BRIEFING:

On Monday, January 30, 2023, at approximately 0704 hours, I attended a briefing near the [REDACTED] in Big Bear. San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) Sergeant Richard Hermosillo provided the briefing regarding the lethal force encounter (LFE). The following is a summary of the briefing and the personnel who were present.

On Monday, January 30, 2023, at approximately 0137 hours, [REDACTED] called the SBCSD Dispatch to report an unknown problem at [REDACTED] in Big Bear City. [REDACTED] told SBCSD Dispatch he had an argument with his [REDACTED] Gleise Firmiano, about him text messaging another female. Firmiano left his residence in her white Jeep Patriot and took one of his firearms and dog.

At approximately 0138 hours, Deputy Andrew Alas was dispatched to the call for service. At approximately 0152 hours, Alas arrived at [REDACTED] and contacted [REDACTED] told Alas Firmiano took one of his firearms and left the residence. [REDACTED] denied being assaulted, did not request medical attention, and did not desire prosecution. [REDACTED] was concerned for Firmiano's wellbeing because she took his firearm. [REDACTED] believed Firmiano may have driven to an unknown trail in the Sugarloaf area. Alas drew an incident report as he gathered additional information to determine if a crime was committed. Alas broadcasted information regarding Firmiano to other Big Bear Station deputies who began searching the area for Firmiano.

At approximately 0221 hours, Deputy Nicolas Baca located Firmiano's vehicle near the Maple Hills Trailhead. Baca and Alas looked into the vehicle and Firmiano was not inside. Baca and Alas found footprints in the snow that led north on the trail. Deputy Justin Sharp, Baca, and Alas tracked the footprints north up the trail. The trail was directly west of the Baldwin Lane Elementary School and Big Bear High School.

BRIEFING: Continued

At approximately 0236 hours, Baca, Alas, and Sharp located Firmiano approximately 1300' north on the trail. Baca, Alas, and Sharp saw Firmiano had a firearm next to her, gave her orders not to reach for the firearm, and requested less than lethal force options be brought to their location. Sergeant Richard Hermosillo arrived at the trailhead and retrieved the bean bag shotgun and 40-millimeter projectile launcher from his patrol vehicle.

Alas, Baca, and Sharp continued giving Firmiano orders to not reach for the firearm as Hermosillo retrieved the less than lethal force options from his patrol vehicle. Firmiano refused orders and Alas and Baca discharged their department-issued firearms toward Firmiano. Firmiano was struck by fired bullets, and Alas, Baca, and Sharp immediately provided Firmiano medical care and requested paramedics. Alas, Baca, and Sharp placed an Israeli bandage and chest seal on gunshot wounds (GSW) on Firmiano's chest. At approximately 0252 hours, Alas, Baca, and Sharp began cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on Firmiano. At approximately 0259 hours, Big Bear Fire Department paramedics arrived on scene and relieved deputies of Firmiano's medical care. At approximately 0312 hours, Firmiano was pronounced deceased.

Hermosillo began the walkthrough at the Maple Hills Trailhead, which was near the intersection of Baldwin Lane and Vista Avenue. Baldwin Lane Elementary School was east of the trailhead. Big Bear High School was northeast of the trailhead. A white Jeep Patriot, California license plate [REDACTED] was parked at the beginning of the trail. Footprints in the snow led north from the Jeep into the forest. Hermosillo followed the footprints approximately 1300' along the trail. The trail followed the west fence lines of Baldwin Lane Elementary School and Big Bear High School.

Approximately 1300' north of the trailhead parking area was the crime scene. Gleise Firmiano was supine on the ground with her head facing east. Snow covered the ground around Firmiano. Firmiano's chest was exposed, and an Israeli bandage and chest seal were on her chest. Additional medical supplies were on the ground near Firmiano's body. Several fired bullet strikes were on a tree near Firmiano's feet. Firmiano wore black pants, and a blanket covered her right leg. A black Smith and Wesson handgun was in a bush approximately four feet west of Firmiano. Several fired cartridge casings (FCC) were east of Firmiano's body. The FCC were approximately 20' east of Firmiano's body.

A marked hiking trail ran north and south immediately west of Baldwin Lane Elementary School. There was a clearing north of Baldwin Lane and west of the school. A white Jeep Patriot, California license plate [REDACTED], was parked in this clearing and faced north. This Jeep Patriot was later determined to be Gleise Firmiano's vehicle. The driver's side exterior door handle was broken off and the driver's side mirror was folded toward the front of the vehicle. The Jeep Patriot was marked with placard number one.

