Transitional Assistance

What is CalFresh?

CalFresh is a benefit program that helps low-income individuals and families buy the food they need. CalFresh benefits are provided on an electronic card that is used like an ATM or bank card to buy food at most grocery stores.

Who qualifies for CalFresh?

Specific eligibility requirements for CalFresh consider citizenship, income, and other factors. Generally, benefits are available to low-income individuals and households who are:

- U.S. citizens
- Non-citizens who meet certain criteria

What are the requirements for CalFresh?

To receive CalFresh benefits, eligibility requirements must be met in the following areas:

- Citizenship/Non-citizen status
- Income
- Residency in California
- Social Security Number

Other requirements may apply based on individual/family circumstances.

Who is a CalFresh student?

For CalFresh purposes, an applicant is determined a college student if the following qualifications are met:

- Between 18-49 years of age
- Physically and mentally fit
- Enrolled at least half-time in an institution of higher education



Are students eligible to CalFresh?

A student may be eligible to CalFresh by meeting an exemption. Exemptions include, but are not limited to, students who are:

- Employed an average of 20 hours per week or 80 hours per month.
- The parent of a child under the age of six.
- Enrolled in a Local Program that Increases Employability (LPIE).
- Receiving a Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funded Cal Grant A or B.
- Approved for college work study and anticipates assignment during the term.
- Receiving California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs).

How do I apply for CalFresh?

You can apply for CalFresh by:

- Completing an online application at www.BenefitsCal.com.
- Calling the Customer Service Center at 1-877-410-8829 to request an application by mail.
- Calling 2-1-1 to complete an application over the phone.
- Visiting your local TAD office to complete an application in-person.

Families and individuals can request Expedited Services (ES) when applying for CalFresh. Applications that meet ES qualifications are eligible to have benefits processed within three days.
