**BRIEFING CONTINUED:**

On Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at approximately 1738 hours, deputies from the Adelanto Sheriff's Station received a call from [REDACTED] Adelanto, which was at the same apartment complex as the previous call. The reporting party gave the first name of [REDACTED] and called from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told dispatch the Black male adult who had the gun in the previous call was at the door at [REDACTED] location. Lara and Barajas responded to the call.

While Lara and Barajas responded, dispatch received multiple calls of shots fired at the location. At approximately 1752 hours, dispatch received a call from [REDACTED] Adelanto, [REDACTED] which said two people at the location were shot. At approximately 1754 hours, Lara and Barajas arrived on scene and broadcasted over the radio there was a shootout. During the radio broadcast, gunfire could be heard in the background. Dispatch received additional calls indicating the suspect ran west.

At approximately 1757 hours, dispatch received a call stating subjects were still shooting. A subject shot at the reporting party, and the reporting party told the shooter law enforcement was on their way. The suspect was last seen running west toward [REDACTED].

At approximately 1758 hours, dispatch received a call stating a Black male adult wearing a white t-shirt, black hat, and a red do-rag put a firearm underneath the stairs at Unit 416.

Multiple deputies from Victor Valley Station and Victorville Station responded and set up a perimeter. A witness told an unspecified deputy the suspect lived at [REDACTED]. Multiple deputies responded to [REDACTED] and saw the front window had multiple gunshots through it. Deputies conducted a safety sweep of [REDACTED] and no one was inside. After [REDACTED] was cleared, deputies went to [REDACTED] and found multiple fired cartridge casings (FCC) next to the staircase and a firearm underneath the stairs.

Deputies saw blood on the door of [REDACTED]. Deputies entered [REDACTED] and located two subjects suffering from gunshot wounds. The first subject was a Black male adult, later identified as [REDACTED]. The second subject was a Black male juvenile who provided the name of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had gunshot wounds to his shoulder, right leg, and right forearm. [REDACTED] had a gunshot wound to his thigh. Deputy Edgar Martinez walked [REDACTED] south to the parking lot. [REDACTED] told Martinez he was socializing in front of [REDACTED] and was caught by surprise when he was shot. According to Martinez, [REDACTED] was not able to provide any additional information because he was in pain. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were treated by Fire Department personnel and were later airlifted to [REDACTED] at [REDACTED], Loma Linda.

remember the circs on it, because I was, I was hearing it out, but I couldn't remember exactly what the circs are. So, after I finished my traffic stop, we go down to the apartment complex.

Mind you on that call, I was not the primary officer. So, I got there a little bit after the fact. So, as I got there, they were saying over the radio describing the possible suspect. I just got to the apartment complex. Since I was already the last officer there, I just drove around the apartment complex just to do like a little area check to see if there's any anything, any suspicious activity that I observed. Turned out to be at that point nobody was there, and we broke from the call. And from the call about I would say, an hour later, another call comes out from the same reporting party from the first one saying hey, I know where the suspect lives. I can't remember exactly what her statements were.

But we go back out there. I do know I got there second on that second initial call for service. And when I came into the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I entered through the [REDACTED] corner and right when I drove into the parking lot, I look at my MDC computer which is our patrol vehicle laptop and I see a 245-call come out at the same apartment complexes and what the information provided about two victims who were shot inside of an apartment. From there I stood there for about 10 seconds to see if I saw any vehicles rushing out of the apartment complex. From there I drive to the back. And I noticed my partner who was on scene, Deputy Lara crossed paths with me.

4 trying to learn to see where each apartment number was at so.

6 drives to the front, still at the back, just looking to see trying to  
7 look for the apartment complex. And then from there, I hear  
8 Deputy Lara get on the radio, hey I'm hearing active. Can't  
9 remember verbatim what he said, but I'm hearing active gunfire.

11 From there, I rushed to the front, and I parked my vehicle. So,  
12 the front entrance of the apartment, there is a kind of like, it's  
13 kind of like a little U-turn type thing. I'm not sure how to describe  
14 it. But I parked my vehicle kind of sideways, his vehicle was on  
15 the other side. And I noticed him walking. Right away, I exited  
16 my vehicle. And I, as I exited my vehicle, I heard active gunfire  
17 from the direction of where it was coming from. So, I activated  
18 my belt recorder after that. And I started running towards where  
19 Deputy Lara was at. From there obviously, we're just, I'm trying  
20 to figure out where the strays at. And from there, I get on the  
21 radio and say, hey, can I get additional, can I get an airship.

12 I didn't know if it was Lara who shot or the suspect who shot.

16 on the audio, hey was that you? He was like no, no, I was just  
17 backing up. So, I started kind of backpedaling a little bit, as I'm

20 was putting my firearm. We're backpedaling and I noticed I get to  
21 so the wall's kind of out this way and there's another... those

So, I kind of just held cover until we got additional units because at that point, obviously we just had our department-issued firearm not we didn't have our rifles on us at that time.

Assisting deputies got there. And then from there, we moved forward. And we started clearing the building from where we initially got the call for service because that's where the suspect was last seen running. And from there still on the radio, we're giving the updates, hey just be advised, I got on the radio said be advised the suspect still has a firearm. That's what we were communicating there. From there, we got the additional deputies, we move forward, we go clear the building, where were initially got the first call for service. Cleared the building, nobody was in that in that apartment. We're still trying to find where these two victims were at. And from there, cleared the building, come out, victims get assessed. And we're just holding cover. I held cover where the firearm was at, because we got an un...the reporting party say that the gun was dumped under the stairs.

