CalWORKs Homeless Programs

California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs), administered by the Transitional Assistance Department (TAD), offers three types of assistance programs for homeless families:

- CalWORKs Homeless Assistance
- Family Stabilization
- Housing Support Program

CalWORKs Homeless Assistance

CalWORKs Homeless Assistance is for homeless families who have at least one family member receiving CalWORKs benefits in San Bernardino County and meet at least one of the following:

- Lacking a fixed and regular nighttime residence
- Sleeping in a temporary shelter or a place that is not designated as a home
- Received a pay or quit notice to vacate the current residence

Family Stabilization

Family Stabilization is for families who receive CalWORKs, have at least one family member who is required to participate in the Welfare-to-Work program and meet at least one of the following:

- Currently homeless
- At risk of becoming homeless (have an eviction notice)



Housing Support Program

The Housing Support Program is for homeless families who have at least one family member receiving CalWORKs benefits in San Bernardino County and meet one of the following:

- Lacking a fixed and regular nighttime residence
- Sleeping in a temporary shelter or a place that is not designated as a home
- Received a court ordered judgment for eviction

What can the Homeless Programs do for you?

CalWORKs Homeless Programs can help you with:

- Managing your case
- Budgeting classes
- Completing housing applications
- Employment referrals
- Mediation with landlords
- Assistance with locating/securing housing
- Financial assistance with credit checks, move-in costs, and rent/utility payments



How to apply for CalWORKs Homeless Programs

You can apply for Homeless Program assistance at your local TAD office.

- If you are not receiving CalWORKs, you must apply for benefits. You may apply ahead of time at [BenefitsCal.com](https://www.benefitscal.com), or when you come into the office.
- Inform the greeter or receptionist that you would like to apply for a CalWORKs Homeless Program.
- The Homeless Assistance Worker will screen your eligibility to all homeless programs offered by TAD and will discuss options with you.
