What is CalFresh?

CalFresh is a benefit program which helps low-income individuals and families buy the food they need. CalFresh benefits are provided on an electronic card that is used like an ATM or bank card to buy food at most grocery stores.

Who Qualifies For CalFresh?

Specific eligibility requirements for CalFresh consider citizenship, income and other factors. Generally, benefits are available to low-income individuals and families who are:

- U.S. citizens, or
- Legal immigrants who meet certain criteria.

Recipients of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are now eligible to CalFresh.

What are the requirements for CalFresh?

To receive CalFresh benefits, eligibility requirements must be met in the following areas:

- Citizenship/Immigration status
- Income
- Residency in San Bernardino County
- Work registration
- Providing a Social Security Number

Other requirements may apply based on individual/family circumstances.



Myths and Facts about CalFresh

Myth: I applied for CalFresh in the past and did not qualify. I cannot apply again.

Fact: There may have been changes to your circumstances and/or to regulations. It is appropriate to reapply if you are in need.

Myth: Increasing CalFresh participation will cost California taxpayers more money.

Fact: CalFresh is federally funded by the USDA under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

Myth: People who are homeless are not eligible for CalFresh because you must have housing and a mailing address.

Fact: You do not have to have a permanent address to receive CalFresh. County offices will provide alternate mailing options if needed.

Myth: CalFresh is only for parents or families with children.

Fact: CalFresh is for anyone who meets the eligibility guidelines: Veterans, Active Duty, Reservists, parents, single adults, people with disabilities, homeless individuals, and people age 60 or older may qualify for CalFresh.

Myth: CalFresh doesn't take into account how much I pay for medical and prescription drug bills.

Fact: Certain medical expenses not covered by Veteran Affairs may be considered when determining the CalFresh benefit amount for people age 60 or older or people with a disability.

How Do I Apply for CalFresh?

You can apply for CalFresh benefits by:

- Completing an on-line application at BenefitsCal.com.
- Calling the Customer Service Center at 1-877-410-8829 to request an application be mailed to you.
- Calling 211 to complete a telephone application.
- Completing an application at a local Transitional Assistance Department (TAD) office. TAD locations are listed on the back of this brochure.