So, we're looking for that. And from there, I held coverage to make sure nobody held the firearm. From there I was holding cover, holding long cover to where the suspect was last seen running towards which was towards the apartment complex. And

11 there's like an office and then in those apartment complexes,  
12 there's like hallways that you can go through so people could  
13 kind of cross through in different directions. And I know there's a  
14 pool kind of in the middle as well. Probably the best way I could  
15 describe it, I'm not sure how else.

[REDACTED] removed the magazine and pulled the slide to the rear, which ejected an unfired cartridge from the chamber. The ejected cartridge was headstamped "WIN 9mm Luger +P."

Lara's firearm was a personally owned, department approved Glock 17, 9-millimeter, semi-automatic handgun, with serial number [REDACTED]. There was a Streamlight TLR-1 HL tactical light mounted to the front frame of the firearm. Affixed to the top of the slide was a Trijicon RMR optic. 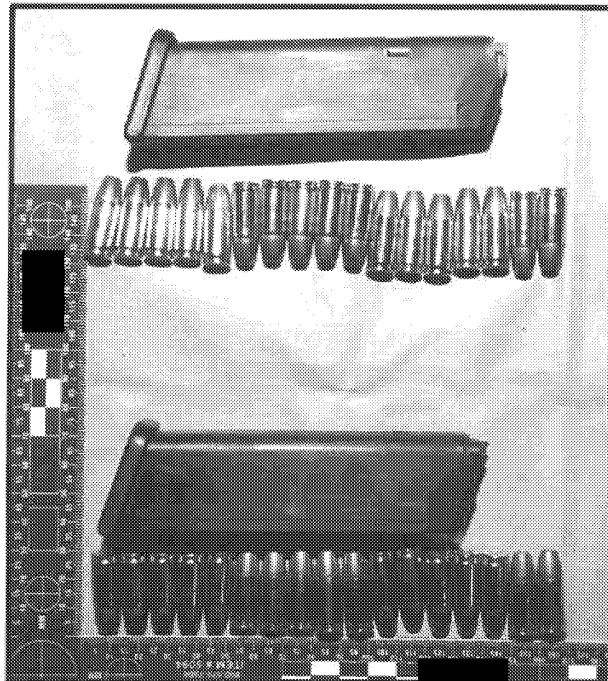

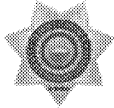



17 multiple calls of shots heard were coming in from the area. So, I  
18 rolled down my windows. I conducted an area check around the  
19 apartments but didn't hear any shots.  
20

21 About a minute later, an update comes out from Dispatch that we  
22 have two victims with gunshot wounds in an apartment complex.  
23 And so, I believe they gave us the address of [REDACTED]  
24 [REDACTED] I drove to the front of the apartment complex, rolled  
25 down my windows and multiple people that were outside were  
26 pointing towards a specific apartment. So, I tactically positioned  
27 my vehicle to where it was facing the apartment where

everybody was pointing to. I parked my vehicle and got out, I heard about a round or two that went off. I updated Dispatch, let them know I was hearing shots coming [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] My partner, Deputy Barajas parked about 20 feet [REDACTED] of me and I heard another, maybe four or five shots. So, Deputy Barajas came up to me, we unholstered our weapons and made our way towards the apartment where the shots were coming from.

As we were getting towards the apartment, I told Deputy Barajas to stay against the wall and watch the right side as I watched the left side. As I got to the left corner, I peeked out a little bit, and a Black male wearing a black hat, black shirt, and black shorts, comes jogging out. He had a handgun in his right hand. So, I pointed my firearm at him. I told him to drop the gun and show me his hands. The subject lifted up the gun, pointed it towards me shot four shots, three or four shots into my direction. I stepped to the right to cover myself with the corner of the wall. And as I looked back out the subject ran back and was going [REDACTED] through the little hallway in the apartments.

So, I told Deputy Barajas to watch the right side, he's probably going to come out from that side. Deputy Barajas stayed against the wall of the apartment complex, I backed up a little bit into the open that way if the suspect came to the right or the left and tried to shoot at us again, I'd be ready for either one. The suspect ran out to the right of the apartment complex and as he turned the

corner, already had the gun up and was firing more shots at me. At that point, I aimed my firearm at him. I didn't have the best shot at that time. So, he came a little more to the right of me. And there was a pool behind him, the pool is kind of elevated from where the apartments were. I have a Red Dot on my firearm, so I seen the Red Dot floating over his chest, so I canted my firearm down a little bit so that if I did drop any shots or missed any shots, they'd hit the floor rather than the apartments behind him and I fired about five or six rounds.

The suspect fell on his back. And after my five or six shots, I stopped. He turned around and still had the firearm in his hand and ran back through the hallway. He went [REDACTED] through the hallway, so I backed up again. And I seen him run [REDACTED] through the second set of apartment complexes and we didn't see where he went from there. After that, me and Deputy Barajas stayed on the corner apartment because the shots that were coming the first time, they were kind of higher pitched and lower pitched. We didn't know if there was multiple shooters. So, we stayed put until backup got there.