The Jeep Patriot's doors were locked when homicide investigators arrived. The Jeep Patriot's keys were located under Firmiano during the scene processing and were used to unlock the vehicle. There was a black zippered bag on the passenger's side front floorboard, a black suitcase on the passenger's side rear floorboard, a grey Adidas backpack on the driver's side rear floorboard, and a dog bed in the rear cargo area. Firmiano's [REDACTED] were in the zippered bag.

Two marked SBCSD Ford Expedition patrol vehicles were parked south of the Jeep Patriot in the clearing. The patrol vehicle southwest of the Jeep Patriot had California exempt license plate [REDACTED] the word "SHERIFF" was on the sides, and [REDACTED] applied on the rear lift-gate. A 40-millimeter munitions launcher and a yellow and black Remington 870 shotgun were laid across this patrol vehicle's driver's seat, center console, and front passenger's seat. It was determined Sergeant Richard Hermosillo drove this patrol vehicle.

The patrol vehicle parked south of the Jeep Patriot had California exempt license plate [REDACTED] the word "SHERIFF" was written on the sides, and [REDACTED] applied on the rear lift-gate. Three additional marked SBCSD patrol vehicles were parked along Baldwin Lane and south of the Jeep Patriot. The west patrol vehicle had California exempt license plate [REDACTED] "SHERIFF" applied on the sides, and [REDACTED] applied on the rear lift-gate. The middle patrol vehicle had California exempt license plate [REDACTED], "BIG BEAR LAKE SHERIFF" applied on the sides, and [REDACTED] applied on the rear lift-gate. The east patrol vehicle had California exempt license plate [REDACTED] "SHERIFF" applied on the sides, and [REDACTED] applied on the rear lift-gate.

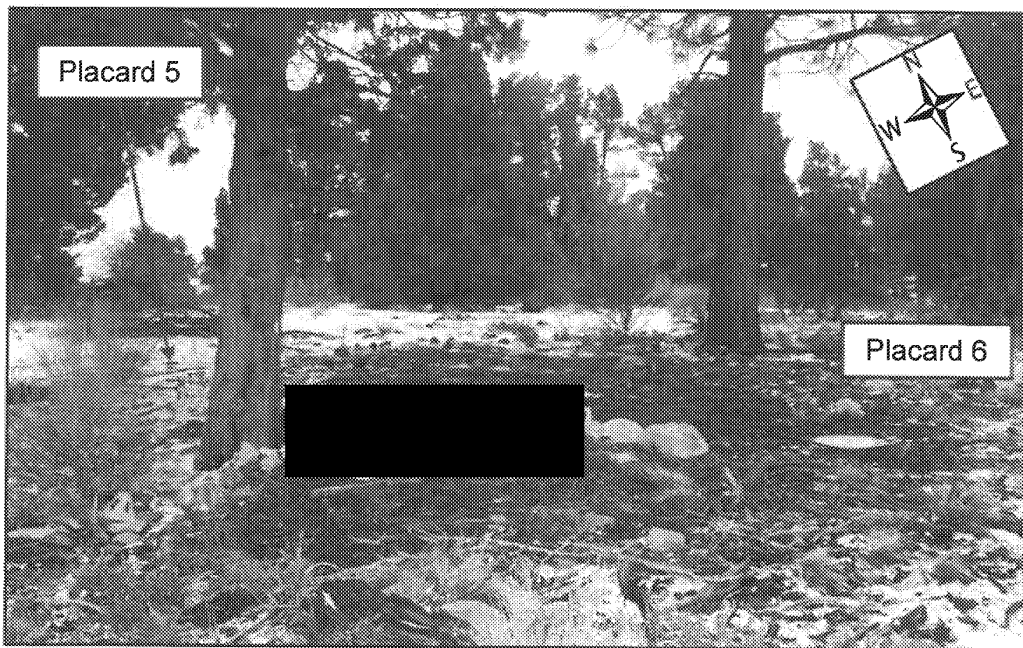

Firmiano was supine on the ground north of the Jeep Patriot. Firmiano was orientated with her head to the southeast and legs to the northwest. Firmiano's face was upward, her arms were separated from her torso, and her legs were straight and separated outward. Firmiano wore multiple layers of clothing which were cut and exposed her chest, shoulders and upper arms, and left shin. A blanket partially covered the right side of Firmiano's body. An opaque bag-valve-mask (BVM) was on the ground by her head. Additional medical supplies and packaging were scattered on the ground around Firmiano. Firmiano, the medical supplies, and the packaging were marked with placard number two.

