On Thursday, February 9, 2023, Deputy Torey Arlotti was assigned to patrol in the Town of Apple Valley. Arlotti drove a marked Sheriff's patrol vehicle and wore a department approved class "A" uniform. At about 1505 hours, Arlotti conducted a traffic stop in the area of Kiowa Road and Ottawa Road. Shortly after Arlotti initiated the traffic enforcement stop, he broadcasted over his police radio he was in foot pursuit of a Hispanic male adult, later identified as Joel Chavez.

During the foot pursuit, Arlotti broadcasted Chavez carried a black semi-automatic handgun. At about 1506 hours, Arlotti broadcasted over his police radio shots were fired. Several personnel from the Apple Valley Sheriff's station responded to assist.

At approximately 1508 hours, multiple deputies arrived and contacted Arlotti and Chavez in the courtyard of Deputies observed Chavez lay faced down on the ground and determined Arlotti deployed his taser. Deputies handcuffed Chavez, search him for additional weapons, and evaluated him for injuries. Deputies determined Chavez was not struck by gunfire.

During a public safety statement, Arlotti stated he pursued Chavez on foot along the north side of an apartment complex, located at the statement of the complex of the west. Arlotti returned fire and shot multiple rounds at Chavez from the west toward the east.

Deputies conducted a safety sweep of the area and located a black semi-automatic handgun on the ground on the north side of the apartment complex. Located approximately four feet from the located handgun, were multiple fired cartridge casings (FCC's). Located on the ground, approximately 30 yards west of the handgun, were multiple additional FCC's. Several structures were struck by gunfire, but no one was injured. Deputies secured the area and preserved the crime scene for further processing.

Personnel from the Apple Valley Fire District responded and evaluated Arlotti and Chavez. Arlotti and Chavez did not sustain any major injuries and were not struck by gun fire. Chavez was transported to the Apple Valley Sheriff's Station and placed in a holding cell.

Detectives from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, Specialized Investigations Division, Homicide Detail, responded and assumed the investigation.

On Thursday, February 9, 2023, Detective Justin Carty and Crime Scene Specialist (CSI) processed the crime scene. Based on evidence at the scene and collected video surveillance, investigators determined Chavez fired six rounds at Arlotti. Investigators determined Arlotti returned fire and shot 10-rounds from his department issued Glock 17 handgun at Chavez.

During the scene processing, investigators located Chavez' black, 9mm, SS80 ghost semi-automatic handgun, with no serial number. The slide of Chavez' handgun was locked to the rear, and it did not contain any additional ammunition. Chavez' handgun was located on the north side of Approximately 30 feet west of Chavez' handgun, investigators located six 9MM FCC's, head stamped "Win 9mm Luger."

Located approximately 30 yards west of Chavez' handgun, investigators located 10- 9MM FCC'S, head stamped "Win 9mm Luger +P." Located near the FCC's, were multiple shoe impressions consistent with Chavez' and Arlotti's footwear. Northeast from the scene of the LFE, investigators located four suspected bullet strikes.

During a search of the area, several surveillance cameras were located. Investigators located several citizens who witnessed events after the shooting occurred but did not witness the shooting. Based on witness statements and video surveillance footage recovered from a nearby residence, investigators determined two unidentified female adults also fled from the vehicle. The females ran east away from Chavez and Arlotti after Chavez fled on foot. The unidentified females ran east, out of the area, prior to the arrival of additional deputies. After a lengthy search, the females were not located.

On Thursday, February 9, 2023, at about 2019 hours, Detectives Malcolm Page and Travis Gagne obtained an initial statement from Arlotti in a private office at the Apple Valley Sheriff's station, located at 14931 Dale Evans Parkway, in Apple Valley. Arlotti agreed to provide a detailed interview at a later date. The following is a summary of Arlotti's initial statement.

On Thursday, February 9, 2023, at approximately 1505 hours, Arlotti drove his marked Sheriff's patrol vehicle north on Kiowa Road toward Ottawa Road, in Apple Valley. Arlotti observed a white Honda Civic with no front license plate, which traveled east on Ottawa Road near Kiowa Road. The Honda continued south on Kiowa Road as Arlotti followed. Arlotti noticed the vehicle did not have a rear bumper and initiated a traffic enforcement stop. Arlotti activated his overhead emergency lights with a solid forward facing red light and conducted a traffic stop.

The Honda yielded in the driveway of an apartment complex and stopped. As soon as the vehicle stopped, a heavy set Hispanic male adult, later identified as Joel Chavez, exited the passenger side of the Honda.