Once responding deputies got there, we formed a team. We walked towards the apartment complex where he was last seen, and we made entry into an apartment where we thought he was at which is where the initial call came from. We checked the interior of that apartment complex, didn't find anybody. We went back to the apartment complex where the two gunshot wound

9 go over that first call for service. Approximately what time was it

6 fell to the ground?  
7  
8 LARA: I shot once. And as he was going to the ground, I shot. I think in  
9 total I thought I shot five. They counted six. So, I shot him once  
10 he fell and then I shot five more times.  
11  
12 I. GOSSWILLER: Okay. You said they counted six, who's they?  
13  
14 LARA: The Homicide detective that came out and took my firearm.  
15 When they counted my rounds. It was only six missing.  
16  
17 I. GOSSWILLER: Six missing. Okay, so you shoot him once. And as he's going to  
18 the ground is there a pause or are you continually shooting?  
19  
20 LARA: It was continuous shooting. So, I remember the first one I got my  
21 sight picture on him, the dot was where I wanted it. So, I shot  
22 and then he went to the ground and that's when I shot as he was  
23 going to the ground.

25 between? Was it rapid throughout all five or six shots?

In this case, there's recorded evidence that you will have an opportunity to view. Recorded evidence has limitations and may depict the events differently than you recall, and it may not depict all of the events that you saw or heard. Recordings have a limited field of view and may not capture events normally seen by the human eye. The frame rate of the recording may limit the camera's ability to capture movements normally seen by the human eye. Lighting as seen on the recording may be different than that which is seen by the human eye. Recordings are two-dimensional and may not capture depth, distance, or positional orientation as well as the human eye. Audio recordings capture sound only and may not, and may represent what you heard differently than how you heard it. [REDACTED] stated he wore a red t-shirt, black and grey jeans and red and black Nike Air Force shoes. I located [REDACTED] t-shirt inside of [REDACTED]. I collected the t-shirt and placed it into evidence.

[REDACTED] stood in front of the apartment with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and an additional 10 subjects unknown names. [REDACTED] was drinking "Juice" and played dice near the front door of the apartment.

While [REDACTED] played dice he was shot in the left thigh before he heard gunshots. [REDACTED] explained he heard approximately 50 rapid gunshots which lasted approximately five minutes. [REDACTED] did not see anyone with a gun and could not tell if multiple people shot or if it was a single shooter.

[REDACTED] ran into the apartment and hid in the bathroom. [REDACTED] was unaware of any other subjects that were shot. [REDACTED] hid in the bathroom for approximately 30 minutes until paramedics arrived.

[REDACTED] was unaware of the reasons someone shot at him and his family. [REDACTED] said they do not "Gang Bang" and was unaware of any problems within the apartment complex.

[REDACTED] did not want to provide any additional information. I concluded my interview with [REDACTED].

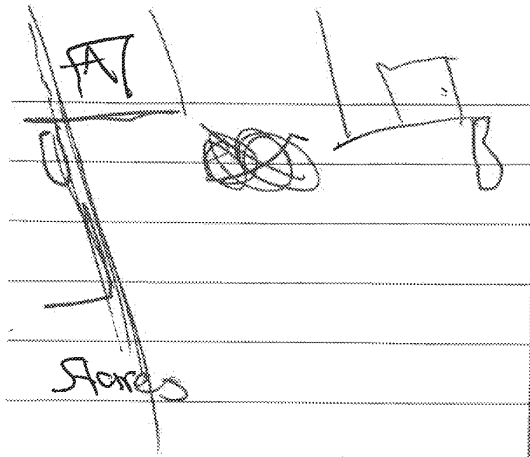

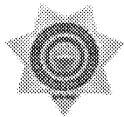

I reviewed and summarized a recording, from a cellular phone, obtained by Deputy Jacob Delano. The recording depicted the suspect from the Lethal Force Encounter (LFE). Delano obtained the video from [REDACTED] during a neighborhood check.

The recording contained both video and audio and was titled Cellphone Video. The video was recorded at 30 frames per second with a 720 x 1280 resolution. The recording did not have a timestamp and was 11 seconds long and recorded video and audio.

I reviewed the recording using the VideoLAN (VLC) media player. The VLC timestamp was used for summarizing the recording. The following is a summary of events seen and heard on the recording.

00:00 – The video began.

00:01 – A male voice was heard saying, "Stop looking and close the blinds."

00:02 – The video zoomed in through a window, between a second-story railing, toward a Black male adult wearing black shorts, a black shirt, black and red Air Jordan shoes, and a black and red hat. A lanyard hung from the male's left side. The male held a black firearm in his right hand.

00:03 – The male pointed the firearm at the second-story window across the way and fired one round at the building.



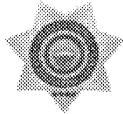

The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement.

[REDACTED] resided with her children at apartment [REDACTED] for approximately two years. Upon my contact with [REDACTED], she immediately expressed her concern for her and her children's safety. [REDACTED] explained on Wednesday, July 26, 2023, she provided unknown Sheriff's deputies a video of a person with a handgun. Since it was obvious the video was recorded from her residence [REDACTED] became scared. I asked [REDACTED] to provide a statement of her observations of the incident.

On Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at approximately 1750 hours, [REDACTED] was in her [REDACTED] son, [REDACTED] bedroom when she heard approximately four gunshots in a cadence of one second between each gunshot, from the direction of the [REDACTED] located [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] building. [REDACTED] bedroom window faced [REDACTED] and the window was closed. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] walked to her living room and stepped outside onto the balcony. [REDACTED] noticed a dark-skinned, skinny, tall Black male adult (BMA) with a black semi-automatic handgun in his right hand. [REDACTED] described the BMA as approximately six feet one inch tall and wore black jean pants and a dark grey hooded zip-up sweater. [REDACTED] did not get a good look at the BMA's face because he faced north, and the hood of his sweater covered his head.

