Use of force reports are among the most visible and scrutinized of all interactions between law enforcement and the community it serves. Proper use, documentation, and testimony to the use of force serves to protect the employee and the Department from unwarranted complaints and excessive litigation. By learning how to "Use It, Write It, Tell It", you will be prepared to properly apply, document, and testify to these events without repercussion.