Chavez ran west into the apartment complex on foot as Arlotti followed on foot. As Arlotti attempted to catch Chavez, Arlotti observed a black semi-automatic handgun in Chavez' hand.

Arlotti gave multiple verbal commands for Chavez to drop the gun and stop, but he refused and continued to run. Chavez eventually ran around an apartment and out of Arlotti's view. When Arlotti continued around the corner, Chavez was crouched behind an approximate three-foot-tall block wall.

As Arlotti approached, Chavez stood up, pointed the black semi-automatic handgun at him, and fired multiple times. Fearing for his life, Arlotti returned fire with his department issued handgun.

After Arlotti returned fire, Chavez dropped the handgun and jumped over a chain link fence. Arlotti pursued Chavez and gave him verbal commands to "stop." Chavez continued to run and Arlotti deployed his department issued taser, which caused Chavez to stop running. Arlotti waited for responding deputies to assist with the apprehension of Chavez.

Arlotti positively identified Chavez through his California Driver's License (CDL) photograph.

On Thursday, February 9, 2023, at about 2037 hours, Detectives Eric Ogaz and Travis Gagne interviewed Chavez in an interview room at the Apple Valley Sheriff's station. Prior to the interview, Ogaz read Chavez a Miranda advisal from his department issued Miranda warning card. Chavez stated "Yeah" to question number one and "No" to question number two.

After Chavez stated he did not wish to speak with investigators, he continued and said, "Everything was fine, there was no conflict with me and the officer." According to Chavez, "the officer did not do anything wrong." After Chavez' statement, he did not provide any additional information and the interview was concluded.

During an additional search of Chavez' person, a black handgun holster was secured around his ankle.

A Sheriff's records check revealed Chavez had a lengthy criminal history with multiple felony convictions. In 2012, Chavez was convicted of PC 29800 (b)-Felon in Possession of a Firearm and PC 186.22(a)-Participation in a Criminal Street Gang. Chavez was sentenced to two years in state prison. In 2014, Chavez was arrested for violation of parole and PC 487(a)-Grand Theft and sentenced to six years in state prison.

On Thursday, February 9, 2023, at about 2322 hours, Deputy Dionicio Ramires transported Chavez to High Desert Detention Center, where he was booked for PC 664/187-Attempted Murder of a Peace Officer, PC 29800(a)-Felon in Possession of Ammunition.

CRIME SCENE:

On Thursday, February 9, 2023; I conducted a crime scene investigation, assisted by Crime Scene Specialist assisted me by taking overall, midrange, and close-up photographs of the scene and evidence found at the scene. All evidence found within the crime scene was labeled using photographic identification placards and photographed in place prior to being measured and taken as evidence. All measurements were taken using a Leica Disto D8 laser measuring device. All measurements are approximate.

The crime scene was surveyed using a Faro focus, 3DX laser mapping system. The system used reference points in and around the crime scene. Reference points are recognized by the Faro scanning machine and are used in processing the scene with a computer program. The Faro was attached to a tripod and remained stationary while it scanned the scene. Once the Faro completed the scan cycle, the tripod and Faro were repositioned, and additional scans were completed.



Ogaz: "You have the right to remain silent. Anything you say can be used against you in court. You have the right to an attorney before and during any questioning. If you cannot afford an attorney, one will be appointed to you, by the courts, free of charge, before any questioning. Do you understand the rights that I have explained to you?"

Chavez: "Yea."

Ogaz: "Having these rights in mind, are you willing to talk to me?"

Chavez: "No."

Chavez said there was "no conflict with me and that officer" and Arlotti did not do anything wrong. Chavez was not injured. Chavez clarified he did not want to talk about what happened.

ARLOTTI:

Okay. I arrived to the station on February 9th, 2023. I put on all of my duty gear. Which contained my hat, my class A uniform, duty belt with all of my department issued equipment and my handgun. Inside the locker room, I conducted a press check, which is partially pulling back a slide to ensure that there was a round in the chamber. Checked all of my magazines ensured that they were loaded with 17 rounds of ammunition. I went out to my patrol vehicle. Loaded my patrol vehicle up with a plate carrier, ballistic helmet, my war bag which contained miscellaneous paperwork for patrol functions. I conducted a vehicle checkout, which included testing the sirens, the lights to make sure all the lights were functioning. Logged on to the unit computer with my assigned callsign and unit number, radio numbers.

Attended briefing, where we talked about events that occurred on the shift prior during night shift. And after briefing, I left the station and started handling calls for service. While conducting routine patrols in Apple Valley, I was driving north on ________, and I saw a white Honda to my left, stopped at the stop sign on ________ I saw that the vehicle didn't have a front license plate in violation of Vehicle Code 5200. As I was driving up to the limit line on ________, I noticed that the white Honda wasn't moving, even though they were stopped at the stop sign prior to me. I found it strange, it seemed like they were waiting for me to drive through the intersection.