The BMA ran north along the walkway and gravel between [REDACTED] apartment building and the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] watched the BMA as he approached the dumpster located at the north end of the apartment complex and rear parking lot. The BMA stopped at the dumpster for one second then ran east through the rear parking lot out of [REDACTED] view. 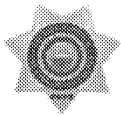

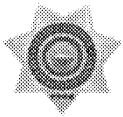

The skinny BMA wore a black baseball-style cap, black and red "Jordan" tennis shoes, black shorts with a white stripe on both sides and a black and red "Jordan" shirt. [REDACTED] estimated the distance between her apartment and the skinny BMA was [REDACTED]. As [REDACTED] turned on her cellular phone, she heard two gunshots, one after the other. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] he saw the skinny BMA as he fired the handgun into the dirt near the north [REDACTED] neighbors, who resided across from her apartment to the east, exited their apartment to their [REDACTED] and the male neighbor asked [REDACTED] if they heard the gunshots. 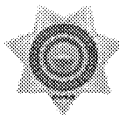

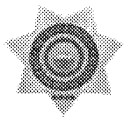

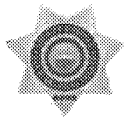

On Thursday, July 27, 2023, at approximately 0043 hours, Detective Dylan Gosswiller and I interviewed [REDACTED] at the Adelanto Sheriff's Station, located at [REDACTED] Adelanto. I used my department-issued digital audio recorder and recorded the interview with [REDACTED]. A copy of the audio recording was later submitted as evidence. For ease of the reader, I summarized the interview in chronological order of events.

[REDACTED] resided at [REDACTED] Adelanto, with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I explained to [REDACTED] since he was detained when Sheriff's deputies contacted him and was transported in handcuffs to the Adelanto Sheriff's Station, I wanted to advise him of his rights. I used my department-issued Miranda card and advised [REDACTED] of his Miranda rights. [REDACTED] responded, "Yes, ma'am," to question one, indicating he understood his rights. [REDACTED] responded, "Yes, ma'am," to question two, indicating he wanted to speak with us. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement.

On Tuesday, July 25, 2023, at approximately 2030 hours, [REDACTED] arrived at his apartment [REDACTED] in his Dodge Charger. As [REDACTED] exited his vehicle, he saw [REDACTED] enter the apartment [REDACTED] northwest corner through a manmade hole in the fence. [REDACTED] noticed [REDACTED] eyes were irritated, so he asked [REDACTED] what happened. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] "The dudes got me again." [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if it was the same "dudes" that assaulted him at the bus stop the day prior. [REDACTED] confirmed it was the same dudes. [REDACTED] believed the males who assaulted [REDACTED] resided at the apartment complex across the street to the west [REDACTED] became upset, and he and [REDACTED] walked around the apartment complex in search of the individuals who assaulted [REDACTED]. According to [REDACTED], he intended to physically fight the males who assaulted [REDACTED] and prove to the males [REDACTED] was not alone and [REDACTED] was there to protect him. [REDACTED] believed [REDACTED] friend, [REDACTED], set up [REDACTED] to get assaulted because Jonathan was present both times Marjay was "jumped." [REDACTED] resided in an unknown apartment at the [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] saw a group of 7 to 10 males in the northwest parking lot of the apartment complex, and [REDACTED] recognized one of the males who was Hispanic. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] approached the group of males, and [REDACTED] confronted the Hispanic male he recognized about [REDACTED] assault. [REDACTED] told the males [REDACTED] did not do anything to them, and he was only 15 years old.

According to [REDACTED] the Hispanic male told him he could not fight [REDACTED] because [REDACTED] was "grown." [REDACTED] told the male he was also grown and was 18 to 19 years old. [REDACTED] started to "tussle" with the Hispanic male and managed to slam him on the ground. [REDACTED] realized [REDACTED] ran away as the group of males surrounded [REDACTED] suddenly felt someone hit him on the back of his head by his ear. The last thing [REDACTED] remembered before he was "knocked out" was him on the ground and kicked in the face by unknown people. [REDACTED] went unconscious for an unknown amount of time.

[REDACTED] said [REDACTED] father is a known "Grape Street" gang member. [REDACTED] was unsure but believed [REDACTED] may have claimed Grape Street when he hung out with his friends. [REDACTED] did not claim Grape Street when he hung out with [REDACTED] believed the Hispanic male from the group was associated with the "99 Mafia" gang, and his known alias was [REDACTED] Instagram handle was [REDACTED] According to [REDACTED] and his friends wore black and blue clothing. [REDACTED] did not know where [REDACTED] resided, but he believed the people who assaulted him were related to the residents in apartment [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] later learned a dark-skinned Black female adult (BFA) in her late teens or early 20s who wore a white shirt and short black shorts from apartment [REDACTED] recorded his assault, and the video was posted on Instagram. Finley watched the video of his assault, but he did not have a copy of the video.

On Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at approximately 1000 hours, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] family and friends visited them at their residence to have a "get-together" and ensure [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were okay from their assault. According to [REDACTED] his family members wanted to know who assaulted [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] family members were his [REDACTED], who wore a white tank top with shorts, his brother-in-law, [REDACTED], and family friend, [REDACTED] later identified by investigators as [REDACTED]. Additional people present at [REDACTED] apartment were [REDACTED] father, [REDACTED] who was dark-skinned, bald, five feet five or six inches, and wore a white shirt, black "Dickie" shorts, and Vans shoes [REDACTED] uncle [REDACTED] who was light-skinned and wore a burgundy or red "Durag" on his head, purple shirt, jeans, and slides. [REDACTED] friend, [REDACTED] (unknown last name), wore a burgundy shirt and green shorts. [REDACTED] years old and wore a white shirt, blue "Adidas" bucket hat, and blue and white "Adidas" shorts. [REDACTED] wore a red shirt, black pants, and red Nike Air Force shoes.