Firmiano wore a black jacket, over a blue long sleeve sweater, over a green "SPORT" bodysuit, and black pants with a repeating pink lips pattern under the body suit. Firmiano wore black fingerless gloves and black "BOMBAS" socks. Firmiano appeared to have gunshot wounds (GSW) to her face, neck, chest, and arms. Blood came from Firmiano's chest and saturated her clothing. There was a green oropharyngeal airway (OPA) inserted in Firmiano's mouth, a white automated external defibrillator (AED) pad near her right shoulder, a white AED pad on her left abdomen, a blood-saturated chest seal dressing below the base of her neck, and an intraosseous (IO) line in her left shin. A collection of blood-saturated gauze covered the chest seal.

PLACARD MEASUREMENT LOG:

Placard 4 was identified as a black Smith and Wesson MP Shield, 9mm handgun, serial number [REDACTED]. Placard 4 measured approximately 11'8" at 271° northwest of RP1 and on ground level. Placard 4 was approximately 3'4" west of placard 3.

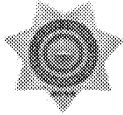

BODY EXAMINATION:

On Monday, January 30, 2023, at approximately 1351 hours, Seavey examined Gleise Firmiano's body. At approximately 1402 hours, [REDACTED] collected a gunshot residue (GSR) test kit sample on both of Firmiano's hands. At approximately 1426 hours, Seavey used a Fast ID/IBIS device to attempt to verify Firmiano's identity, but the moisture from the falling snow and on Firmiano's hands interfered with the scans. Seavey later used Firmiano's [REDACTED] photograph to confirm her identity.

Firmiano had multiple tattoos, [REDACTED]

At approximately 1416 hours, Seavey rolled Firmiano's body to the right an onto her stomach. Seavey searched Firmiano's clothing and pockets and found three photographs in her black jacket's left pocket. The three photographs were of Firmiano and [REDACTED]

Seavey noted multiple injuries on the exterior of Firmiano's body, including the following:

- An approximately one-inch long, oblong abrasion on her lower jaw, left of her chin.
- An approximately three-eighths inch circular gunshot wound (GSW) in the approximate center of her torso, just below the base of her neck.
- An approximately three-eighths inch circular GSW in the approximate center of her torso, slightly below her nipple line.
- An approximately one-inch long, oblong abrasion on her left arm, below her shoulder.
- An approximately three-quarter inch GSW in her left flank.
- An approximately two inch by one inch GSW on her left inside elbow.
- An approximately three-quarter inch GSW on the back of her left bicep.

While examining Firmiano's body, Seavey noted a discolored area in Firmiano's skin to the right of the center of her back. Seavey believed she felt a fired bullet below the surface of Firmiano's skin below the discoloration.

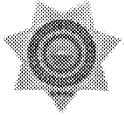



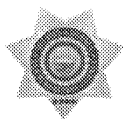

WITNESS INTERVIEW:

On Monday, January 30, 2023, at approximately 0818 hours, Detective Amy Bilbao and I interviewed [REDACTED] at his residence in Big Bear City. I used my department-issued audio recorder to record my interview with [REDACTED]. I downloaded my recording, and it was later placed into evidence. The following is a summary of our interview with [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] and Gleise Firmiano were in a prior dating relationship. In approximately July of 2021, Firmiano and [REDACTED] met and dated for approximately one and a half years. Firmiano lived with [REDACTED] the entire time they dated. In November of 2022, [REDACTED] and Firmiano ended their relationship. [REDACTED] allowed Firmiano to continue to live with him after they ended their relationship because Firmiano was from Brazil and had no family or place to live. Portuguese was Firmiano's first language, but she spoke and understood English. According to [REDACTED] Firmiano understood English well and only sometimes misunderstood the meaning of some words.

On Sunday, January 29, 2023, at approximately 2300 hours, [REDACTED] and Firmiano were in the living room of [REDACTED] residence. Firmiano asked [REDACTED] if she could use his cellphone to browse Amazon. Firmiano looked through [REDACTED] Instagram account and saw [REDACTED] messaged another female. [REDACTED] explained to Firmiano he started dating the other female after he and Firmiano ended their relationship. Firmiano was upset [REDACTED] messaged another female and sent the other female a text message pretending to be [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] saw the text message Firmiano sent and argued with Firmiano about why she sent the text message.

