, seated on a gurney. Randall appeared to be bleeding, sweaty and pale. Both Paramedics applied gauze to Randall's gunshot wounds. [REDACTED] remembered Randall had a gunshot wound to his stomach and right shoulder, but could not remember if there were any additional gunshot wounds. [REDACTED] started a 20-gauge intravenous (IV) line on Randall's left foot and administered one gram of Tranexamic Acid (TXA) through the IV. TXA was used to reduce bleeding by clotting the blood. [REDACTED] stopped the administration of TXA and administered one unit of blood and saline through the IV in Randall's left foot. [REDACTED] started a second IV line in Randall's left forearm, and [REDACTED] moved the blood and saline to the IV in the left forearm. [REDACTED] administered additional TXA in Randall's left foot.

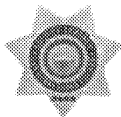

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 1546 hours, I conducted an interview with [REDACTED] inside of an office at [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED], Victorville. I recorded the interview on my department-issued digital recorder, and I later placed a copy of the recording into the case file. The following is a summary of my interview with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was employed by [REDACTED], as a [REDACTED] for approximately [REDACTED]

On Friday, August 19, 2022, at approximately 0500 hours, [REDACTED] started his shift at [REDACTED]. At approximately 1200 hours, [REDACTED] heard [REDACTED] unknown last name, broadcast over a handheld radio he needed assistance and was notifying law enforcement. [REDACTED] broadcasted a Black male adult, later identified as Todderick Randall, was inside the [REDACTED] armed with a boxcutter.

[REDACTED] began to walk inside the [REDACTED] to look for [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] saw two deputies enter [REDACTED] and walk down the center aisle. The two deputies were later identified as Stanley Cameron and Corrin Cassidy. Cameron and Cassidy wore a marked San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department uniform.

Cameron and Cassidy turned east and walked down the alcohol aisle. [REDACTED] saw Randall stood in the middle of the aisle and faced Cameron and Cassidy. Randall held a large grey boxcutter. Cassidy pointed a taser at Randall. Cameron pointed his department issued firearm at Randall. Both Cassidy and Cameron told Randall to drop the boxcutter several times.

Randall refused to drop the boxcutter. According to [REDACTED], Randall made a movement, "as to say, come and get me." Randall held the boxcutter in his right hand and pointed it at Cameron and Cassidy and took one step toward them. According to [REDACTED] Cameron deployed his taser at Randall. Randall was not affected by the taser and removed the taser darts from his chest.

[REDACTED] saw customers in the aisle near Randall. [REDACTED] warned the customers in the area to leave. While warning the customers to leave [REDACTED] heard gunshots. [REDACTED] did not see who shot. [REDACTED] heard four consecutive gunshots, with a second pause, followed by two additional gunshots.

[REDACTED] looked down the alcohol aisle and saw Randall lay supine. Cassidy removed taser darts from Randall's chest area. Cassidy told Randall to keep his eyes open. [REDACTED] gave an unknown deputy towels to apply to Randall's wounds. [REDACTED] exited the store.

On Friday, August 19, 2022, in the morning [REDACTED] saw Randall exit the [REDACTED] bathroom. Randall was not acting unusual and caused no problems.

During and after the LFE, [REDACTED] did not hear Randall speak.