Sometime between 1500 and 1600 hours, an unknown Black male adult (BMA) resident in a wheelchair with the right leg amputated from apartment [REDACTED] wheeled himself from the direction of the [REDACTED]

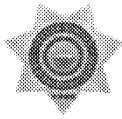

A BFA who wore a yellow shirt and scarf on her head was with the BMA in the wheelchair. The BMA wheeled himself toward [REDACTED] apartment as he and his family stood outside, smoked, and hung out. The BMA was approximately 30 to 40 years old and wore a black shirt with red writing.

The BMA in the wheelchair from apartment [REDACTED] confronted [REDACTED] and asked him why he accused residents from his apartment of being involved with his assault. [REDACTED] told the BMA he and other people watched him get assaulted, and the BFA, who [REDACTED] believed was the BMA's daughter, video recorded his assault. [REDACTED] said the BMA knew [REDACTED] worked every day and went straight home after work. [REDACTED] further said the BMA knew [REDACTED] parked his vehicle in front of apartment [REDACTED] and did not bother anyone, and when [REDACTED] was assaulted, no one from apartment [REDACTED] helped him. The BMA wheeled himself away from [REDACTED] and his family. [REDACTED] walked inside his residence to his bedroom to lay on his bed and place ice on his face.

Approximately 15 Minutes later, [REDACTED] was in the hallway inside his apartment when he heard approximately 8 to 9 gunshots from outside his apartment. [REDACTED] immediately threw himself to the floor to avoid being struck by gunfire. Finley said the gunshots he heard had an echo sound effect as if the pistols were fired from the [REDACTED] the front door to his apartment. According to [REDACTED] the gunshots were fired in rapid succession and sounded as if they were fired from two different pistols. [REDACTED] estimated the gunfire lasted between one to two minutes. According to [REDACTED] and a family friend, [REDACTED] ran inside [REDACTED] apartment and screamed they were shot. [REDACTED] did not know the exact time of the gunfire and stated it was between 1500 and 1600 hours. [REDACTED] did not see anyone with a firearm or know who fired the weapons that struck [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

When the Sheriff's deputies arrived at the [REDACTED] exited his apartment. According to [REDACTED], the deputies recognized him from the clothing he wore and arrested him. [REDACTED] was handcuffed and transported to the Adelanto Sheriff's Station by an unknown deputy. [REDACTED] overheard deputies say the people who fired the pistols wore ski masks and shorts, and according to [REDACTED] a deputy told him a deputy was shot during the shooting.

During the interview with [REDACTED] Gossweiler used a San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department Gunshot Residue Kit and collected possible samples of gunshot residue from the webbing of [REDACTED] left and right hand. Gossweiler processed [REDACTED] and took several overall, midrange, and close-up photographs of [REDACTED] was unable to provide me with any additional information pertinent to the investigation, and the interview was concluded at 0247 hours.

On Friday, July 28, 2023, at approximately 1447 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] inside an office of the [REDACTED], at [REDACTED]. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital audio recorder. The recording was later submitted as evidence. The following is a summary of the interview.

[REDACTED] worked maintenance at the [REDACTED] resided in the apartment above the [REDACTED]. On Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at approximately 1100 hours, approximately eight subjects gathered at Apartment [REDACTED]. The subjects were inside and outside the residence. The subjects drank alcoholic beverages and smoked marijuana. Throughout the day, [REDACTED] saw the main renter of Apartment [REDACTED], a Black female adult, identified as [REDACTED], in and around the apartment. [REDACTED] also saw, a heavysset [REDACTED] Black male juvenile, identified as [REDACTED], a light skinned Black male adult, identified as [REDACTED] and a Black male adult, believed to be [REDACTED] deceased daughter's boyfriend, identified as [REDACTED] (unknown last). [REDACTED] was a heavysset Black juvenile, approximately [REDACTED] messy hair, and wore a white shirt with pink designs on it. [REDACTED] typically wore prescription glasses and drove a white Nissan Xterra [REDACTED] wore dark shorts and a light shirt. Additionally, there was a heavysset Black male adult who claimed he was from Grape Street. The heavysset Black male was approximately [REDACTED] years old, bald, and wore a dark shirt and dark shorts. There was a heavysset Black Female adult, who was at the apartment with [REDACTED] children. [REDACTED] described the subjects around the house as "gangsters." There were approximately eight other subjects hanging around the house that [REDACTED] was not familiar with.

At approximately 1430 hours, [REDACTED] saw a subject wearing a dark gray hooded sweatshirt walk from the north side of the complex. The subject wore dark colored shorts and covered their head with a hood. [REDACTED] thought it was odd for someone to walk around in the 105-degree heat in a hooded sweatshirt. [REDACTED] was not sure if he was part of the group at Apartment [REDACTED] but believed they must have been due to Apartment [REDACTED] having so many visitors.