So, I came to a stop and continued northbound on through the intersection, and I looked in my rearview mirror and saw the white Honda turn right to go south on . As they turned right, I noticed that they didn't have a rear bumper. So, I made a U-turn, and I made a U-turn on . Drove back through the intersection and activated my overhead emergency lights, which contained a solid forward-facing red light. And as activated the lights the vehicle already had its right blinker on and was pulling onto the shoulder, so I believed that they were yielding.

They continued driving at a slow pace and turned right into an apartment complex parking lot. I believe that either they were pulling into the parking lot to get out of the roadway, or that the occupant of the vehicle may have lived there. So, I turn into the parking lot behind them, I grabbed my radio to call out the plate. And as I grabbed the radio, a heavyset, Hispanic male, exited the passenger side of the vehicle and ran into the apartment complex courtyard. I used my unit radio to call out a foot pursuit and I exited my vehicle and pushed the record button on my digital belt recorder and pursued him through the apartment complex or into the apartment complex courtyard. I thought maybe he was running to an apartment if he lived there or knew someone that lived there.

As I entered the courtyard, I saw he was holding a black semi-

automatic handgun. I ordered him to drop the weapon, and I screamed it multiple times for him to drop the weapon. He continued to run west through the courtyard to another entryway that led to like a dirt field, west of the apartment complex, and then he turned right. I lost visual of him after he made that turn. When he made that turn, I was scared. I didn't know what his intentions were. If he was going to be waiting around the corner or if he was going to enter an apartment complex. So, I continued running through the apartment complex. As I ran up to the entryway, I slowed down to a walking pace and I got as far left as I could, up against a chain link fence as I walked through the entryway.

I know that from previous trainings and talking points in trainings and briefings that it's not uncommon for suspects to wait around blind corners to ambush officers. So, I slowly walked through that entryway and pied the corner. So, pieing the corner is taking your time going around a blind corner and clearing each sector that's in front of you. So, as I'm slowly walking around the corner, I'm checking to the most northwest area of the dirt to see if he's over there, I didn't see him. So, I continue to slowly walk around and cleared each section that was visible to me as I came around the corner. As I'm clearing, I heard a loud thud and believed that he may have either forced his way into an apartment or entered an apartment. And I believed that maybe this was going to be evolving into a barricaded suspect or hostage scenario.

Amm

So, I continued clearing and when I got through, when I completely got through the corner, I didn't see the suspect anywhere. I didn't see a handgun on the ground anywhere. And I saw that there was another blind corner to my right. At this point, my heart's racing, I'm scared. I don't know what his intentions are, if he's waiting to ambush me around this corner, if he's taken a hostage. So, I backed away from the apartment building and slowly pied the second corner. The second corner had like a concrete driveway to the north of the building. And as I'm coming around the corner, clearing each section that I could see, I saw him crouched behind a short block wall that was attached to the apartment building. I had my duty weapon out and I pointed it at him and I told him to show me his hands.

The suspect stood up from behind the block wall and presented the black semi-automatic handgun. And I told him to drop the weapon. I screamed for him to drop the weapon. He started shooting at me. I was scared, I believed that he wasn't trying to get away. He wanted to kill me. And if I didn't shoot back, I was going to die. So, I fired a — I pointed my weapon at him and fired a rapid succession, volley of rapid succession at him. After the first volley, I went back behind the wall for cover. At some point, I radioed to dispatch that shots were fired. I stood behind cover for what felt like an eternity and thought about my wife and my baby. And that this could be the day that I don't go home and get to see them.

While I was standing behind cover, I knew I had to get back out to reassess the situation to see if the suspect was injured, if he was trying to force his way into an apartment, or if he was taking a better vantage point approaching me to ambush me as I was behind the corner. So, I stepped back out to reassess and saw the suspect was standing in the same spot, he didn't retreat. He didn't approach me, but he still had the handgun in his hand and still had it presented towards me. I thought this guy just wanted to kill me and believed he was going to kill me.

So, I fired a second volley in rapid succession to stop the immediate threat that was presented to me, and I fired about eight to 10 shots. After the second volley, the suspect began to walk backwards and turned away from me. I ordered him to show me his hands. He refused and began climbing up a fence that was behind him. That fence led to the parking lot that the original traffic stop, where the original traffic stop was. I ordered him to stop, and he jumped over the fence, and ran south toward where the, where his vehicle was parked.

