

# What is Redistricting?

Every ten years, San Bernardino County uses new census data to redraw its supervisorial district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. This process, called redistricting, is important in ensuring that each board member represents about the same number of constituents. Redistricting will be based on the 2020 U.S. Census data, which is anticipated to be released to the State on September 30, 2021. For San Bernardino County, the redistricting process must be completed by December 15, 2021.

## How Can I Take Part in this Process?

Public meetings are being hosted throughout San Bernardino County to keep the public engaged throughout the redistricting process. Can't attend in person? The San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors will also hold public meetings. ## Did you Know?

Through the County's vendor, Maptitude, the public can create electronic draft maps to provide to the County and to indicate communities of interest. A user account is required to create and submit maps. Access will be made available via the redistricting website at [www.sbcountyredistricting.com](http://www.sbcountyredistricting.com). Maps submitted will be analyzed and presented to the Advisory Redistricting Commission for review at public meetings.

## How Does a Map Get Picked?

Based on Federal and State law criteria, the Advisory Redistricting Commission will recommend a minimum of two possible maps to the Board of Supervisors for adoption consideration. Final map to be adopted by the Board of Supervisors on or before December 15, 2021.