At one point in the afternoon, [REDACTED] went to Apartment [REDACTED] and spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her person and was intoxicated. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] she was tired of people assaulting her children. At the time, [REDACTED] did not observe any firearms on any of the subjects at the house. During the conversation, [REDACTED] mentioned Apartment [REDACTED]. The heavysset subject who identified themselves as a Grape Street gang member, said "Somebody's gonna lose their life out here." [REDACTED] suggested they contact law enforcement to assist with the problems but the heavysset subject told [REDACTED] he did not want

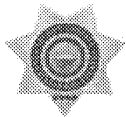

law enforcement involved. Between 1630 and 1700 hours, after speaking with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went to Apartment [REDACTED] to de-escalate the situation. When [REDACTED] arrived at the apartment, deputies were already contacting the residents. A Black female adult answered the door with a knife in her hand. [REDACTED] heard another female and children speak inside the residence. [REDACTED] did not attempt to contact the residents of [REDACTED] and walked away.

At approximately 1710 hours, [REDACTED] finished work and drove to a store. As he exited the apartment complex, he saw his friend, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had a six-pack of beer and invited [REDACTED] to drink with him. [REDACTED] parked his truck in the apartment complex and [REDACTED] took the six-pack of beer to his apartment. As [REDACTED] approached his apartment, he saw [REDACTED] said, "People think I'm playing games. I want emm all, I want emm all." [REDACTED] briefly tried to calm her down and continued to his apartment. Once [REDACTED] finished putting the six-pack of beer in his apartment, he went with [REDACTED] to a nearby convenience store. At approximately 1730 hours, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] returned to the apartment and went on the [REDACTED] apartment. [REDACTED] heard approximately eight gunshots from north of his [REDACTED]. The gunshots echoed and [REDACTED] believed they came from the pass-through on the building where Apartment [REDACTED] was located. [REDACTED] looked toward Apartment [REDACTED] and saw smoke coming from the building pass-through and saw a shirtless Black male adult, later identified as [REDACTED] holding a black handgun. [REDACTED] did not wear a shirt and had dark shorts. [REDACTED] walked out of the pass-through holding the firearm at his side. [REDACTED] described the firearm as a large black handgun. [REDACTED] lost sight of [REDACTED] and did not see where he went. [REDACTED] went into [REDACTED] apartment and [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] to call 9-1-1.

As the gunshots were fired, [REDACTED] saw a deputy in a marked patrol vehicle drive out of the parking lot onto Lee Avenue. Once the shots were fired, the deputy stopped the vehicle and pulled back into the parking lot. Two deputies, later identified as Anson Lara and Anthony Barajas, parked their vehicles, and ran north toward the gunshots. Approximately 5 to 10 seconds after the first volley of shots were fired, [REDACTED] heard approximately 3 additional gunshots. The gunshots sounded like two rapid shots, a short pause, then a third shot. Within five seconds, [REDACTED] heard a third volley of gunshots. The third volley consisted of two gunshots in rapid succession.

10 to 15 seconds after the third volley of gunshots, the deputy gave commands to drop the firearm. Both deputies wore uniforms clearly identifying themselves as law enforcement officers. The deputies yelled, "Police, drop the gun!" Lara pointed his firearm and directed his attention between the pool and Apartment #514. [REDACTED] vision of the incident was obstructed by the stairs to his apartment and a nearby tree. Lara fired approximately five gunshots in rapid

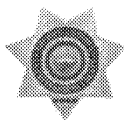

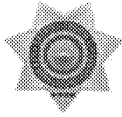
succession toward the pool area and Apartment [REDACTED]. When Deputy Lara fired his handgun, he was on the west side of the cement walkway approximately 20 feet south of the south exterior wall of Apartment [REDACTED]. Approximately 10 to 17 seconds after Lara fired his handgun, [REDACTED] heard two additional gunshots. The gunshots were quieter than the original volley and [REDACTED] could not tell where they came from.

After the gunshots were fired, Barajas and Lara stood back-to-back and waited on the south side of the building. [REDACTED] saw four subjects near Apartment # [REDACTED]. The subjects went in and out of view, which led [REDACTED] to believe they went in and out of the apartment. [REDACTED] could not tell who the four subjects were but believed they were in the apartment earlier that day. [REDACTED] did not see any new people arrive at the apartment. [REDACTED] did not see any of the four subjects carry firearms. Lara and Barajas remained south of the apartment out of view of the four subjects. Lara and Barajas remained back-to-back for approximately seven minutes until other law enforcement officers arrived. During the incident, [REDACTED] did not hear anyone say anything to Lara or Barajas. [REDACTED] believed Lara fired his handgun because the subjects had firearms and did not listen to commands.

[REDACTED] believed the involved parties most likely escaped the area through four different holes in the apartment complex's perimeter fence. [REDACTED] saw [REDACTED] walk out through the crime scene tape after law enforcement arrived. [REDACTED] was walked out by deputies after the incident was over. [REDACTED] appeared to have a gunshot wound as deputies escorted him to an ambulance. [REDACTED] did not see the residents of Apartment [REDACTED] since the incident occurred. After the incident, [REDACTED] observed the front window to Apartment [REDACTED] was broken. According to [REDACTED] the window was not broken when he went to the apartment before the shooting occurred.

I showed [REDACTED] a screenshot of the subject that wore black and possessed a firearm between the [REDACTED] during the incident. [REDACTED] did not recognize the subject or see them throughout the day.

[REDACTED] had no further information, and the interview was concluded.

On Friday, July 28, 2023, at approximately 1622 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] inside an office of the [REDACTED], at [REDACTED] Adelanto. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital audio recorder. The recording was later submitted as evidence. The following is a summary of the interview.

[REDACTED] worked [REDACTED] at the [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] were next to each other on [REDACTED] and owned by the same company. [REDACTED] worked [REDACTED] for the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] often helped each other and worked at both apartment complexes.