I chased after the suspect and as I was running toward the fence that he jumped, I noticed, or I saw a black semi-automatic handgun at the foot of the fence. The slide was locked back to the rear. So, I believed that was his weapon that he dropped. But he, I know that he ran towards where his vehicle was, and my patrol vehicle was. I don't believe I locked my patrol vehicle

when I started the foot pursuit. And I didn't know if he had any other weapons in his car.

So, I holstered my duty weapon, jumped the fence. And when I landed on the other side, I redrew my weapon and I saw the suspect in the parking lot. I told him to show me his hands and he disobeyed my command and ran back into the apartment complex, through the entryway. This entryway that he ran into, there's a wooden fence that's affixed to the stucco of the apartment building. And the wooden fence met the stucco at about a 90-degree angle and provided about three feet of cover and concealment for the suspect.

I didn't know if he had any weapons on him. He already waited around one corner to ambush me. I didn't know if he grabbed another weapon, firearm, or anything. So, I slowly approached that corner and I saw the suspect and he was hiding in the corner, and I noticed that he was hunched over. So, I believed I may have hit him from the initial gunfight. I told him to show me his hands and he looked at me and disobeyed the command and ran south through the apartment complex. I chased after the suspect, and I was about six feet behind him. I noticed that while he was running, he was kind of stumbling and hunched over, so I still thought he was injured. And as he was running, I noticed that he didn't have any weapons in his hand.

So, I holstered my duty weapon and drew my taser, and ordered

him to stop running. He disobeyed the command and continued to run. So, like I said, "Taser, taser", and deployed my taser which was effective. His body stiffened up and he fell to the ground. Once he fell to the ground, he landed on his stomach, and I had him proned out. I didn't know if he had any other weapons concealed on his person, so I didn't feel comfortable to approach him. He's already displayed that he wanted me dead. So, I gave him commands to put his hands behind his back and had my taser pointed at him while I waited for additional deputies to respond.

When I gave him commands to put his hands behind his back, he complied. And I asked him if he was injured at all if he was hit, he told me no. And at that point, I could hear sirens from additional deputies that were responding to the scene. I felt relieved that partners were there, almost there, to assist me. I knew that the incident was almost over. I just kept him proned out on his stomach with his hands behind his back until additional deputies responded and took him into custody. Once the suspect was taken into custody, I checked to make sure that I didn't have any injuries that I didn't know about. Once I did my self-assessment, I was relieved to find that the only injuries I had were cuts on my hand and just grateful that I was going to be able to go home and see my wife and son again.

I inspected the south and west side of the home and found no signs of any bullets striking his home. I then spoke to him again on his back patio and asked him if heard or saw anything. sitting on his couch in his living room when he heard what he thought was banging on his backyard screen door. He walked over to his door and looked through the blinds and out of the window of the door. When he looked to the south he said he could see a deputy standing in the dirt on the other side of the chain link fence to the property to the south of him. He described the deputy standing between the second and third pole east of the western edge of the fence line and about center to the sidewalk he was facing. The deputy was facing east and pointing his firearm in the same direction. He could hear the deputy yelling at an unknown person saying, "Get down! 

NARRATIVE

ASSIGNMENT/ARRIVAL:

On Thursday, February 09, 2023, I was assigned to uniformed patrol in the Town of Apple Valley. I drove a marked Sheriff patrol vehicle and wore a department approved class "A" uniform. At about 1506 hours, I assisted in a traffic stop in the area of in the Town of Apple Valley. I arrived on scene at about 1607 hours.

OBSERVATIONS/ACTIONS:

I arrived on scene and saw Deputy Torey Arlotti's patrol vehicle in the parking lot of an apartment complex, located at I heard Arlotti on the opposite side of a wooden fence, located on the south side of the complex. The wood fence led into the courtyard of the apartment complex. Arlotti gave commands to the suspect, later identified as, Joel Chavez, to not move. I jumped over the south fence and observed Chavez lay on his stomach on the ground. Arlotti gave Chavez multiple commands to place his hands behind his back and remain still. Chavez wore jean pants and a dark colored T-shirt.

Chavez complied with commands and placed his hands behind his back. I secured both of the Chavez' arms to the rear and placed him in handcuffs. As I handcuffed Chavez, he repeatedly said, "Fuck" multiple times.

Once Chavez was handcuffed, I double locked the handcuffs and checked them for proper fit. As Chavez lay faced down, I observed a deployed Taser dart affixed to the middle of his back. I observed a second deployed Taser dart and wires hanging loose away from Chavez' torso. I removed the affixed Taser dart from Chavez' back and ordered Chavez to his feet. Once Chavez stood up, I escorted him to the backseat of Arlotti's patrol vehicle.