According to [REDACTED] Firmiano escalated the argument and grabbed the collar of his t-shirt. Firmiano pulled on [REDACTED] t-shirt, scratched his chest, and punched him at least five times in the face. [REDACTED] did not hit Firmiano. Firmiano stopped hitting [REDACTED] went into his bedroom, and packed her belongings.

On Monday, January 30, 2023, at approximately 0136 hours, Firmiano came out of the bedroom and asked [REDACTED] for a blanket that she could not find. [REDACTED] went to look for the blanket. [REDACTED] also checked his nightstand to see if Firmiano took his Smith and Wesson M&P Shield 9-millimeter handgun.

According to [REDACTED] Firmiano threatened suicide and took his firearm in the past when Firmiano was upset. Firmiano last took [REDACTED] firearm sometime around November of 2022. Firmiano never threatened to harm others, and only threatened to harm herself.

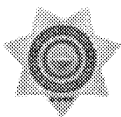

The deputy preformed a pat down search of [REDACTED]. The deputy saw [REDACTED] was injured and asked [REDACTED] about his injuries. On Sunday, January 29, 2023, from 1900 hours to 0700 hours, I was assigned to patrol Big Bear. I wore a Class "A" uniform and drove a marked Sheriff's patrol vehicle. At 0137 hours, I assisted Deputy Nicholas Baca at the intersection of Baldwin Lane and Vista Lane, in Sugar Loaf. Deputy Baca located a white Jeep Patriot related to a call they were on. Deputy Baca, Deputy Andrew Alas, Deputy Justin Sharp, and Sgt. Rich Hermosillo were at the location looking for the driver of the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle was later identified as Gliese Firmiano.

Deputies located shoe impressions in the snow leading away from the vehicle. I monitored over the radio and heard they were beginning to follow the shoe impressions into the wooded area north of the vehicle.

DEPUTY INFORMATION:

Due to responding to the location on icy roads, quickly exiting my patrol vehicle, and running through the forest, I failed to activate my department-issued belt recorder.

DEPUTY ACTIONS:

At 0221 hours, Baca located the vehicle parked in front of Baldwin Elementary at Baldwin Lane and Vista Lane, in Sugar Loaf. Baca informed Dispatch it was unoccupied and they would be on foot checking behind the school. At approximately 0236 hours, Sharp reported to Dispatch they located Firmiano and had her at gunpoint. At 0237 hours, Baca informed Dispatch that Firmiano was being uncooperative and not listening to commands.

At 0240 hours, Sharp notified Dispatch shots were fired and that Firmiano was down. At 0240 hours, deputies informed dispatch Firmiano had two wounds to her chest, and they were applying pressure. I began driving to the location; however, due to the extremely icy roads, I could not respond quickly. I arrived on scene at 0245 hours.

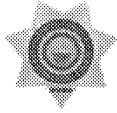
When I arrived on scene I noticed the white Jeep Patriot facing north toward the elementary school and multiple patrol units behind the vehicle. I exited my patrol vehicle and grabbed my trauma kit. I ran toward the vehicle and noticed multiple shoe impressions in the snow leading north of the vehicle. I began to run down the roadway following the shoe impressions. I ran approximately 150 yards and then stopped to listen to see if I could hear deputies. I then noticed a flashlight through the trees about 50 yards away. I ran toward the flashlight and noticed Firmiano was lying on her back. Baca was applying pressure to a gunshot wound on her chest, and Sharp was applying pressure to a gunshot wound near her right collarbone area.

I opened my trauma kit and retrieved a chest seal. I opened the chest seal and placed the chest seal on the gunshot wound on Firmiano's chest. I grabbed an Israeli bandage from the trauma kit and assisted Sharp and Baca in putting the Israeli bandage on the wound to her neck. Sharp checked for a pulse during this time but could not feel one. Deputies began monitoring Firmiano until the Fire Department arrived and took over life-saving measures.

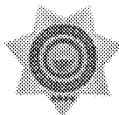

I authored a search warrant for [REDACTED] Big Bear City, property parcel [REDACTED] and a related white Jeep with license plate [REDACTED] registered to Gleise Firmiano, which was located parked near the scene on Baldwin Lane.