[REDACTED] was aware there was some sort of feud between the residents of the [REDACTED] Apartment [REDACTED] and Apartment [REDACTED]. There was a recent incident and one of the residents was assaulted.

On Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at approximately 1730 hours, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] planned to socialize for the night at [REDACTED] apartment. [REDACTED] apartment was near Apartment [REDACTED]. At approximately 1750 hours, as they approached [REDACTED] apartment, [REDACTED] saw four subjects outside Apartment [REDACTED]. The four subjects looked at [REDACTED] with a 'dirty look' and it caused [REDACTED] to feel tension. [REDACTED] did not recognize any of the subjects and believed they were guests of Apartment [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] described the first subject as a Black male adult, approximately six feet two inches tall, with an athletic build, and wore a black or blue tee shirt. The second subject was a Black male adult, approximately six feet tall, with a thin build, braids, wore blue basketball shorts and possibly a black tee shirt, and later identified by investigators as [REDACTED]. The third subject was a Black male adult that wore black jeans and a blue shirt. The fourth subject was a Black male adult that wore black jeans and a blue shirt. [REDACTED] was unable to provide further details about the four subjects' descriptions.

At approximately 1800 hours [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] each opened a beer and [REDACTED] went onto the [REDACTED] to smoke a cigarette. [REDACTED] followed [REDACTED] onto the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] heard seven or eight gunshots in rapid succession. [REDACTED] saw several children and people running throughout the complex trying to get cover. [REDACTED] looked for who shot the gunshots and [REDACTED] went into the residence. [REDACTED] called 9-1-1 to report the incident but was sent to a recording that told him there was high call volume. Approximately two minutes after the gunshots, [REDACTED] went back [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] looked north and saw three of the four Black male adults he saw earlier walk north, away from Apartment [REDACTED]. The athletic Black male adult carried a black handgun in his right hand. The athletic Black male adult held

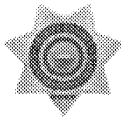

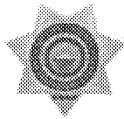

the black handgun down at his side. [REDACTED] also carried a black handgun in his hand. As the subjects walked north, a marked patrol vehicle drove east through the north parking lot of the complex. The three Black male adults casually turned around and began to walk south. The patrol vehicle circled the complex and began to exit through the south main entrance. [REDACTED] watched the patrol vehicle as it exited the apartment complex. Approximately 5 to 10 minutes after the first volley of gunshots, as the patrol vehicle drove onto [REDACTED] heard 8 to 10 gunshots in rapid succession. According to [REDACTED] the gunshots sounded like they were right next to him. The deputy who drove the patrol vehicle, later identified as Anson Lara, turned around and drove back into the complex. As Lara pulled into the parking lot, a second patrol vehicle, driven by Anthony Barajas, pulled into the parking lot with Lara. Lara and Barajas exited their patrol vehicles and ran toward Apartment [REDACTED]. One of the deputies looked up at [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] stood on the [REDACTED] pointed toward Apartment [REDACTED] to show the deputy where the shots came from. Both deputies wore tan and green uniforms clearly identifying them as law enforcement officers.

[REDACTED] looked toward Apartment [REDACTED] and saw multiple people running away from the area. [REDACTED] did not see any of the four subjects he observed earlier. [REDACTED] believed a conflict happened in the courtyard between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] was unable to see the area between the buildings but had since spoken to a resident of Apartment [REDACTED] and was told that's where the shootout occurred.

[REDACTED] remained on the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went into [REDACTED] residence and looked outside a west facing window. Both deputies stopped in the rock area east of [REDACTED] apartment. [REDACTED] had a clear view of where the deputies stood and kept his attention focused on the deputies. Once both deputies stopped in the rock area, one of the deputies said, "drop the gun, drop the gun!" [REDACTED] did not notice if the deputies did any type of evasive maneuvers as they stood in the rock area. Lara pointed a black handgun north toward the opening between Apartment [REDACTED] and the pool area. [REDACTED] did not look to see what Lara pointed his firearm at. [REDACTED] heard two to three shots from an unknown subject. [REDACTED] assumed the shots were fired from the area [REDACTED] where Lara's attention was focused. Lara stood and held the handgun with two hands. Lara fired between three to four rounds at a cadence slightly slower than the other rounds that were fired. [REDACTED] attention was focused on Lara and he did not see where Barajas pointed his firearm.

After approximately one minute, Lara and Barajas moved to the south wall of [REDACTED] and stood back-to-back with their handguns in their hands. Lara and Barajas stood south of the building wall for approximately 10 to 15 minutes. Once additional deputies arrived Lara and

**SUSPECT INTERVIEW: ARTEZ TAYLOR**

On Thursday, January 18, 2024, at approximately 0830 hours, Detective Owenn Domon and I interviewed Artez Taylor inside an interview room at the West Valley Detention Center (WVDC) at 9500 Etiwanda Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga. I recorded the interview with my department-issued digital audio recorder. A copy of the recording was later submitted as evidence. The following is a summary of the interview.

Before the interview, I authored a search warrant to obtain a buccal swab for Deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) analysis from Artez Taylor. On Tuesday, January 16, 2024, at 1323 hours, the honorable Judge Jerry Johnson signed the search warrant. The search warrant was assigned warrant number 000133644.

I read Taylor his Miranda Warning from my department-issued Miranda card. To question one Taylor answered, "Yes." To question two Taylor answered, "Without my lawyer present, I can't talk to you."

