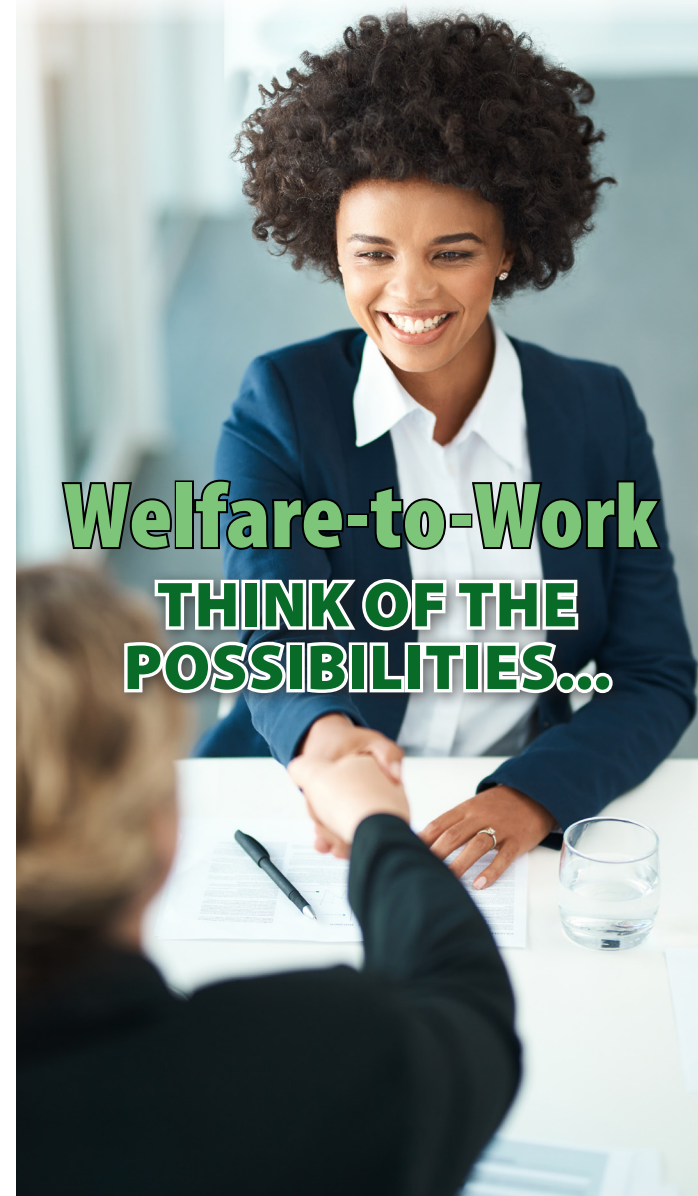

What is Welfare-to-Work?

Welfare-to-Work (WTW) is San Bernardino County's exciting work program. WTW is designed to help you prepare for work, find a job, become self-sufficient, and build a better future for yourself and your family.

Who is eligible to Participate?

The Transitional Assistance Department (TAD) will determine if you are eligible to participate in WTW when you:

- Apply for cash aid, known as California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs)
- Complete a annual Re-Evaluation for CalWORKs
- Have a change in your participation status

If you are not required to participate in WTW, you may be able to volunteer.

If you are working, you may continue to receive a portion of your CalWORKs benefits along with your earnings.



What can WTW do for you?

WTW is a program designed with you in mind and can help you:

- Get the skills you need to become employed or get a better job
- Find a job in your area with private industries, businesses, or public employers
- Improve your self-confidence
- Pay for:
 - Child Care
 - Transportation
 - Work expenses (work boots, tools, work clothes)
 - Training/school expenses (books, supplies)

CalWORKs is a time limited program, take advantage of your WTW benefits now!

WTW opportunities

WTW offers a variety of opportunities and services including:

- Activities to gain employment
- On-the-job training
- Work experience
- Community service
- Work study, when enrolled in college
- Job skills training directly related to employment
- Vocational education and training
- Searching for a job, including assistance completing resumes and applications
- Secondary education, adult basic education, or General Education Development (GED) certificate
- Job networking
- Referral for Mental health and/or substance abuse services