I searched Chavez' person incident to arrest and located a black wallet in his pocket. The black wallet contained Chavez' California Identification card. I also removed a black and silver pocket knife and a black cellphone from Chavez' pants pocket. I placed Chavez' wallet, cellphone, and pocket knife if an envelope, which I secured under Arlotti's patrol vehicle's front windshield wiper.

After I secured Chavez' in the rear seat of Arlotti's patrol vehicle, I observed Arlotti place his deployed Taser cartridge on south wood fence of the apartment complex. I picked up Arlotti's deployed Taser cartridge, wrapped the wires around the cartridge, and secured both darts in the cartridge. I placed Arlotti's deployed Taser cartridge in an envelope, and secured it under Arlotti's patrol vehicle's front windshield wiper.

MEDICAL EVALUATION:

Apple Valley Fire Department (AVFD) personnel responded to the scene and evaluated Chavez. AVFD personnel evaluated Chavez' blood pressure and the Taser impacts on his back. AVFD personnel determined Chavez did not require further medical treatment and left the scene.

TRANSPORT/SPONTANEOUS STATEMENTS:

I escorted Chavez from Arlotti's vehicle to my patrol vehicle, I secured Chavez' seatbelt properly before transporting him to the Apple Valley Police Station. During my transport Chavez made a spontaneous statement and asked what he was going to be charged with, "shooting?" I did not answer Chavez when he asked and continued driving to the Apple Valley Police station.

I placed Chavez into a holding cell at the Apple Valley Police Station.

INVESTIGATION:

While at the Apple Valley Police Station I completed a Gun Shot Residue (GSR) kit on Chavez.







EXAMINATIONS AND RESULTS

GUNSHOT TRAJECTORY:

Gunshot trajectory is the process of applying scientific knowledge to the examination of the size, shape, distribution and appearance of hole(s), strike(s), and defect(s) caused by fired projectiles in order to determine the flight path of the projectile(s) and likely location of the shooter(s).

The fired bullet hole(s) and strike(s) in the scene were marked and when possible, were linked together with sequential lettering (i.e. 5, 5A, 5B) to indicate trajectory paths. The markings used were for identification purposes only and do not necessarily indicate the order of occurrence. For the fired bullet hole(s) and strike(s), identified, the following trajectory path(s) was/were determined.

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- 17: This placard marked a bullet path that entered and exited the white fiberglass cover sheeting from the west side to the east side, traveled in between the plastic louvers on the west side of the swamp cooler and entered the internal swamp cooler pad. The bullet then traveled through the internal space of the swamp cooler and came to rest on the east side of the swamp cooler pad. This bullet traveled from west to east and downward.
- 26-26A: These placards marked a bullet path that entered the west side of the white fence post and exited the east side. This bullet traveled from west to east.
- 27: This placard marked a bullet path that struck the west side of the east block wall. This bullet traveled from west to east.

TRAJECTORY CONCLUSIONS:

The fired bullet path described as Placard 17, along with the fired cartridge cases described as Placards 6 through 15 was consistent with the shooter being located near the west edge of the rear/west dirt yard shooting in an east and downward direction.

The fired bullet paths described as Placards 26 through 26A and 27, along with the fired cartridge cases located at Placards 6 through 15 or 18 through 23, were consistent with the shooter(s) being located either near the west edge of the rear/west dirt yard or on the north side of the apartment complex between the rear patios for shooting in an east direction.

VISUAL SEARCH:

Sheriff's Crime Scene Specialist searched the fence west of the apartment complex for fired bullet holes with negative results.

METAL DETECTOR:

Sheriff's Crime Scene Specialist searched and dirt shoulder, east of the apartment complex and the front/east dirt yard for fired bullets using a metal detector with negative results.

EXAMINATIONS

The right and left hand adhesive discs in Item H were examined for gunshot residue particles by scanning electron microscopy/energy dispersive spectrometry (SEM/EDS).

RESULTS AND CONCLUSIONS

Particles considered characteristic of gunshot residue are particles that contain the elements lead, barium, and antimony.

Item H – SEM GSR kit from Joel Chavez

No characteristic gunshot residue particles were identified on the right hand adhesive disc.

One characteristic gunshot residue particle was identified on the left hand adhesive disc.

Characteristic gunshot residue particles can be deposited on the hands by firing a firearm, being in proximity of a discharging firearm, or by coming in contact with a surface that has GSR on it, including handling a firearm or ammunition.

The results apply to the items tested as received by the agency.