I advised Taylor I had a search warrant for a buccal swab sample. Taylor protested providing a sample voluntarily. Taylor advised he did not consent to providing a buccal swab sample. I advised Taylor the warrant authorized a blood draw if he refused to comply. Taylor complied with providing a buccal swab sample, but he requested it was documented he did not consent to the buccal swab sample.

Taylor asked multiple questions about his case and charges. I advised Taylor his charge was PC664/187(a) Attempted Murder. Taylor asked multiple additional questions about the case. I advised Taylor, any further questions should be directed to his lawyer.

I concluded the contact with Taylor at approximately 0848 hours.

After obtaining the buccal swab sample, I completed a search warrant receipt. I took a copy of the search warrant and the receipt to the WVDC property counter and put both in Taylor's property.

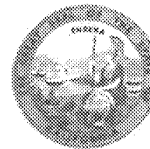

On Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at 1750 hours, deputies from the Victor Valley Station were dispatched to an assault with a deadly weapon call at [REDACTED], Adelanto. The reporting party advised there were two subjects shot at the location. Deputy Anson Lara arrived at the incident location at 1752 hours and advised there was a "shootout" occurring at the location and shortly after a lethal force encounter (LFE) occurred. Lara broadcast the suspect fled on foot and provided a suspect description of a Black male adult, wearing a black hat, black shirt, and black shorts. A perimeter was set up; however, the suspect was not located. Homicide Team 4 was called out to investigate.

Two subjects suffering from gunshot wounds were located at the apartment complex. The subjects who were shot were identified as [REDACTED] and were associated with apartment [REDACTED].

Through witness interviews detectives learned on Tuesday, July 25, 2023, [REDACTED] was assaulted by several subjects. Subjects from [REDACTED] were at the location when the assault took place. [REDACTED] lived in apartment [REDACTED]. Witness statements indicated the shootout was related to the ongoing gang-related problems between the occupants of apartments [REDACTED].

Both victims [REDACTED] appeared to have been struck by gunfire during the initial shooting and were not related to the LFE. Both victims sustained non-life-threatening injuries and were interviewed at the hospital. [REDACTED] refused to answer any questions and [REDACTED] advised he did not see who shot him and had no idea why the shooting occurred.

A neighbor used their cellular phone and captured a Black male adult, wearing a black hat, black shirt, and black shorts holding a handgun, and shooting at a second-story window in an apartment in the complex. The suspect matched the description provided by Lara.

During scene processing, several fired cartridge casings of different calibers were located indicating multiple shooters were involved in the initial incident. The firearm believed to be used by the suspect was located at the incident location. The clothing worn by the suspect in the video was located in a bush and dumpster in the direction the suspect was last seen running. A blue Samsung Galaxy S8 cellular phone was in the shorts pocket. The Samsung Galaxy S8 contained SIM card [REDACTED].

The SIM card was associated with phone number [REDACTED].

On Thursday, August 3, 2023, interviews were conducted with Deputy Lara (Shooting Deputy) and Deputy Barajas (Witnessing Deputy). The following is a summary of the information provided.

Lara and Barajas responded to a shooting call at the location where two subjects were reported to have been shot. When they arrived, Lara and Barajas heard gunshots and believed there was an active shooter. Lara and Barajas approached the area they heard the gunfire from, and a Black male adult exited a hallway between apartments armed with a handgun. Lara gave a command for the suspect to drop the gun. The suspect fired three to four rounds at Lara and ran back into the hallway. The suspect exited the other side of the hallway and fired at Lara and Barajas again and Lara fired approximately seven rounds at the suspect. The suspect fell and dropped his gun. Lara believed he

struck the suspect with gunfire and stopped shooting. The suspect got up, picked up the firearm, and ran away.

Lara confirmed the suspect in the video that was recovered is the same suspect who shot at him and whom Lara shot at. The clothing we recovered at the scene was the clothing worn by the suspect during the exchange of gunfire.

On Friday, August 4, 2023, I authored a search warrant for the cellular phone records related to [REDACTED]. The warrant was signed by the Honorable Judge Shahla Sabet and assigned warrant number 000120454. Warrant 000120454 was submitted to T-Mobile and results were provided by T-Mobile on Sunday, August 13, 2023.

A public records check of [REDACTED] showed the number belonged to Artez Taylor DOB [REDACTED]. Taylor's California Driver's License address was listed as [REDACTED], Palmdale, CA 93550. The CDL was issued on 4/20/2021.

I processed the provided records and found the cell phone frequently used cellular phone towers immediately around the area of 547 E Ave, Palmdale, which indicated it was in the area of 547 E Ave.

The subject in the video recorded by the neighbor matched Taylor's physical description and resembled him from his CDL.

The clothing and cellular phone located during the scene processing were sent to the Sheriff's Crime Lab to be processed for DNA. The Sheriff's Crime Lab processed the DNA and found a preliminary match to DNA in databases. The preliminary match was a match with Artez Taylor DOB [REDACTED].

Based on witness statements, involved deputy interviews, and the video recording, the phone located inside the dumpster belonged to the suspect. Based on the evidence from the scene, the cellular phone evidence, the DNA, witness statements, and the ongoing investigation Artez Taylor shot at Deputy Anson Lara and fled the scene. The evidence shows Taylor committed a felony, specifically, PC664/187(a) Attempted Murder on a Peace Officer.

On 01/03/2024, the Honorable Judge John Tomberlin signed an arrest warrant for Artez Taylor's arrest. SBCSD investigators located a new phone number for Taylor and found his phone pinged in the area of 547 E Avenue, Q12 Unit 7.


